#### 1. Situation Overview:

##### Chronology of Typhoon Glenda

- On 29 August 2010, the Tropical Depression East of Extreme Northern Luzon intensified into a Tropical Storm as it entered the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) and was named "GLENDA" with maximum sustained winds of 65 Kph
- On 30 August 2010, TD Glenda has intensified into a Tropical Storm with maximum sustained winds of 75 kph and maintained its strength as it moved in a west northwest direction
- As of 10:00 AM, 31 August 2010 Typhoon Glenda, with a maximum center winds of 120 kph, is now outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) and moving away from the country. It is expected to be at 850 km northeast of Basco, Batanes or 40 km north of Okinawa, Japan tonight. **This is a final bulletin**
- However, Typhoon Glenda is expected to enhance the Southwest Monsoon and bring rains over Northern and Central Luzon

##### Effects

- OCD Regions I, II and CAR submitted reports on weather conditions, status of roads and bridges and dams but it has no effects on population affected, casualties and damages
- Ambuklao Dam opened one (1) gate at 5 meters
- The following roads in CAR were reported closed due to slides: Baguio-Bontoc Road (Gonogon Section); Mt -Province -Ilocos Sur Road (Kayan-Bulaga Section); and Mt Province -Cagayan -via Tabuk-Enrile Road (Tinglayan Section)

#### 2. Actions Taken

NDCC OPCEN continuously issued NDCC Advisories on general flood advisories, gale warnings and weather bulletins to Regions I, II, III, IV-A, IV-B, V, CAR and NCR through SMS and facsimile and uploaded same at the NDCC website for further dissemination to their respective local disaster coordinating councils from the provincial down to the municipal levels and the public as a whole.
