Fire Incident at CIC Upper, Brgy. Tabok, Mandaue City (Region VII)

A. Situation Overview

- On or about 5:53 PM. 03 April 2018, a fire broke out at CIC Upper, Brgy. Tabok, Mandaue City.

B. Effects

- As a result of the incident, more or less thirty (30) single storey residential houses made of concrete and mixed light construction materials, one (1) three storey residential building made of concrete and mixed light construction materials, one (1) two storey Rattan manufacturing building, and one (1) single storey warehouse type commercial building were totally gutted down by fire.
- 125 families or 414 persons were affected by the fire incident.
- Estimated damages amounted to more or less Php 3,800,000.00.
- As a result of the incident, a total of two (2) person was reportedly injured.

C. Actions Taken:

- OCDRO VII coordinated with BFP-Mandaue City Fire Station, Mandaue LDRRMO and Mandaue CSWS.

- Lapu-Lapu City BFP conducted immediate fire suppression operations. By 7:30 PM, 03 April 2018 the fire was already under control. By 7:05 AM of 04 April 2018 the incident was declared fire out.
 - Mandaue City LDRRMO and CSWS distributed congee, sleeping mats and blankets immediately to the victims and served full meals for three (3) days and will further distribute relief goods on the 3rd day. They also have standby CSWS personnel and medics in the area.
