

I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

A. Weather Update

"KATRING" has maintained its strength and continues to move away from the country.

B. Initial Effects

❖ The Philippine Coast Guard (PCG) through RDRRMC/OCDRC 2 reported that a passenger boat named "MB Eight Brothers – 2" bound for Camiguin Island, departed from Aparri, Cagayan on 26 October 2010, 9:00 AM. Because of zero visibility, the boat captain decided to go back to Aparri at 5:00 PM 26 October. While on its way back, the boat capsized at about 10:15 PM. The ill-fated boat drifted to shore of Barangay Maura, Cagayan at 11:30 PM, where passengers were accounted for.

There were eight (8) survivors, two (2) recovered dead while four (4) passengers are still missing.

Rescue/retrieval operations on sea could not be possible due to big waves.

II. ACTIONS TAKEN:

NDRRMC Severe Weather Bulletin No. 10 re Typhoon "KATRING" (CHABA) was disseminated to all OCD Regional Centers through SMS and facsimile; and uploaded into the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local disaster risk reduction and management councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels.

Regional Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (RDRRMCs) through the OCD Regional Centers were directed to undertake precautionary measures in their AOR. Likewise, the public and Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (DRRMCs) were advised to take appropriate precautionary measures such as pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying areas and near mountain slopes as necessary.
