The provinces of Albay, Sorsogon, Masbate and the regions of eastern Visayas, CARAGA and Davao will experience cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and isolated thunderstorms due to the Tail-end of a Cold Front and the trough of the approaching tropical disturbance starting Sunday (March 25) until Tuesday (March 27) while Metro Manila and the rest of the country will have warm and dry weather conditions associated with sunny weather, with chances of some isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms.

On Wednesday (March 28) until the duration of the forecast period (March 31), generally good weather condition apart from some isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms will prevail over the entire archipelago.

The coastal waters over the eastern section of the country will be moderate to rough throughout the outlook period while slight to moderate will prevail over the rest of the archipelago except during thunderstorms.

This outlook will be updated as soon as significant changes in the weather pattern occur.

### **ACTION/S TAKEN**

- a. NDRRMC Operations Center disseminated the **Special Weather Outlook during the Lenten Season, for the period of 25 to 31 March 2018** to the **CHAIRPERSONS, RDRRMCs, OCDROs I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X, XI, XII, CARAGA, ARMM, CAR, and NCR** through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs from the provincial down to the municipal levels.
- b. Directed **RDRRMCs** through the **OCDROs I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X, XI, XII, CARAGA, ARMM, CAR, and NCR** and subsequently to advise local DRRMCs to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) areas.
