"DINDO" SLIGHTLY INTENSIFIES WHILE MOVING NORTH-NORTHWESTWARD OVER THE PHILIPPINE SEA

Track and intensity outlook:

- **On the forecast track, Tropical Depression DINDO is forecast to turn to the northwest in the next 24 hours and will move near or over the southern islands of the Ryukyu archipelago on Monday morning. It is likely to exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) between Monday morning and afternoon. DINDO will remain far from the Philippine landmass throughout the forecast period.**
- **Additional intensification remains likely over the next two days. DINDO may reach tropical storm category by Monday morning.**

Hazards affecting land:

- **This tropical cyclone has no direct impact on the country at the moment. No tropical cyclone wind signal is in effect over the country.**
- **Occasional rains (light to moderate with at times heavy) due to the Southwest Monsoon will be experienced over Luzon, Western Visayas, Central Visayas, Zamboanga Peninsula, Northern Mindanao, and Bangsamoro.**
- **Flooding and rain-induced landslide may occur during heavy or prolonged rainfall especially in areas that are highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards.** The public and Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Offices concerned are advised to monitor the Rainfall/Thunderstorm Advisories and Heavy Rainfall Warnings from PAGASA Regional Services Divisions and take appropriate measures.

Hazards affecting coastal waters:

- A Gale Warning is in effect over the northern and western seaboard of Luzon. Sea travel is risky over these areas due to rough to very rough seas (2.5 to 4.5 m).
- Those with small seacrafts are advised to take precautionary measures while venturing out over the other seaboard of the country due to moderate to rough seas (1.2 to 2.5 m).

Other tropical cyclones being monitored:

- At **8:00 AM today**, the Tropical Depression outside the PAR was estimated based on all available data at **1,070 km** West of Northern Luzon (**18.0°N, 110.5°E**). It has maximum sustained winds of 55 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 70 km/h. It is currently moving westward at **15 km/h**.

Location of eye/center:	At 10:00 AM today , the center of Tropical Depression "DINDO" was estimated based on all available data at 800 km East Northeast of Tuguegarao City, Cagayan or 715 km East of Basco, Batanes (20.2 °N, 128.8 °E)
Strength:	Maximum winds of 55 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 70 km/h
Movement:	North Northwestward at 15 km/h.
