I. OVERVIEW

- At 8 AM today, the Active Low Pressure Area (ALPA) was estimated based on satellite and surface data at 930 km east of Borongan, Eastern Samar (11.8°N, 134.0°E). The other low pressure area east of Southern Luzon has now dissipated.
- The ALPA is expected to bring scattered to widespread rains over Bicol Region and Eastern Visayas.
- Residents living in low lying areas and along mountain slopes are advised to be on alert for possible occurrence of flashfloods and landslides.
