I. BULUSAN VOLCANO BULLETIN:

The seismic network at Bulusan Volcano (12°46.2'N, 124°03'E) **detected one (1) volcanic earthquake** during the past 24 hours. Steaming activity at the volcano's summit was weak to no steaming when visible the whole day yesterday. The emitted steam clouds reached a **maximum height of 50 meters above the crater** and creeping downslope towards northwest. Measurement of Sulfur Dioxide (SO2) emission rate as of 13 November 2010 yielded an **average value of 22 tonnes per day**.

Alert Level 1 remains hoisted over Bulusan Volcano.

Areas within **four (4) kilometers** of the summit have been designated a **Permanent Danger Zone (PDZ)** which means that:

- the public is strongly advised not to venture inside this area because it may be affected by sudden steam explosions
- Meanwhile, the people residing near valleys and streams are also strongly advised to be vigilant against sediment-laden stream flows in the event of heavy and continuous rainfall.
- 3. Due to the **prevailing wind**, residents located in the **northwest** and **southwest** sectors of the volcano are advised to take precautions against ashfalls
- 4. Civil aviation authorities must advise pilots to avoid flying close to the volcano's summit as ejected ash and volcanic fragments from sudden explosions may pose hazards to aircrafts

II. ACTION TAKEN:

 NDRRMC Advisory on BULUSAN VOLCANO BULLETIN was disseminated to OCD Region 5 through SMS, facsimile and website for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs from the provincial down to the municipal levels.
