STRONG TO GALE FORCE WINDS IS EXPECTED TO AFFECT THE FOLLOWING AREAS:

THE SEABOARDS OF NORTHERN LUZON AND EASTERN SEABOARD of CENTRAL LUZON (Batanes, Babuyan Group of Islands, Cagayan, Ilocos Norte, Ilocos Sur, La Union, Pangasinan, Isabela and Aurora)	Cloudy skies with scattered rains	(45 - 68) / (24 - 36)	Rough to very rough	2.8 to 5.0
THE WESTERN SEABOARD OF CENTRAL AND SOUTHERN LUZON (Zambales, Bataan and Palawan)	Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated light rains	(45 - 68) / (24 - 36)	Rough to very rough	2.8 to 5.0
THE EASTERN SEABOARD OF SOUTHERN LUZON and of VISAYAS (Eastern Coast of Quezon including Polillo Island, Camarines Provinces, Catanduanes, Eastern Coast of Albay, Eastern Coast of Sorsogon, Northern Samar and Eastern Samar)	Cloudy skies with scattered rains	(45 - 63) / (24 - 34)	Rough to very rough	2.8 to 4.5
THE EASTERN SEABOARD OF MINDANAO (Surigao del Norte, Dinagat and Siargao Island)	Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms	(45 - 63) / (24 - 34)	Rough to very rough	2.8 to 4.5

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualty.
