A. SITUATION OVERVIEW

1. BACKGROUND

From September 10 - 17, 2010, forty three 43 barangays in the provinces of South Cotabato, Sultan Kudarat, Bukidnon and Davao City were affected by flashfloods and landslides due to continuous heavy rains

Sep.t 10 & 12 - South Cotabato (Koronadal City, Banga & Tupi) - 24 barangays

Sept. 11 - Sultan Kudarat (Lambayong and Tacurong City) - 10 barangays

Sept. 13 - Davao City - (Marilog District) - 1 barangay

Sept. 17 - Bukidnon - (Kalilangan) - 5 barangays

2. EFFECTS

2.1 Affected Population

A total of 7,428 families / 37,120 persons were affected with 232 families / 897 persons evacuated

2.2 Casualties

- South Cotabato
 - 5 Dead Anita Patricio (28 yrs old), Rene Boy Patricio (10 yrs old), Michael Patricio (4 yrs old), Linda Eres (80 yrs old) and Aira Mae Cabil (4 months old), all residents of Sitio Acub, Brgy San Isidro, Koronadal City, South Cotabato
 - 9 Injured Lito Eres Sulan (28 yrs old), Aileen May Tony (21 yrs old), Eris Ricardo Tacoyo (18 yrs old), Virginia Esminio (33 yrs od), Ronelo Cabil (20 yrs old), Leslie Patricio (10 yrs old), all of Brgy San Isidro, Koronadal City, South Cotabato; JM Valenzuela (6 yrs old) of Purok 9-A Brgy Poblacion, Tupi, South Cotabato; and 2 unidentified

B. ACTIONS TAKEN

Bukidnon

- The local government of Kalilangan through the Municipal Social Welfare Development Office distributed rice, noodles and assorted canned goods to the victims who temporarily sought refuge in their respective relatives and friends
- The LGU Kalilangan Disaster Response and Rescue team rescued and evacuated those residents living along the riverbank to the safer places by utilizing manpower and dump truck
- ❖ The displaced families returned to their respective homes on Sept 18, 2010, while those families whose houses were damaged, settled temporarily at the shanties they established in their former lots
- **❖ LGU Kalilangan immediately conducted damage and needs assessment**
- MDCC Kalilangan provided 25 sacks of rice, 15 boxes canned goods, 5 boxes noodles

- ❖ PDCC Bukidnon provided 40 boxes sardines and 5 boxes noodles on Sept 18,2010 and 50 sacks NFA rice and 25 boxes sardines on September 20, 2010
- ❖ PDCC Bukidnon sent disaster response team to augment the effort of LGU Kalilangan Disaster Response team
- ❖ PNRC Bukidnon extended additional assistance in the form of rice, sardines and other household supplies

South Cotabato

- The City/Provincial Social Welfare and Development Office is continuously coordinating with the city and provincial government of South Cotabato to provide the bereaved families with financial assistance to include burial and other emergency needs while they are still in recovery period
- ❖ DSWD Field Office has standby funds worth PhP642,000.00 and family packs (1,111) stockpile of relief commodities composed of food (PhP1,156,607.92) and non-food items (PhP2,379,794.60) ready for augmentation
- ❖ A total of PhP 211,350.00 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families from the following:

DSWD XII - family food packs and used clothing - PhP189,600.00 LGUs - medicines and food packs - PhP 21,750.00

- PNRC distributed 86 pieces food packs to flood victims in Tupi on September 12, 2010
- DSWD XII shall be recommending Emergency Shelter Assistance (ESA) to families who have either totally or partially damaged houses due to landslides and flashflood
- CDRRMC Koronadal, PDRMMC South Cotabato, OCD XII and DENR-MGB XII convened on September 11, 2010 and assessed the extent of damages and possible geological risk of the affected areas
- DENR-MGB declared Sitio Acub, Brgy. San Isidro as danger zone for a week pending through risk assessment to be conducted by CDRRMC, PDRRMC and DENR-MGB XII
- ❖ The local Sangguniang Panglungsod of Koronadal City declared the city under a State of Calamity on Sept 14, 2010 pursuant to Resolution Number 1610
- ❖ LGU Koronadal City requested from the provincial government of South Cotabato for the establishment of permanent relocation site for the affected families of Brovs. San Isidro Sarabia and Carpenter Hill
- ❖ PNP units from Regional, Provincial and City Police Offices were deployed for the conduct of search and retrieval operations of missing victims

- ❖ PDRRMC South Cotabato and CDRRMC Koronadal transported injured victims to the hospital for treatment
- PEO DPWH South Cotabato conducted clearing operations at the national highway
- CDRRMC Koronadal City and PDRRMC South Cotabato provided medical services to the injured victims and hot meals to all affected individuals
- DSWD XII conducted stress debriefing to the victims in coordination with CDRRMC Koronadal

Sultan Kudarat

- ❖ DSWD Field Office has sufficient stand-by funds for the province worth PhP500,000.00, family packs (1,107) and stockpile of relief commodities composed of food (PhP1,688,626.61) and non-food items (PhP2,379,267.00) ready for augmentation when necessary
- There was no evacuation but affected families were served with basic needs by MDRRC Lambayong augmented by PDRRMC Sultan Kudarat and DSWD FO 12
- ❖ A total of PhP804,137.50 worth of relief assistance coming from the combined resources of DSWD (PhP300,000.00), LGUs of Lambayong (PhP461,250.00) and Tacurong City (PhP42,887.50) were provided to the affected families
