### **I. SITUATION OVERVIEW**

#### **A. BACKGROUND**

- ❖ Moderate to heavy rains that prevailed since early morning of 29 December 2010 due to tail-end of a cold front triggered the occurrence of flooding and landslides in Regions IV-B, V, VII, VIII, X, XI, ARMM and CARAGA
- ❖ Affected provinces are Palawan in Region IV-B; Albay, Sorsogon and Catanduanes (Region V); Cebu, Bohol, Negros Oriental and Siquijor in Region VII; Southern Leyte, Eastern Samar, Western Samar and Leyte, in Region VIII; Lanao del Norte in Region X; Compostela Valley and Davao Oriental in Region XI; Maguindanao in ARMM; and Surigao del Norte, Surigao del Sur and Agusan del Sur in CARAGA

#### **B. EFFECTS**

##### **1. Affected Population (Details on Tab A)**

- ❖ A total of **68,498 families / 356,528 persons** were affected in **394 barangays** of **54 municipalities** and **5 cities** of **12 provinces** in Regions IV-B, V, VII, VIII, X, XI, ARMM and CARAGA
- ❖ **As of today, 4 Jan 2011, a total of 2,712 families/12,908 persons are still housed at 28 evacuation centers: Region VIII (394 families/1,587 persons), Region XI (459 families/2,194 persons) and CARAGA (1,859 families/9,127 persons)**

##### **2. Casualties: (Details on Tab B)**

- ❖ **Dead - 10** (3 in Brgy Bolodbolod, St Bernard (**Fatima Discaryal, Rodel Discaryal and Jordan Laquipon**); 1 in Brgy Pancho Villa, Sogod (**Patrick Pelaez**) and 1 in Brgy Maanyag, Tomas Oppus, (**Recabel Montederamos**), all in Southern Leyte; 1 in Brgy Lower Sagadan, Baroy, Lanao del Norte (**Cristy Jane Celocia**); 1 in Mt. Diwata, Compostela Valley (**Apolinaria Porras**); and 2 in Manito, Albay (**Dadap Antonio and Dadap Lolita**); and 1 in Legaspi City (**Maricris Abrigo**)
- ❖ **Missing – 1** unidentified in Brgy. Guinsaangan, Bontoc, Southern Leyte

### 3. Damages

#### 3.1 Houses Damaged - 49 (32 totally and 17 partially)

**Region VIII** - One (1) house was totally damaged in Brgy Guinsaangan, Bontoc, Southern Leyte

**Region VII** - One (1) house was totally damaged in Brgy Kalunasan, Cebu City hit by an uprooted tree. Based on the rapid damage assessment conducted, the estimated cost of damage to properties was placed at PhP20,000.00

**Region X** - Twenty two (22) houses (12 totally and 10 partially) in Baroy and Tubod, Lanao del Norte

**CARAGA** - **Twenty five (25) houses (18 totally and 7 partially) in San Agustin, Surigao del Sur and Veruela, Agusan del Sur**

#### 3.2 Agriculture

**Region V** - 199 hectares of seedlings and newly transplanted stage of rice and vegetables were submerged in the Province of Albay: Camalig (174 has), Malilipot (15 has) and Manito (10 has).

**CARAGA** – Four (4) hectares of corn field in Las Nieves, Agusan del Norte is flooded

### 4. Emergency Incidents

Flooding and landslides occurred in the following regions due to the overflowing of rivers and tributaries as a result of continuous rains

#### 4.1 Flooded Areas

**Region IV-A** - Brgys El Vita and Paraca, Narra, Palawan

**Region V** - Various barangays in Jovellar, Daraga, Camalig, Malinao, Polangui, Libon and Tiwi in Albay and Castilla, Sorsogon

**Region VIII** - Brgy 92 in Tacloban City, Leyte; majority of the barangays in Saint Bernard, Southern Leyte; upstream barangays in Oras, Maslog, Canavid, Dolores, Jipapad and Taft, Eastern Samar; Brgy Fatima, Hinabangan, Western Samar; and Northern Samar

**Region X** - Flooding incidents occurred in Tubod, Baroy and Lala, Lanao del Norte due to the overflowing of Bulod River due to continuous rains

**Region XI** - Monkayo, Compostela, New Bataan, Montevista and Nabunturan in Compostela Valley Province due to the overflowing of Agusan River and its tributaries

- Boston and Manay Davao Oriental flooded due to the overflowing of Dakong Banwa and Casauoman Rivers

**CARAGA** - Surigao City, Surigao del Sur, Agusan del Norte and Agusan del Sur

**ARMM** - 13 barangays in Maguindanao Province: 11 in Talayan and 2 in Datu Anggal Midtimbang

#### 4.2 Landslides

**Region V** - Manito, Sto. Domingo, Malilipot and Bacacay, all of Albay with 18 barangays affected

**Region VIII** - Artemio Mate Avenue, Tacloban City, Leyte and Brgy. San Rafael, Hinabangan, Western Samar

**Region XI** - Brgys Mt Diwata and San Jose, Monkayo and Brgys Cambagang and Poblacion Maragusan

**CARAGA** - Minor landslides occurred in Surigao City and Dinagat Islands, Brgy Salvacion, Prosperidad, Agusan del Sur

## 5. Status of Lifelines

### 5.1 Roads

**Region VIII** - Road from Brgy. Fatima, Hinabangan, Western Samar to Taft, Eastern Samar already passable

All roads are passable as per information from the DPWH Regional Maintenance Engineer

**CARAGA** - Three (3) road sections in Agusan del Sur are still impassable to all types of vehicles due to flooding and landslide: Bah-Bah-Talacogon Road, Awa-Aspetia and Butuan Lapaz Road. Butuan-Talcogon-La Paz Road is impassable due to landslide. Agusan-Davao Road in Agusan del Sur; Agusan-Surigao Road in Agusan del Norte and San Francisco-Bahi Road in Agusan del Sur **are passable to all types of vehicles; In Surigao del Sur: Payasa-Los Arcos Road, Gamut-San Miguel Road and Surigao-Davao Coastal Road-Lingig-Davao Oriental Boundary are not passable due to landslide and flooding; in Surigao del Norte, Del Carmen-San Benito Road is not passable to all types of vehicle due to flooding.**

**Region XI** - Two (2) footbridges in Brgy Andap, New Bataan, Compostela Valley were washed-out while the National Highway along Barangays Cabinuangan and San Roque, New Bataan, Compostela Valley is scoured

### 5.2 Power Interruption

**Region VII** - Brgys Kalunasan and Tipolo Village in Cebu City

**CARAGA** - Surigao del Sur: Barobo power was shutdown due to flooding in San Fernando, Bislig City's power station; **Esperanza of Agusan del Sur has no power/electricity**

### 5.3 Communication:

**CARAGA** - the 175 feet tall tower of Radyo ng Bayan Station in Tandag, Surigao del Sur toppled down after a strong wind hit the tower. Station is off the air at the moment

### Suspension of Sea Transportation

**Region VII**-Ocean Jet Fast Craft travel from Tagbilaran, Bohol to Dipolog City, Zamboanga del Sur and from Dumaguete City, Negros Oriental to Tagbilaran City, Bohol were suspended due to rough seas

-Travel of small sea crafts in Siquijor "MV Ma Cristina" plying to Larena Siquijor to Dipolog, Misamis Oriental and "M/B Sta Fe" plying from Bantayan Island to Sagay, Negros Occidental were also suspended

## II. Emergency Management

### A. National Action

- ❖ USEC Benito Ramos, Executive Director of NDRRMC and Administrator, OCD presided an emergency meeting among the NDRRMC Member Agencies such as: PAGASA, AFP, DOH, DBM, PIA, DSWD, DPWH, PNP, PCG, OCD Division Chiefs and OCD Regional Directors and discussed the extent of damages caused by the tail-end of a cold front and the assistance and responses provided by the concerned agencies and OCDRCs in Regions IV-B, V, VIII, X, XI, ARMM, and CARAGA
- ❖ The Philippine Information Agency has been posting situation reports at Weather Watch (a facebook account) on the effects of the continuous rains in Southern Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao which can be accessed through website: [www.pia.gov.ph](http://www.pia.gov.ph) which has a link that takes the searcher directly to the account. Aside from the use of

social media, PIA also do SMS to relay important information like what PIA Director General Jose Fabia did last Sunday, January 02, 2011

- ❖ Armed Forces of the Philippines - the CENTCOM OPCON units conducted disaster response operations in areas affected by floods and landslides in Samar Province and deployed the following assets on January 1–2, 2011 to conduct rescue operations and provide assistance:
  - One Platoon from 14IB: PA (Jipapad, Eastern Samar); Loop de Loop Detachment of DCoy 52CBn, PA (Taft, Eastern Samar); one platoon from TG Gabay 801Bde, PA; (Hinabangan, Western Samar); and one platoon from 14 IB PA (National Highway in Taft, Eastern Samar)
  - Twenty one (21) Hoover Craft Air Boats donated by the Australian Government to PA Special Forces are now available and deployed in Liguasan Marsh in Maguindanao Province for use in the on-going disaster monitoring/operations in the area
  - The AFPCC facilitated the availability of two (2) PAF Aircrafts (UHIH): One (1) for use of OCD-5/PDRRMC Albay in the conduct of aerial survey and inspection at the landslide prone areas in Cagraray Islands in Albay **and the other for use of the team composed of DSWD, DPWH, PNP, OCD, Local Media and Chairperson, RDRRMC 8 in the conduct of aerial survey and clearing operations in Libagon and Sogod landslide areas in Region VIII. Said aircrafts are now prepositioned at TOG 8, PAF, Tacloban Airport today**
- Philippine National Police through its Regional units initiated SAR and evacuation operations in the following regions:
  - PRO5 evacuated 8,259 families/37,631 persons in Albay and Sorsogon; PD, Albay PPO with two (2) rescue units from Police Provincial Public Safety Company proceeded to Padang-Lidong, Sto. Domingo, Albay to assist motorist; Manito MPS conducted SAR on the reported missing person in Brgy Nagotgot, Manito who were recovered dead.
  - SAR team led by Police Inspector Marcelo Bernardino of Saint Bernard Municipal Police Station recovered three (3) dead bodies at the landslide areas and the elements of Southern Leyte Police Office also participated in the evacuation of 392 families/1,504 persons in the flooded areas in Southern Leyte
  - PNP–PRO 13 assisted in the evacuation of affected families in the low-lying barangays in Agusan del Sur; the elements of PNP HPG CARAGA conducted traffic, direction and control while the elements of Agusan del Sur Police Station participated in the SAR operations to locate reported missing persons
  - Activated the Police Regional Disaster Operations Center (PRDOC) in close coordination with the RDRRMC Operation Centers and assisted in disseminating warning advisories to the local Chief Executives, local DRRMC Action Officers, RDRRMC Member agencies and local radio stations and televisions stations thru fax, and text messages/SMS.**
  - 13thRPSB personnel led by PSUPT Francisco Dungo Jr., BATCOM conducted barangay visitation and SAR operations in Brgy Lemon to rescue the family of Boy Ebdan and seven family members of Rodillo Simili in Brgy Mahay all in Butuan City on January 3, 2011**
- ❖ Department of Health (CHD VIII) - PHO team led by PHTL Dr. Matibag was deployed to conduct rapid health assessment bringing initial logistical support (drugs and medicines); CHD representatives led by Dr. Verna Fernandez coordinated with MDRRMC and is closely monitoring the situation; CHD HEMS OPCEN Team is preparing augmentation support for drug and medicines and other WATSAN logistics; CHD 8 Cluster team is now conducting assessment and is

preparing for possible deployment if necessary; and admitted injuries at the Anahawan District Hospital

- ❖ **DOH-HEMS –OPCEN's staff is fully activated to include field response teams and PHTO-Based Response Teams conducted rapid health assessment in respective areas.**
- ❖ **DOH-CHD CARAGA distributed medicines/fluids to the Provincial Health Teams (PHT) to the affected areas worth Php380,434.25, broken down as follows: Agusan del Norte (Php79,685.76); Agusan del Sur (Php80,180.76); Surigao del Norte & Dinagat Islands (Php146,245.15) and Surigao del Sur (Php74,322.58)**
- ❖ **DOH-CHD Region X prepositioned assorted drugs and medicines worth Php50,000.00**
- ❖ **Philippine Coast Guard - PCG District Palawan (CGDPAL) dispatched 1 Rescue Team of SOG Divers to Brgys El Vita and Paracan, Narra, Palawan in connection with flashflood in said areas; Coast Guard District Central Eastern Visayas (CGDCEV) deployed 1 Team of Deployable Response Group (DRG) from Maasin Coast Guard Station to Brgy Pulot Pulot, Saint Bernard, in connection with reported landslide and SARV-001 is put on standby and mission ready; CGD Northern Mindanao (CGDNM) dispatched 1 Team of SOG Divers to Brgy Buhangin, Butuan City and SARV-3501 is on standby; CGD Bicol (CGDBCL) dispatched 1 Team of DRG to Brgy 17 Legaspi City, SOG personnel assisted stranded persons from Penaranda Park and transported the strandeers to St. Rafael Church, Legaspi City using PCG rubber boats; CGDBCL has assisted a total of 172 persons in Albay and Legaspi City; and PCG assets at standby/ready for dispatch (1 PCG aircrafts Islander, 1 PCG HELO and 4 teams of DRG at Headquarters-PCG)**
- ❖ **Department of Public Works and Highways, through its DPWH Maintenance Crew in various affected regions has been undergoing removal/clearing of debris and slides and installation of warning signs along the national and secondary roads which were affected by floods and landslides.**
- ❖ **DSWD and LGUs provided Php1,080,699.65 worth of relief assistance (Region V Php503,270, Region VIII Php217,600 and CARAGA Php359,829);**

- ❖ **DSWD prepositioned P22.2 million worth of standby funds, family packs and other food, and non-food items ready for augmentation support;**

- ❖ **DSWD mobilized/deployed the Regional QRT and SWAD Teams to assist the affected LGUs in the disaster operations;**
- ❖ **DSWD released and transported Php164,100.00 worth of 1,000 family packs to DSWD-FO V from the DSWD-national resource operations Center (NROC) on December 31, 2010 as additional augmentation support for the flood-affected municipalities in the province of Albay.**
- ❖ **DSWD provided P929,900.65 worth of relief augmentation to the flashflood-affected LGUs in the form of family packs and other food (rice, noodles, canned meats and fish, etc.) and non-food items (mats, blankets, clothing, etc)**

- ❖ **DSWD allocated PhP1 Million for Region VIII for the purchase of emergency relief supplies in addition to its prepositioned relief resources to augment the needs of the affected families.**
- ❖ **NGO - Gawad Kalinga (GK) headed by Mari Oquinena, will be sending a team to St Bernard today, January 4, 2011 to assess and start relief operations. In addition, GK team stationed in Orios University in Butuan is on standby ready to be activated to receive evacuees**
- ❖ **RDRRMCs and local DRRMCs' Chairpersons in Regions IV-B, V, VIII, X, XI, XII, ARMM and CARAGA orchestrated the emergency management in the flood and landslide- stricken areas in terms of search and rescue, evacuation ,relief operations, conduct of emergency meetings and disseminations of warnings to the public. Respective OPCENs maintains a 24/7 monitoring operations and automatically disseminates warning advisories to LCEs, Local DRRMC Action Officers, RDRRMC Member Agencies and local radio/televisions stations thru fax, SMS of PIA and directly to the media**
- ❖ **Respective RDRRMC- TWGs and local DRRMCs convened and discussed updates on effects of flooding and landslides, preparation for the projected increase of rainfall in the next succeeding days and preventive measures undertaken**
- ❖ **Affected local DRRMCs dispatched their respective response groups for the conduct of SAR and evacuation operations**
- ❖ **MDRRMCs Kapalong and Sto. Tomas in Davao del Norte Province convened on 03 January 2011 to plan strategies to address the threats on flooding incidents**
