<b>WATER COURSES LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED</b>	<b><u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Agusan Del Sur - particularly Ojot, Wawa, Libang, Maosam, Kasilan, Gibong, Adgaoan, Sinulao, Kayonan and Andanan.</li><li>• Surigao del Norte - particularly Surigao and Magallanes</li><li>• <b>Dinagat Islands –particularly Malinao Inlet and Gaas Lulet</b></li><li>• Agusan del Norte - particularly Lake-Mainit-Tubay, Asiga, Agusan, Linugos and Cabadbaran.</li><li>• Surigao Del Sur - particularly Cantillan, Toracan, Tandag, Tago, Hubo-Oteiza, Hinatuan and Bislig.</li></ul>

People living near the mountain slopes and in the low lying areas of the above mentioned river systems and the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) concerned are still advised to take necessary precautionary measures.

This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.
