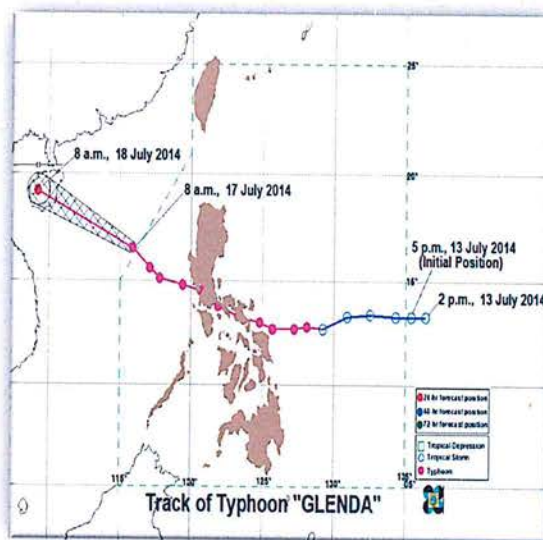

I. CHRONOLOGY OF EVENTS

13 July 2014

- The Tropical Storm (TS) about East of Bicol Region entered the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) and was named "GLENDA". At 10:00 PM, TS "GLENDA" maintained its maximum sustained winds of 65 kph near the center as it moved westward
- Pre-Disaster Risk Assessment (PDRA) Core Group, led by Executive Director USEC. Pama, NDRRMC, ASEC. Vilma Cabrera, DSWD, and ASEC. Raymund Liboro, DOST, and other member agencies convened at the NDRRMC Operations Center for a meeting in anticipation to Tropical Storm "RAMMASUN's" entry to the PAR. Subsequently, NDRRMC Operations Center sent a Memorandum to Chairpersons, OCD-RDRRMCs I, II, III, IV-A, V, and CAR instructing them to observe heightened alert in preparation for the entry of TY "GLENDA"



14 July 2014

- TS "GLENDA" intensified as it continued to move in a westward direction towards Bicol - Quezon area further threatening Bicol Region. At 10:00 PM, TS "GLENDA" intensified into a typhoon (TY) and slowed down as it moved west towards the Bicol Region
- At 11:00 AM, another PDRA meeting was convened and was presided by the Executive Director, NDRRMC at the NDRRMC Operations Center, CGEA, Q.C.
- At 2:00 PM, a Press Briefing re Preparedness and Updates on TY "GLENDA" was held at the NDRRMC Conference Room, NDRRMC Bldg., CGEA, Q.C.
- OCD-RDRRMCs I, III, IV-A, and V conducted their respective emergency preparedness meetings to discuss preparations for the upcoming typhoon

15 July 2014

- TY "GLENDA" maintained its strength and continued to move westward direction towards Bicol Region. At 10:00 AM, TY "GLENDA" passed very close to Catarman, Northern Samar and at 4:00 PM, TY "GLENDA" was over Albay gulf as it approached Legazpi City. At 10:45 PM, TY "GLENDA" intensified further as it traversed Ragay Gulf and moved towards Southern Quezon
- Landfalls:
 - ✓ 1st Landfall at 5:00 PM over Rapu-Rapu, Albay
 - ✓ 2nd Landfall at 6:30 PM over Tabaco City, Albay

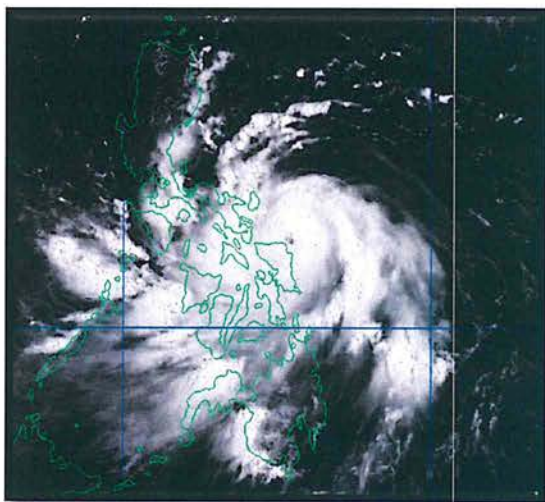
16 July 2014

- TY "GLENDA" accelerated while maintaining its strength and weakened slightly over Bataan moving towards Bajo de Masinloc, Zambales. At 10:00 PM, it maintained its strength and moved in a west northwest direction away from the country
- Landfall:
 - ✓ 3rd Landfall at 12:00 MN over Catanauan, Quezon

17 July 2014

- At 4:00 AM, TY "GLENDA" slightly weakened as it continued to move farther away from the country. At 8:00 AM, TY "GLENDA" exited the PAR

II. TYPHOON ANALYSIS



Typhoon "GLENDA" was a Tropical Depression (TD) initially spotted over the Caroline Islands, Pacific Ocean moving from west to west northwest toward the eastern border of the PAR on 11 July 2014. It gained strength and reached storm intensity in the morning of 12 July 2014 while over the Pacific Ocean and it was given an international name RAMMASUN, a Siamese word of "Thunder God".

TY "GLENDA" entered the PAR as Tropical Storm (TS) in the afternoon of 13 July 2014 and reached typhoon intensity on 14 July 2014 as it continued to move closer to Bicol-Samar area. As a typhoon, it crossed Bicol

Region, Southern Tagalog Provinces, and Bataan.

TY "GLENDA" stayed inside the PAR for five (5) days from July 13 – 17, 2014. It has attained 150 kph maximum sustained winds and gustiness of up to 180 kph while inside the PAR. During its occurrence, Public Storm Warning Signal (PSWS) Number 3 was the highest signal hoisted over the affected areas. "GLENDA" made three (3) landfalls in total: **Rapu-Rapu, Albay, Tabaco City, Albay, and Catanauan, Quezon.**

TY "GLENDA" was the 7th tropical cyclone which entered PAR this year, and the 2nd recorded typhoon to enter PAR after "FLORITA". Also, it was the 2nd tropical cyclone to make landfall, and is perceived to be the strongest tropical cyclone so far in 2014.

III. EFFECTS

A. AFFECTED POPULATION (TAB A)

- A total of **1,024,251 families / 4,653,716 persons** were affected in Regions I, III, IV-A, IV-B, V, VIII, and NCR. Of this number, a total of **661,805 families / 2,994,054 persons** were displaced

- Served inside **3,119** evacuation centers: **234,507 families / 1,082,926 persons**
- Served outside evacuation centers **427,298 families / 1,911,128 persons**

B. CASUALTIES (TAB B)

- A total of **106 persons were reported dead, 1,250 were injured** and **five (5) are still missing** in Regions I, III, IV-A, IV-B, V, VI, VIII, and NCR

C. DAMAGED HOUSES (TAB C)

- A total of **633,680 houses (112,067 totally / 521,613 partially)** were damaged in Regions I, III, IV-A, IV-B, V, VIII, and NCR:

D. STATUS OF LIFELINES

• Power Supply (TAB D)

- A total of four (4) Provinces in Region V (Camarines Sur, Camarines Norte, Masbate and Albay), four (4) provinces in Region IV-A (Cavite, Batangas, Rizal and Quezon) and sixty-five (65) municipalities/city in Regions III, IV-A, IV-B, V, VIII and NCR reported power interruption since 15 July 2014
- Power supply in Metro Manila has been totally restored as of 22 July 2014
- Luzon and Visayas grid are now interconnected

• Roads and Bridges (TAB E)

- A total of 11 roads and 2 bridges in Regions II, III, IV-A, V, and VIII were rendered impassable due to incurred damages and flooding

- A total of **₱247,407,472.00** damage to lifelines and other properties was reported in Regions IV-A and IV-B

F. SCHOOLS AFFECTED

- Of the 162 schools divisions, 117 or 72% were affected.
- Of the total 25,856 schools in Regions I, II, III, IV-A, IV-B, V, VI, VII, VIII, CAR, CARAGA and NCR, 187 or 1% were used as evacuation centers
- All divisions have resumed classes as of 21 July 2014
