I. OVERVIEW

At 8:00 AM today, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on satellite and surface data at 60 KM south southwest of Puerto Prinsesa City (9.4°N, 118.5°E.)

Both Low Pressure Area and Tail-end of a Cold Front will bring mostly cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms over the entire archipelago becoming cloudy with widespread rains over Palawan, Northern Luzon, Eastern section of Central Luzon and Eastern Mindanao.

Residents living in low lying areas and along mountain slopes are advised to be on alert for possible occurrence of flashfloods and landslides.

You are hereby directed to monitor the situation and undertake precautionary measures in your area of responsibility (AOR). Likewise, the public and the Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (DRRMCs) are advised to take appropriate actions.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let us untiringly aim for zero casualties.
