I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

At **10:00 AM**, the **Low Pressure Area** (formerly Tropical Depression "Basyang") was estimated based on all available data at **220km South Southeast of Puerto Princesa City, Palawan (8.1N, 119.8E)**. Latest analysis indicates that **significant re-development** of this weather disturbance into a Tropical Depression is **still likely**.

The Low Pressure Area will bring **moderate to occasionally heavy rains** over Southern Palawan while **scattered light to moderate rains** will prevail over the rest of Palawan with moderate to rough seas. Residents in these areas are advised to continue monitoring for updates, take appropriate measures against possible **flooding and landslides**, and coordinate with their respective local disaster risk reduction and management offices.


However, you are hereby directed to monitor the situation and undertake precautionary measures in your area of responsibility (AOR). Likewise, the public and the DRRMCs are advised to take appropriate actions, as necessary.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualties.
