### I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

#### A. BACKGROUND

- ❖ Moderate to heavy rains that prevailed since early morning of 29 December 2010 due to tail-end of a cold front and northeast monsoon triggered the occurrence of flooding and landslides in Regions IV-B, V, VII, VIII, X, XI, CARAGA and ARMM
- ❖ As of 5:00 AM today, 06 January 2011, Northeast Monsoon rains is still prevailing over Northern and Central Luzon and the tail-end of a cold front is affecting Southern Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao
- ❖ Affected provinces are:

#### B. EFFECTS

##### 1. Affected Population (Details on Tab A)

- ❖ Population affected increased from 92,606 families / 470,763 persons **to 102,077 families / 525,876 persons** in **632** barangays of **91** municipalities and **8** cities of **21** provinces in Regions IV-B, V, VII, VIII, X, XI, CARAGA and ARMM
- ❖ As of today, 06 Jan 2011, the total number of evacuees increased from 4,062 families / 19,970 persons **to 4,096 families / 20,139 persons** and they are still housed at **94** evacuation centers

- ❖ Among the seven (7) affected regions, CARAGA got the highest number of affected population **76,078 families / 399,403 persons**, followed by Region V (14,065 families / 66,684 persons) and Region VIII ranked 3<sup>rd</sup> with 4,425 families / 22,014 persons
- ❖ A total of **15,064 families / 78,874 persons** have been served both inside and outside evacuation centers from the combined sources of DSWD and LGUs

- Region IV-B** – 11 houses were totally damaged in the Municipality of Narra, Palawan
- Region VII** – One (1) house was totally damaged in Brgy Kalunasan, Cebu City
- Region VIII** – 19 houses in Southern Leyte and Eastern Samar (10 totally and 9 partially)
- Region X** – 33 houses in Baroy and Tubod, Lanao del Norte (16 totally and 27 partially)
- Region XI** – 77 houses in Compostela Valley and Davao del Norte due to landslide (26 totally and 51 partially)
- CARAGA** – 111 houses in Agusan del Sur, Agusan del Norte, Surigao del Sur, and Surigao del Norte (33 totally and 78 partially)

#### 4. Emergency Incidents

##### 4.1. Summary of Areas Flooded

- Region IV-B** – Brgys El Vita and Paraca, Narra, Palawan
- Region V** – Various barangays in Jovellar, Daraga, Camalig, Malinao, Polangui, Libon and Tiwi in Albay and Castilla, Sorsogon
- Region VIII** – Brgy 92 in Tacloban City, Leyte; upstream barangays in Oras, Maslog, Can-avid, Dolores, Jipapad and Taft, Eastern Samar; Brgy Fatima, Hinabangan, Western Samar; and Northern Samar; **Brgys Tambis 1 and 2, Mahayahay, San Isidro, Sug-angon, Ayahag, Nueva Esperanza, Catmon, Malibago, Ma. Asuncion, Panian, Himbangan, Magbagacay and Himatagon Poblacion**
- Region X** – Flooding incidents occurred in Tubod, Baroy and Lala, Lanao del Norte due to the overflowing of Bulod River due to continuous rains
- Region XI** – Monkayo, Compostela, New Bataan, Montevista and Nabunturan in Compostela Valley Province due to the overflowing of Agusan River and its tributaries - Boston and Manay, Davao Oriental flooded due to the overflowing of Dakong Banwa and Casauoman Rivers
- CARAGA** – Surigao City, Surigao del Sur, Agusan del Norte and Agusan del Sur
- ARMM** – 16 barangays in Maguindanao Province: 13 in Talayan and 3 in Datu Anggal Midtimbang

##### 4.2. Landslides

- Region V** – Manito, Sto. Domingo, Malilipot and Bacacay, all of Albay with 18 barangays affected
- Region VIII** – Artemio Mate Avenue, Tacloban City, Leyte and Brgy. San Rafael, Hinabangan, Western Samar; Brgys **Bolodbolod, Mahayag, Malinao, Tabontabon Lepanto, Hindag-an all in Saint Bernard, Southern Leyte**
- Region XI** – Brgys Mt Diwata and San Jose, Monkayo and Brgys Cambagang and Poblacion Maragusan
- CARAGA** – Surigao City, Dinagat Islands, Brgy Salvacion, Prosperidad, Agusan del Sur and Surigao del Sur

##### 4.3. Sea Mishap

- Region V** – Sail/row boat (sibid-sibid) capsized within the vicinity of San Pablo, Virac, Catanduanes due to strong waves with one fishermen reported missing identified as Patricio Adronial Pergrino, Jr., 56 years old of Brgy Sta. Cruz

##### 4.4 Storm Surge

- Region X** - **A storm surge occurred in Ozamiz City, Misamis Occidental with 3 barangays affected**

#### 5. Status of Lifelines

##### 5.1. Roads

- Region VIII** – Road from Brgy. Fatima, Hinabangan, Western Samar to Taft, Eastern Samar already passable; All roads are passable as

per information from the DPWH Regional Maintenance Engineer

- CARAGA**
- Agusan del Sur (Awa-Aspetia Road due to flooding and Butuan-Talacogon-La Paz Road due to landslide) – impassable to all types of vehicles and 4 road sections along Butuan-Talacogon-La Paz are flooded/eroded and passable only to motorcycles
  - Surigao del Sur (Payasan-Los Arcos Road and Gamut-San Miguel Road are impassable due to series of landslides and floodings); Surigao-Davao Coastal Road is passable only to heavy vehicles; Tago-La Paz Bridge – craneway washed-out; Lingig-Davao Oriental Boundary is impassable due to landslide; and JCT Lingig-Trento Road is impassable due to road depression/embankment slip
  - Surigao del Norte - Del Carmen-San Benito Road is impassable to all types of vehicles due to rock fall
  - Dinagat Islands–Dinagat-Loreto Road and JCT Magsaysay – Cagdianao Road are already passable to all types of vehicles
  - Butuan City – all national roads are passable to all types of vehicles

- Region XI**
- Two (2) footbridges in Brgy Andap, New Bataan, Compostela Valley were washed-out while the National Highway along San Jose, Monkayo; Barangays Cambagang and Poblacion, Maragusan and Barangays Cogonon, New Bataan are impassable and road along Brgy. San Roque, New Bataan, Compostela Valley is scoured. Roads along Brgys. Pongpong and Buca, Sta. Maria, Davao del Sur are not passable to all types of vehicles.

## 5.2. Power Interruption

- Region VII** – Brgys Kalunasan and Tipolo Village in Cebu City
- CARAGA** – Power/electricity in Barobo and Tandag, Surigao del Sur is already restored while the entire town of Esperanza, Agusan del Sur has no power/electricity yet

## 5.3 Water Supply

- CARAGA**
- There is an absence of potable water supply in Esperanza, Agusan del Sur
  - Water supply in Surigao City, Surigao del Norte has been restored in selected areas

## 5.4 Communication

- CARAGA**
- Radyo ng Bayan Station in Tandag, Surigao del Sur (175 feet tall tower) toppled down after a strong wind hit the tower. Station is still off the air at the moment

## 5.3. Suspension of Sea Transportation

- Region VII**
- Ocean Jet Fast Craft travel from Tagbilaran, Bohol to Dipolog City, Zamboanga del Sur and from Dumaguete City, Negros Oriental to Tagbilaran City, Bohol were suspended due to rough seas
  - Travel of small seacraft in Siquijor “MV Ma Cristina” plying to Larena Siquijor to Dipolog, Misamis Oriental and “M/B Sta Fe”



plying from Bantayan Island to Sagay, Negros Occidental were also suspended

## II. EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

- ❖ Total cost of assistance provided is **Php7,119,728.42** from the combined resources from DSWD, DOH, LGUs and NGOs and other GOs: Region IV-B (PhP69,000) Region V (**PhP1,848,132.65**), Region VIII (**PhP1,029,259.00**), **Region X (PhP50,000.00)** and CARAGA (**PhP4,123,336.77**) (details on **Tab D**)

### NDRRMC

- ❖ Continuously disseminating General Flood Advisories for Bicol Region, Eastern Western and Central Visayas, Northern Mindanao, Davao Region and CARAGA to the RDRRMCs concerned for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs; Conducted an emergency meeting on 3 January 2011 presided by USEC Benito Ramos, Executive Director of NDRRMC and Administrator, OCD and attended by NDRRMC member agencies such as: PAGASA, AFP, DOH, DBM, PIA, DSWD, DPWH, PNP, PCG, PMS, OCD Division Chiefs and OCD Regional Directors and discussed the extent of damages caused by the tail-end of a cold front and the assistance and responses provided by the concerned agencies and OCDRCs in Regions IV-B, V, VII, VIII, X, XI, ARMM, and CARAGA

### Philippine Information Agency

- ❖ Posts situation reports at Weather Watch (a facebook account) on the effects of the continuous rains in Southern Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao which can be accessed through website: [www.pia.gov.ph](http://www.pia.gov.ph) which has a link that takes the searcher directly to the account. Aside from the use of social media, PIA also do SMS to relay important information like what PIA Director General Jose Fabia did last Sunday, January 02, 2011

### Armed Forces of the Philippines

- ❖ The CENTCOM OPCON units conducted disaster response operations in areas affected by floods and landslides in Samar Province and deployed SAR assets to the following areas on January 1–2, 2011 to conduct rescue operations and provide assistance:
  - ❖ One Platoon from 14IB, PA in Jipapad, Eastern Samar
  - ❖ Loop de Loop Detachment of DCoy 52CBn, PA in Taft, Eastern Samar
  - ❖ One platoon from TG Gabay 801Bde, PA in Hinabangan, Western Samar; and
  - ❖ One platoon from 14 IB PA in National Highway in Taft, Eastern Samar
- ❖ PA Special Forces deployed Hoover Craft Air Boats donated by the Australian Government to Liguasan Marsh in Maguindanao Province for use in the on-going disaster monitoring/operations in the area
- ❖ The AFP Command Center facilitated the availability of two (2) PAF aircraft (UH-1H): One (1) for OCD-5/PDRRMC Albay in the conduct of aerial survey and inspection at the landslide prone areas in Cagraray Islands in Albay and the other one for the team composed of DSWD, DPWH, PNP, OCD, Local Media and Chairperson, RDRRMC 8 in the conduct of aerial survey and clearing operations in Libagon and Sogod landslide areas in Region VIII
- ❖ Philippine Navy, TOG5-PAF-DRU 207<sup>th</sup> / 505<sup>th</sup> SRG, 9ID, PA, 901<sup>st</sup> Bde, 902<sup>nd</sup> Bde and 903<sup>rd</sup> Bde assets and personnel were put on standby; **established close coordination with Chairpersons, RDRRMC Regions IV-A, IV-B and V; and Public Affairs Team joined Chairperson, PDRRMC Albay with national media for assessment and preparedness measures**
- ❖ **Philippine Army, 901<sup>st</sup> IBde, PA committed 4 vehicles (2M35, 2 km 450)) and 11 on call vehicles (6 M35 trucks, 4 km 450, 1 Elf from 901, 2IB, 7SRC, 3 RCDG and 5FSSU) and 16 personnel**

### **Philippine National Police**

- ❖ Initiated SAR and evacuation operations in the following regions through its Regional units:
  - a) PRO5 evacuated 8,259 families/37,631 persons in Albay and Sorsogon;
  - b) PD, Albay PPO with two (2) rescue units from Police Provincial Public Safety Company proceeded to Padang-Lidong, Sto. Domingo, Albay to assist motorist;
  - c) Manito MPS conducted SAR on the reported missing persons in Brgy Nagotgot, Manito who were recovered dead
- ❖ SAR team led by Police Inspector Marcelo Bernardino of Saint Bernard Municipal Police Station recovered three (3) dead bodies at the landslide areas and the elements of Southern Leyte Police Office and participated in the evacuation of 392 families/1,504 persons in the flooded areas in Southern Leyte
- ❖ PNP-PRO 13 assisted in the evacuation of affected families in the low-lying barangays in Agusan del Sur
- ❖ The elements of PNP HPG CARAGA conducted traffic, direction and control while the elements of Agusan del Sur Police Station participated in the SAR operations to locate reported missing persons
- ❖ Activated its Police Regional Disaster Operations Center (PRDOC) in close coordination with the RDRRMC Operation Centers
- ❖ Assisted in disseminating warning advisories to the local Chief Executives, local DRRMC Action Officers, RDRRMC Member agencies and local radio and television stations thru fax, and text messages/SMS
- ❖ The RPSB CARAGA personnel led by P/SUPT Francisco Dungo Jr., BATCOM conducted barangay visitation and SAR operations in Brgy Lemon to rescue the family of Boy Ebdan and seven family members of Rodillo Simili in Brgy Mahay all in Butuan City

### **Department of Health**

- ❖ DOH-HEMS-OPCEN's staff is fully activated to include field response teams and PHTO-Based Response Teams conducted rapid health assessment in respective areas
- ❖ CHD VIII - PHO team led by PHTL Dr. Matibag was deployed to conduct rapid health assessment bringing initial logistical support (drugs and medicines)
- ❖ CHD representatives led by Dr. Verna Fernandez coordinated with MDRRMC and is closely monitoring the situation
- ❖ CHD HEMS OPCEN Team is preparing augmentation support for drug and medicines and other WATSAN logistics
- ❖ CHD 8 Cluster team is now conducting assessment and is preparing for possible deployment if necessary and admitted injuries at the Anahawan District Hospital
- ❖ DOH-CHD CARAGA distributed medicines/fluids to the Provincial Health Teams (PHT) to the affected areas worth Php380,434.25, broken down as follows: Agusan del Norte (Php79,685.76); Agusan del Sur (Php80,180.76); Surigao del Norte & Dinagat Islands (Php146,245.15) and Surigao del Sur (Php74,322.58)
- ❖ DOH-CHD Region X prepositioned assorted drugs and medicines worth Php50,000

### **Philippine Coast Guard**

- ❖ **PCG District Palawan** (CGDPAL) dispatched 1 Rescue Team of SOG Divers to Brgys El Vita and Paracan, Narra, Palawan in connection with flashflood in said areas
- ❖ **CGD Central Eastern Visayas** (CGDCEV) deployed 1 Team of Deployable Response Group (DRG) from Maasin Coast Guard Station to Brgy Pulot Pulot, Saint Bernard (SARV-001 on standby). Four (4) SOG personnel from HQ, SOG departed today 06 January 2011 to augment the present rescue responders in CGS Maasin to support and assist SAR operations thereat

- ❖ **CGD Northern Mindanao** (CGDNM) dispatched 1 Team of SOG Divers to Brgy Buhangin, Butuan City (SARV-3501 on standby). Four SOG personnel from HQ, SOG departed today 06 January 2011 to augment the on-going SAR operations in CGDNM Butuan City
- ❖ **CGD BICOL (CGDBCL)** dispatched 1 Team of DRG to Brgy 17 Legaspi City, SOG personnel assisted stranded persons from Penaranda Park, transported the strandeers to St. Rafael Church, Legaspi City using PCG rubber boats and assisted 172 persons in Albay and Legaspi City; One (1) team of DRG personnel (2 SOG, 2 Medical and 3M-35 Truck crew) departed HPCG enroute to Legaspi City on 05 January 2011 to augment the present rescue responders. In addition, 2 SOG personnel earlier deployed to CGS Matnog during the yuletide season, will also join the team to support response operations thereat
- ❖ PCG assets on standby/ready for dispatch (1 PCG Islander aircraft, 1 PCG HELO and 4 teams of DRG at PCG Headquarters)

#### **Department of Public Works and Highways**

- ❖ DPWH, through its Maintenance Engineering Crews in various affected regions has been continuously undertaking the following activities such as: removal and clearing of debris and rock/slides; installation of barricades and warning signs along the national and secondary roads; declogging of culverts/ditches and removal of debris along bridge waterways; and emergency repairs of roads

#### **Department of Social Welfare and Development**

- ❖ Mobilized/deployed the Regional QRT and SWAD Teams to assist the affected LGUs in the disaster operations
- ❖ Released and transported 1,000 family packs (worth Php164,100) to DSWD-FO V from the DSWD-National Resource Operations Center (NROC) on December 31, 2010 as additional augmentation support for the flood-affected municipalities in the province of Albay
- ❖ Allocated Php1 Million for Region VIII for the purchase of emergency relief supplies in addition to its pre-positioned relief resources. **DSWD VIII delivered Php136,000.00 worth of assistance to St. Bernard consisting of 500 family food packs and 500 packs clothing and delivers 10 boxes of mineral water this afternoon, January 6, 2011. Other municipalities are also receiving various sources of donations (food and water)**
- ❖ **DSWD CARAGA provided relief augmentation in San Francisco, Agusan del Sur in the form of 1,000 family packs worth Php341,030.00. Packing of additional family packs is on-going**

#### **Department of Interior and Local Government**

- ❖ **DILG CARAGA reiterated the implementation of Memorandum Circular No. 2010-79 dated August 24, 2010 re Calamity Response Protocols and Associated Actions to ensure an active local government compliance of said issuance**

#### **Non-Government Organization**

- ❖ Gawad Kalinga (GK) headed by Mari Oquinena, sent a team to St Bernard on January 4, 2011 to assess and start relief operations. In addition, GK team stationed in Father Saturnino Urios University (FSUU) in Butuan City is on standby ready to be activated to receive evacuees
- ❖ FSUU offered its Gymnasium as Coordination and Relief Center of Butuan City DRRMC



## **RDRRMC**

- ❖ RDRRMCs and local DRRMCs' Chairpersons in Regions IV-B, V, VII, VIII, X, XI, XII, ARMM and CARAGA orchestrated the emergency management in the flood and landslide- stricken areas in terms of search and rescue, evacuation, relief operations, conduct of emergency meetings and disseminations of warnings to the public
- ❖ Disaster Operations Centers of affected regions maintain 24/7hours monitoring operations and dissemination of warning advisories to RDRRMC member agencies; local Chief Executives (LCEs), local DRRMC Action Officers; and local radio/television stations thru fax, voice, SMS and email
- ❖ Affected local DRRMCs dispatched their respective emergency response groups for the conduct of SAR, evacuation operations and clearing operations of damaged roads

## **Region V**

- ❖ **RD, OCD5 provided daily media interview re preparations of the new weather disturbance; conducted consultation meeting with PAGASA, and PDRRMCs Albay, Camarines Sur and Sorsogon; and conducted relief operations at Manito Elementary School in coordination with Governor Salceda, Cedric Daep (AFPSEMO), BGEN Marlou Salazar (9ID, PA), Col Ang (901<sup>st</sup> Infantry Brigade, PA); PDRRMC Albay conducted a pre-emptive evacuation in the critical barangays of Sto. Domingo, Manito, Guinobatan, Bacacay and Malilipot with an estimated population of 1,576 families / 8,200 persons; ordered the suspension of classes in Elementary and High School levels in Legaspi City, Manito, Daraga, Camalig, Sto. Domingo, Malilipot and Bacacay both in public and private; coordinate with local school officials of DepEd in their area of responsibility; and advised Chairpersons, City/MDRRMC to properly implement Advisory No. 8 re suspension of classes**

## **Region VIII**

- ❖ The MDRRMC Saint Bernard, Southern Leyte provided coffin and embalming fees to the bereaved families

## **Region XI**
