and Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ)

I. OVERVIEW

- At 8:00 AM today, the Active Low Pressure Area (ALPA) was estimated based on satellite and surface data at 330 km East of Borongan, Eastern Samar (11.5°N, 128.9°E) embedded along the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ).
- It is expected to develop into a tropical cyclone within the next 24 to 48 hours
- These weather systems will bring cloudy skies with scattered to widespread rains in Visayas and Northeastern Mindanao
- Residents living in low lying areas and along mountain slopes are advised to be on alert for possible occurrence of flashfloods and landslides.

You are hereby directed to monitor the situation and undertake precautionary measures in your area of responsibility (AOR). Likewise, the public and the Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (DRRMCs) are advised to take appropriate actions.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let us untiringly aim for zero casualties.
