As of 8:00 AM today, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated at 280 kms west of Subic, Zambales (15.0°N, 117.5°E). This Low Pressure Area is not expected to affect any part of the country as it continues to move away. Meanwhile, Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) will continue to bring mostly cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms over Central and Southern Luzon and the Visayas becoming widespread rains over the western sections of Central and Southern Luzon including Palawan which may trigger flashfloods and landslides .

Residents living in the above-mentioned areas were advised to take all the necessary precautionary measures against flashfloods and landslides.

You are hereby directed to undertake precautionary measures in your AOR. Likewise, the public and Disaster Coordinating Councils (DCCs) concerned are advised to take appropriate actions.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let us untiringly aim for zero casualties.
