SUBJECT : Weather Advisory No. 03 for the Low Pressure Area (LPA) and Southwest Monsoon

I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

At 10:00 AM today, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on all available data at 225 KM west northwest of Iba, Zambales or 250 km west of Dagupan City, Pangasinan (16.0°N, 118.0°E). This weather disturbance remains less likely to develop into a Tropical Depression in the next 24 hours. It is forecast to continue moving west-northwestward and may exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility in the next 24 hours.

RAINFALL FORECAST

Today through tomorrow morning: monsoon rains over Batanes, Eastern Cagayan Including Babuyan Islands, Eastern Isabela, Aurora, Pangasinan, Zambales, Bataan, Mindoro Provinces, Romblon, Palawan, Antique, Zamboanga Peninsula, Basilan, Sulu, and Tawi-Tawi. Scattered light to moderate rains with at times heavy rainshowers over Metro Manila and the rest of Luzon and Western Visayas.

Flooding and rain-induced landslide may occur during heavy or prolonged rainfall especially in areas that are highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards. The public and local disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to monitor the rainfall/thunderstorm advisories and heavy rainfall warnings from PAGASA Regional Services Divisions and take appropriate measures.

COASTAL WATER CONDITIONS

A gale warning is in effect over the seaboard of Batanes and Babuyan Islands. Sea Travel is risky over these areas due to rough seas (2.5-3.1 M).

Those with small seacrafts are advised not to venture out northern and Western seaboard of Luzon and the western seaboard of Visayas due to moderate to rough seas (1.2-2.5 M).

The next update on this weather disturbance will be incorporated in the Public Weather Forecast at 4:00 PM today and 4:00 AM tomorrow.

The next weather advisory will be issued at 11:00 AM tomorrow.

You are hereby directed to monitor the situation and undertake precautionary measures in your area of responsibility (AOR). Likewise, the public and the DRRMCs are advised to take appropriate actions as necessary.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Moreover, you are hereby directed to reiterate the guidelines on personal protection and hygiene such as respiratory etiquette and hand hygiene, social distancing, environmental, and food safety measures.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualties.
