### **I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:**

The Tropical Storm with International Name "JELAWAT" has entered the Philippine Area of Responsibility and was named "CALOY".

Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 550 km diameter of the Tropical Storm.

This Tropical Storm is less likely to make landfall over any part of the country due to its recurving track.

Location of eye/center:	At 10:00 AM today, the center of Tropical Storm "CALOY" was estimated based on all available data at 1,015 km East of Surigao City, Surigao del Norte (09.5 °N, 134.7 °E).
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of 65 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 80 kph
Forecast Movement:	Forecast to move North Northwest at 15 kph

## II. ACTIONS TAKEN

- NDRRM Operations Center disseminated **Severe Weather Bulletin No. 01** to all OCD Regional Offices through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs from the provincial down to the municipal levels.
  - Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Offices to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying areas and mountainous areas if situations warrant.
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
