I. OVERVIEW:

After the 8:11 AM ash ejection yesterday, Bulusan Volcano (12°46.2N' 124°03E') steaming activity was characterized by strong emission of white steam column that reached a maximum height of 200 meters above the crater rim. However, the summit of the volcano was enveloped by thick clouds beginning 1400H yesterday up to this morning rendering visual observation impossible. Seismic activity increased as ten (10) volcanic earthquakes and four (4) explosion-type events were recorded by the seismic network during the past 24-hour period.

In view of the above observations, Bulusan Volcano remains at Alert Level 1 (abnormal). The current activity may lead to more steam and ash ejections. The public is strictly prohibited to enter the 4-kilometer Permanent Danger Zone. People residing near the valleys and streams should be on extra alert against sediment-laden streams flows in the event of heavy rains.
