OVERVIEW

At 10:00 p.m. today, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on satellite and surface data at 380 km West Southwest of Puerto Princesa City (9.4°N, 115.1°E).

Both low pressure area and tail-end of a cold front will bring mostly cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms over the entire archipelago becoming cloudy with widespread rains over the eastern section of Luzon, western section of Visayas, northern and western section of Mindanao and over Palawan.

Residents living in low lying areas and along mountain slopes are advised to be on alert for possible occurrence of flashfloods and landslides.
