"DINDO" SLIGHTLY INTENSIFIES AND IS NOW OUTSIDE PHILIPPINE AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY.

Track and intensity outlook:

- On the forecast track, Severe Tropical Storm DINDO is forecast to continue moving northwestward towards the East China Sea and **is likely to make landfall over Zhejiang Province in eastern China tomorrow early morning as Severe Tropical Storm.**

Hazards affecting land:

- This tropical cyclone has no direct impact on the country.
- **Today, occasional rains due to Southwest Monsoon will be experienced over Batanes and Babuyan islands.** The public and local disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to monitor the Rainfall/Thunderstorm Advisories and Heavy Rainfall Warnings from PAGASA Regional Services Divisions and take appropriate measures.

Hazards affecting coastal waters:

- A Gale Warning is in effect over the northern and western seaboard of Northern Luzon and the western seaboard of Central Luzon. Sea travel is risky over these areas due to rough to very rough seas (2.5 to 4.5 m).
- Those with small seacrafts are advised to take precautionary measures while venturing out over the other seaboard of Luzon due to moderate to rough seas (1.2 to 2.6 m).

Other Information:

- "DINDO" exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility at 9:00 AM today.
- At 10:00 AM today, a Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on all available data at 450 km East Southeast of Davao City (5.8°N, 129.6°E). This weather disturbance is less likely to develop into a Tropical Depression in the next 48 Hours. However, it may bring scattered rains and thunderstorms over CARAGA and Davao Region.

Location of eye/center:	At 10:00 AM today , the center of Severe Tropical Storm "DINDO" was estimated based on all available data at 555 km North Northeast of Basco, Batanes (OUTSIDE PAR) (25.3°N, 123.3°E) .
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of up to 100 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 125 km/h.
Movement:	Moving North Northwestward at 15 km/h.
Forecast Positions:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 24 Hour (Tomorrow morning): 950 km North of Basco, Batanes (OUTSIDE PAR) (28.9°N, 120.7°E)
NO TROPICAL CYCLONE WIND SIGNAL	
With this development and unless re-entry occurs, this is the final warning for this weather disturbance.	

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Moreover, you are hereby directed to reiterate the guidelines on personal protection and hygiene such as respiratory etiquette and hand hygiene, social distancing, environmental, and food safety measures.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualty.
