I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

"JELAWAT" has intensified into a Severe Tropical Storm while maintaining its northward movement.

Location of Center (10:00 AM today)	The center of Severe Tropical Storm "JELAWAT" was estimated based on all available data at 1,245 km East of Virac, Catanduanes (OUTSIDE PAR) (15.4°N, 135.6°E)
Maximum Sustained Winds	100 km/h near the center
Gustiness	Up to 120 km/h
Forecast movement	North at 10 km/h
Forecast Positions and Intensities	
Tomorrow Morning 30 March 2018	1,525 km East of Casiguran, Aurora (OUTSIDE PAR) (16.3°N, 136.4°E) Severe Tropical Storm
Saturday Morning 31 March 2018	1,755 km East of Casiguran, Aurora (OUTSIDE PAR) (17.8°N, 138.5°E) Severe Tropical Storm
Sunday Morning 01 April 2018	2,045 km East of Aparri, Cagayan (OUTSIDE PAR) (19.1°N, 141.0°E) Tropical Storm

Estimated rainfall amount is moderate to heavy within the 700 km diameter of the Severe Tropical Storm.

This weather disturbance has no direct effect in any part of the country.

II. ACTIONS TAKEN

- NDRRM Operations Center disseminated **Tropical Cyclone Advisory No. 04** to all OCD Regional Offices through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs from the provincial down to the municipal levels.
 - Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Offices to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying areas and mountainous areas if situations warrant.
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
