SITUATION OVERVIEW:

The Tropical Storm with International Name "JELAWAT" has entered the Philippine Area of Responsibility and was named "CALOY".

Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 550 km diameter of the Tropical Storm.

This Tropical Storm is less likely to make landfall over any part of the country due to its recurving track.

Location of eye/center:	At 10:00 AM today, the center of Tropical Storm "CALOY" was estimated based on all available data at 1,015 km East of Surigao City, Surigao del Norte (09.5 °N, 134.7 °E).
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of 65 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 80 kph
Forecast Movement:	Forecast to move North Northwest at 15 kph
Forecast Positions:	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 24 Hour(Tomorrow morning): 935 km East of Borongan City, Eastern Samar(12.8°N, 133.9°E)• 48 Hour(Thursday morning):1,410 km East of Infanta, Quezon(15.8°N, 134.7°E)• 72 Hour(Friday morning): 1,580 km East of Tuguegarao City, Cagayan (OUTSIDE PAR)(18.2°N, 136.6°E)• 96 Hour(Saturday morning):1,810 km East of Basco, Batanes (OUTSIDE PAR)(20.4°N, 139.3°E)
