<b>NORTHERN and EASTERN SEABOARDS OF MINDANAO</b> <b>(Agusan del Norte, Misamis Provinces and Northern coast of Lanao del Norte, Surigao, Davao Oriental, Dinagat Island and Siargao)</b>	Cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms	(45 - 68) / (24 - 36)	Rough to very rough	2.8 TO 5.0
