1. OVERVIEW:

- Northeast Monsoon (Amihan) of strong to Gale intensity which is associated with light rains and cooler temperature will continue to prevail over Northern and Central Luzon particularly over the Eastern Section while the diffused tail-end of a cold front over Southern Luzon and Visayas continues to bring cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and isolated thunderstorms becoming widespread rains over the Bicol Region and Eastern Visayas which may trigger flashfloods and landslides.
- Fishermen in Luzon and Visayas are advised not to venture out into the sea due to big waves generated by strong to gale force northeasterly winds.

2. ACTIONS TAKEN:
