“DINDO” INTENSIFIES INTO A SEVERE TROPICAL STORM AND IS NOW OVER THE YAEYAMA ISLANDS IN SOUTHERN RYUKYUS.

Track and intensity outlook:

- On the forecast track, Severe Tropical Storm DINDO is forecast to continue moving northwestward **towards the East China Sea and exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) this morning. It is likely to make landfall over Zhejiang Province in eastern China tomorrow early morning as a Severe Tropical Storm.**

Hazards affecting land:

- This tropical cyclone has no direct impact on the country at the moment. No tropical cyclone wind signal is in effect over the country.
- **Today, occasional rains (light to moderate with at times heavy) due to the Southwest Monsoon will be experienced over Batanes and Babuyan islands.** The public and local disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to monitor the Rainfall/Thunderstorm Advisories and Heavy Rainfall Warnings from PAGASA Regional Services Divisions and take appropriate measures.

Hazards affecting coastal waters:

- A Gale Warning is in effect over the **northern and western seaboard of Northern Luzon and the western seaboard of Central Luzon.** Sea travel is risky over these areas due to rough to very rough seas (2.5 to 4.5 m).
- Those with small seacrafts are advised to take precautionary measures while venturing out over the other seaboard of Luzon due to moderate to rough seas (1.2 to 2.6 m).

Location of eye/center:	At 4:00 AM today , the center of Severe Tropical Storm "DINDO" was estimated based on all available data at 475 km North Northeast of Basco, Batanes (24.4°N, 123.7°E) .
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of up to 95 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 115 km/sh.
Movement:	Moving Northwestward at 15 km/h.
