I. OVERVIEW

Light to moderate rains (1.0 to 5.0 mm/hr) were observed in the past few hours. Threat of flashfloods is reduced but possibility of landslides remain especially in mountain slopes which experienced frequent and moderate to heavy rains during the past few days in the western section of Luzon. However, scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms will continue to affect Luzon and Visayas due to the Southwest Monsoon.

PUBLIC WARNINGS:

People living near the mountain slopes and in the low lying areas as well as near the river systems in the affected areas and the local disaster risk reduction and management councils concerned are advised to be alert for possible flashfloods and landslides.

You are hereby directed to undertake precautionary measures and monitor the situation in your AOR. Likewise, the public and DRRMCs concerned are advised to take appropriate actions.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualties.
