#### **I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:**

On 26 November 2014, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) east of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur has developed into a Tropical Depression (TD) and was named "QUEENIE". It made landfall in Surigao del Sur on 26 November 2014 between 5:00 to 6:00 PM. It intensified into a Tropical Storm (TS) while over the West Philippine Sea on 28 November 2014 before it exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) on the same day at 6:00 PM.

#### **II. EFFECTS**

##### **1. Affected Population (TAB A)**

- A total of **13,182 families / 65,239 persons** were affected in **143 barangays** in Regions IV-B, VI, VII, VIII, X, XI, and CARAGA, of which, **211 families / 962 persons** are still inside **6 Evacuation Centers**

##### **2. Casualties**

- A total of **four (4) individuals** were reported dead, **two (2) injured**, and **eight (8) were reported missing**:

### 3. Incidents Monitored (3)

#### Region IV-B (MIMAROPA)

- Flashflood Incident in Roxas, Palawan
  - On or about 5:30PM, 28 November 2014, flashflood incident occurred in Brgy. Caraway, Roxas, Palawan due to heavy rains. A bamboo footbridge was totally damaged due to the said incident. No casualty was reported
- Capsized Unnamed Motorized Banca in Dumarán, Palawan
  - At about 6:30PM, 27 November 2014, a motorized banca capsized in the vicinity of Brgy. Sta. Rita and Poblacion, Dumarán, Palawan due to strong winds and rough seas
  - Both passengers onboard, identified as Ronilo Bacay, 42 y/o, a resident of So. Nagtalola, Brgy. Catep, Dumarán, Palawan and Jayson Tayo, 16 y/o, a resident of So. Balyeg, Brgy. Dagman, Araceli, Palawan were safely rescued by BantayDumarán rescue team and PNP personnel
- Flooding Incident in Taytay, Palawan
  - On or about 5:00AM, 28 November 2014, waist deep flooding (approximately 37 inches) was reported in 3 barangays (Talog, Cataban and Poblacion) in Taytay, Palawan due to heavy rains. Flooding has subsided as of reporting time.

### 4. Damaged Houses (TAB B)

- A total of **3,742 houses were damaged**, of which **343 were totally destroyed** and **3,399 were partially damaged** in Regions IV-B, VI, VII, and CARAGA

### 5. Damage to Agriculture

- Rice, banana, corn, and coconut farms were destroyed in Barili and Ginatilan, Cebu and Lila and Loay, Bohol due to strong wind while livestocks were affected in Alegria and Malabuyoc, Cebu
- A total of 2,000 kilos of ready to harvest seaweeds were totally destroyed in Pres. Carlos P. Garcia, Bohol

### 6. Suspension of Classes

- On 28 November 2014, classes in different levels were suspended in the Province of Palawan: all levels in Taytay, Quezon, Dumarán, El Nido and Lianpacan; elementary level in Batazara and Culion; both elementary and secondary level in Roxas and Sofronio Española

### 7. Cost of Assistance (TAB C)

- A total of **PhP4,001,683.72** worth of relief assistance was provided to Regions IV-B, VII, XI and CARAGA

### 8. Status of Lifelines

#### **Roads, Bridges, and Other Infrastructures (Tab D)**

- A total of **five (5) Bridges, five (5) roads and twenty-seven (27) other infrastructures** were damaged in Regions IV-B, VII and X due to Tropical Storm "Queenie"

- A total of Php2,656,000.00 cost of damages to infrastructures incurred in Laoy and Garcia-Hernandez, Bohol

## **IV. DISASTER RESPONSE**

### **A. NATIONAL / NDRRMC**

#### **1. NDRRMC Operations Center**

- NDRRMC Operations Center maintains its BLUE ALERT Status and continuously monitors and disseminates Severe Weather Bulletins and 24-hour Public Weather Forecasts to all RDRRMCs/OCDRCs through SMS, facsimile, and website for further dissemination to their respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels
- Issued Memorandum No. 26, s. 2014 directing all concerned RDRRMCs to effect the Pre-Disaster Risk Assessment process to discuss the possible scenarios based on existing hazards and corresponding preparedness measures

#### **2. Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH)**

- Installed warning signs on the site of damaged bridges in the Provinces of Cebu and Negros Oriental in Region VII
- Installed temporary bridge using bailey panels on the site of Sariling Bridge in Cebu; to date, repair of Tampocon Detour Bridge is still on-going
- **Installation of Bailey Panels and hauling of backfill materials materials for the approach were completed on 03 December 2014 at 3:30 PM**

### **B. REGIONAL DRRM Councils**

#### **1. RDRRMC IV-B**

- CDRRMO Puerto Princesa dispatched 117 Rescue Team and Kilos Agad Action Center (KAAC) to rescue a total of fifty-one (51) individuals including twenty-two (22) grade-school students who were stranded in Sitio Magarwak, Brgy. Bacungan, Puerto Princesa City. All strandeers were rescued at about 2:56 PM and no casualties reported
- MDRRMCs Busuanga, Cuyo, Culion, El Nido, Roxas, San Vicente, Taytay, and Dumarán conducted clearing operations in all roads, assessed areas vulnerable to flood and landslide, and provided family food packs to the affected families
- MDRRMC Araceli provided family food packs to the affected families amounting to Php334,825.00 and assistance for renovation of damaged houses amounting to Php500,000.00

#### **DSWD IV-B**

- Conducted validation of affected families by MSWDO and Brgy. Officials
- Ongoing repacking of relief goods at SWADT warehouse

#### **2. RDRRMC VI**

- PDRRMO Negros Occidental and affected LGUs extended relief goods to the affected families
- LDRRMCs are assessing the extent of damage in their AORs and attending to the needs of affected families

- CDRRM Units of Silay City, Negros Occidental evacuated a total of 2,600 participants of of the Provincial Jamboree (campers and teachers) to the hospital in Patag due to the inclement weather. On 27 November 2014, a total of ten (10) buses were deployed to transport the campers to Silay City covered court. The campers have since gone back to their respective families and schools
- Negros Occidental LDRRMCs assessed the extent of damages and attended to the needs of affected families

#### **DSWD VI**

- PSWDO Negros Occidental extended financial assistance especially to those families with damaged houses

#### **DILG VI**

- On 26 November 2014, sent advisories to their field offices to closely coordinate with LGUs, activate the LDRRMCs, and conduct pre-emptive evacuations in low-lying areas

### **3. RDRRMC VII**

- OCD raised Red Alert Status and activated OPLAN Alerto
- OCD VII is conducting Rapid Damage and Needs Analysis (RDANA) in Bohol
- RDRRMC VII Technical Working Group conducted emergency meeting at OCD VII Operations Center
- MDRRMC Moalboal conducted clearing operations on uprooted trees in Brgys. Poblacion East and Batad-Batad
- LGU Bohol implemented evacuation in coastal barangays, and deployed Jagna Emergency Response Unit for the conduct of search and rescue operations
- MDRRMC Jagna distributed 240 food packs to the affected families
- MDRRMCs Oslob, Boljoon, Dalaguete, Alegria, Badian, and Argao in the Province of Cebu and MDRRMCs Jagna, Duero, Anda, Guindulman, Corella, Garcia Hernandez, Valencia, and Lilain in the Province of Bohol are conducting damage assessment in their respective AORs
- MDRRMCs Duero and Jagna conducted relief operations in the affected barangays

#### **DOH RO VII**

- Placed on Code White Alert
- OpCen activated for 24 hours
- PHO of Bohol provided 160 pcs hygiene kits

#### **PHILIPPINE RED CROSS (PRC) BOHOL**

- Conducted relief operations in the Municipalities of Jagna and Duero

### **4. RDRRMC IX**

- Raised to Blue Alert Status
- Provided real time updates to PDRA Core Group

#### **PAGASA-DOST**

- Provided information on areas where provision of weather updates/warnings should be prioritized

#### **DILG IX**

- Advised pre-emptive evacuation and activation of operation centers in vulnerable areas

#### **DSWD IX**

- Raised Blue Alert Status in Regional DROMIC

#### **DENR-MGB**

- Continuously assessing vulnerable areas

### **5. RDRRMC X**

- OpCen Alert level was downgraded to White as of 28 November 2014 8:00 AM

- PDRRMC Misamis Oriental dispatched three (3) teams to Gingoog City and Municipality of Magsaysay for response operations
- CDRRMC Iligan City activated BDRRMC Operation Centers in Barangays Hinaplonan, Upper Santiago, San Roque, Mandulog, Sta. Felomina, Digkilaan, Bonbonon, and Rogongon

#### **DepEd X**

- Suspended classes in elementary and high school levels

#### **58 IB**

- Dispatched a response team to rescue six (6) families / thirty-five (35) individuals in Kinoguitan

### **6. RDRRMC XI**

- Activated its operation center and raised Red Alert Status in all P/C/MDRRMCs on 26 November 2014 to continuously monitor situation and disseminate weather bulletin and warnings thru quad media and SMART INFOBOARD
- RDRRMC XI Chairperson convened the Regional TWG for PDRA on 26 November 2014, 2:00 PM, to discuss the possible effects of the tropical storm and the member agencies' corresponding preparedness activities
- PDRRMC Compostela Valley raised Red Alert Status and established ICS down to municipal level

### **7. RDRRMC CARAGA**

- OCD CARAGA conducted PDRA Orientation and meeting
- PDRRMC Dinagat Islands issued Alert Level 1 which instructed communities in high risk areas to get ready for possible evacuation and advised all MDRRMCs/BDRRMCs to activate all preparedness mechanisms in their AOR
- PDRRMC Surigao del Sur recommended the cancellation of classes at all levels
- CDRRMC Surigao raised the status at the Operations Center to Blue Alert, placed all responders on standby at Incident Command Post, and implemented pre-emptive evacuation of residents in high risk areas
- LGU Hinatuan provided food packs worth PhP1,248.00

#### **DILG CARAGA**

- Reactivated its Regional Disaster Monitoring

- Pre-Disaster Risk Assessment (PDRA) Core Group, led by Executive Director USEC Pama convened at the NDRRMC Operations Center in anticipation to TD "QUEENIE"
