



I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

A. BACKGROUND

The northeast monsoon that prevailed over Northern and Central Luzon and the tail-end of a cold front affecting Southern Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao triggered the occurrence of moderate to heavy rains and subsequent floodings and series of landslide incidents affecting 23 provinces in Regions IV-B, V, VII, VIII, X, XI, CARAGA and ARMM. *Listing of areas affected by landslides, flooding & storm surge is on Tab A.*

B. EFFECTS

1. Affected Population (Details on Tab B)

- ❖ Number of population affected remains the same **248,223 families / 1,294,039 persons** in **1,350** barangays of **144** municipalities and **11** cities of **23** provinces in Regions IV-B, V, VII, VIII, X, XI, CARAGA and ARMM
- ❖ Among the eight (8) affected regions, CARAGA had the highest number of affected population with **112,096 families / 601,804 persons**, followed by Region **VIII** with **66,341 families / 338,064 persons**, while Region **V** ranks 3rd with **38,353 families / 196,435 persons**
- ❖ A total of **70,016 families / 365,050 persons** have been served both inside and outside evacuation centers from the combined sources of DSWD and LGUs:
 - **Inside 86 Evacuation Centers = 4,839 families / 22,505 persons**
 - **Outside Evacuation Centers = 65,177 families / 342,545 persons**
- ❖ In Albay, 28 evacuation centers remained open and still serving 2,277 families or 11,660 persons in the municipalities of Daraga, Malilipot, Manito, Sto. Domingo and Camalig

- ❖ In Region VIII, 35 evacuation centers remained open and still serving 1,081 families / 4,820 persons in the municipalities of Borongan and Maslog of Eastern Samar, and in the municipalities of Bontoc, St. Bernard and Sogod of Southern Leyte

4. Status of Lifelines

4.1.1 Roads

Region VIII

Northern Samar – Catarman-Calbayog Road, Catarman Macagtas Section (Brgy. Washington) **is not passable to all types of vehicles** due to collapsed 75m-long roadway. Construction of Detour Road is on-going.

Samar – Wright-Taft-Borongan Road, Lokilokon-Caughayan Section, Km 836+700 to 839+000 **is not passable to all types of vehicles** due to flooding of roadway to about 10 ft. high. District maintenance Engineers and crew are on site awaiting for flood water to subside.

Eastern Samar – Wright-Taft-Borongan Road, Camp 5 Borongan Section, Km 866+941; Flooded roadway at Brgy. Malinao, Km 887+878; Landslides at Km 883+500 and at Km 887+400, damaged slope protection at Borongan Bridge, Km 936+100 and Can-obing Bridge; Km. 940+365 **is not passable to all types of vehicles** due to overflow of flood water at Lumatod Bridge, Km. 866+941. Clearing

activities by District Maintenance crew is on-going. Temporary installation of I-Beams to both approaches at Can-obing is completed

Region XI

Davao del Sur Roads along Brgys Pongpong and Buca, Sta. Maria, Davao del Sur are **not passable to all types of vehicles**

B. NDRRMC ACTIONS

1. WARNING/ INFORMATION DISSEMINATION

- ❖ **PAGASA-DOST is continuously issuing daily 24-Hour Public Weather Forecasts, Weather Advisories, Gale Warnings and General Flood Advisories for Bicol Region; Eastern, Western and Central Visayas; Northern Mindanao; Davao Region and CARAGA to the NDRRMC Operations Center. These information are being disseminated to the public, media and concerned government agencies through the issuance of advisories and NDRRMC Updates for uploading at the NDRRMC website, SMS and facsimile for further dissemination to local DRRMCs**
- ❖ **NDRRMC conducted an emergency meeting on Jan 03, 2011, presided by USEC Benito Ramos, Executive Director of NDRRMC and Administrator, OCD and attended by NDRRMC member agencies such as: PAGASA, AFP, DOH, DBM, PIA, DSWD, DPWH, PNP, PCG, PMS, OCD Division Chiefs and OCD Regional Directors**
- ❖ **NDRRMC's Member Agencies like AFP, PNP, DSWD and DOH are still detailed at NDRRMC Operations Center for easy coordination and actions on the requirements in the field, extent of damages and assistance provided by the concerned agencies and OCD Regional Centers IV-B, V, VII, VIII, X, XI, ARMM, and CARAGA**
- ❖ **Philippine Information Agency** Continuously posts daily situation reports at Weather Watch (a facebook account) on the effects of the continuous rains in Southern Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao which can be accessed through website:

www.pia.gov.ph which has a link that takes the searcher directly to the account and also use SMS to relay important information

2. SEARCH, RESCUE, RETRIEVAL, EVACUATION AND CLEARING OPERATIONS

Armed Forces of the Philippines

- ❖ The AFP Command Center facilitated the availability of three (2) PAF aircrafts (UH-1H): one (1) for OCD-5/PDRRMC Albay for the conduct of aerial survey and inspection in Cagraray Islands in Albay; one for the team composed of DSWD, DPWH, PNP, OCD, Local Media and Chairperson, RDRRMC 8 for the conduct of aerial survey and clearing operations in Libagon and Sogod , Southern Leyte landslide areas in Region VIII; and one for the conduct of SAR operations for the missing fishermen in Catanduanes
- ❖ **PAF** directed all stations and detachments to place respective DRGs on standby for possible SAR operations. DRU 207th / 505th SRG, 9ID, PA, 901st Bde, 902nd Bde and 903rd Bde established close coordinations with Chairpersons, RDRRMC Regions IV-A, IV-B; V, VIII, X, CARAGA ; and assisted in the distribution of relief goods in various flood and landslide –stricken areas
- ❖ **PN** headed by Commander Joel Babas organized search and rescue operations using one (1) Islander fixed-wing aircraft for the 5 missing fishermen in Catanduanes; Provided three (3) PAF aircrafts (UH1H) to conduct SAR operations in Catanduanes, Albay, Southern Leyte, Eastern Samar and Western Samar Provinces. The CENTCOM OPCON units conducted disaster response operations and deployed 4 platoons : 14IB, PA in Jipapad, Eastern Samar; DCoy 52CBn, PA in Taft, Eastern Samar; TG Gabay 801Bde, PA in Hinabangan, Western Samar: and 14 IB PA in Taft Eastern Samar.
- ❖ **PA** Special Forces deployed Hoover Craft Air Boats donated by the Australian Government to Liguasan Marsh in Maguindanao Province for use in the on-going disaster operations; The 901st IBde PA committed 4 vehicles (2M35, 2 km 450)) and 11 on call vehicles (6 M35 trucks, 4 km 450, 1 Elf from 901, 2IB, 7SRC, 3 RCDG and 5FSSU) and 16 personnel; distributed potable water (sponsored by Manila Water) and assisted the relief operations at Brgy. Puro, Legaspi City; and joined aerial recon aboard one (1) UH Heli under TOG 5 at Brgy Baldoc, Pandan, Catanduanes
- ❖ The 9ID PA V continue the distribution of relief goods to the evacuees in Castilla, Juban, Pilar, Sorsogon, Sorsogon City; continue providing transportation and security assistance and monitoring of the situation in the flooded municipalities of Irosin, Juban and Casiguran, Sorsogon, Catanduanes and Masbate; and prepositioned 4 M35 trucks, 4 km 450, 15 Officers, 282 enlisted personnel and 1 mini cruiser jeep
- ❖ The 75th IB of the 401st BDE, 26th IB of the 402nd BDE, and 52nd Engineering Brigade augmented vehicles and military personnel in evacuation, SAR and relief operations in CARAGA

Philippine National Police

- ❖ PNP activated its Police Regional Disaster Operations Center (PRDOC) in close coordination with the RDRRMC Operation Centers ; assisted in disseminating warning advisories to the local Chief Executives, local DRRMC Action Officers, RDRRMC Member agencies and local radio and television stations thru fax, and text; alerted its regional offices and placed SAR teams and equipment on standby; provided direction and control in the conduct of operations in various regions; and initiated the conduct of SAR, retrieval, evacuation and relief operations in the provinces of Albay, Sorsogon, Camarines Sur, Catanduanes; ST Bernard , Southern Leyte Agusan del Sur and Butuan City through its regional units:

- ❖ **PNP-PRO V** placed on alert standby sixty (60) personnel from Regional Public Safety Bn 5 (PPO and CPO), SKW Cargo Truck and H-Lux Patrol Car; deployed SAR equipment (rubber boat, life vest and ropes) to landside and flood-stricken areas in Albay, Sorsogon and Camarines Sur; dispatched 30 RPSB5 personnel to PDRRMC Albay to assist in repacking of relief goods; assisted in evacuating the 8,259 families / 37,631 persons in Albay and Sorsogon; PPO Albay with two (2) rescue units assisted motorist in Sto. Domingo; and the Municipal Police Station (MPS) of Manito, Albay conducted SAR on the reported missing;
- ❖ **PNP-PRO VIII** -Elements of Southern Leyte Police Office participated in the evacuation of 392 families/1,504 persons in the flooded areas in the province and PNP St. Bernard is still conducting safety and monitoring operations on the affected barangays and evacuation centers.
- ❖ **PNP-PRO CARAGA** deployed 1,296 personnel, 73 patrol cars, 6 units 6x6 trucks, 1 ambulance and 3 rubber boats to assist in evacuation, SAR and relief operations in various provinces; conducted traffic, direction and control in the conduct of SAR and relief operations; Elements of PPO in Agusan del Sur assisted in the evacuation of affected families in the low-lying barangays and participated in the SAR operations to locate reported missing persons; RPSB CARAGA led by P/SUPT Francisco Dungo Jr., BATCOM conducted SAR operations in Brgy Lemon and Brgy Mahay in Butuan City

Philippine Coast Guard

- ❖ The following PCG Districts: **CGD Palawan, CGD BICOL, CGD Central Eastern Visayas and CGD Northern Mindanao** dispatched their respective SAR assets such as: Rescue Team of SOG Divers, SOG personnel and Teams of Deployable Response Group (DRG) in respective areas of responsibility to assist in the conduct of search and rescue retrieval and evacuation operations and relief distribution. PCG Headquarters rescue assets were placed on standby/ready for dispatch (1 PCG Islander aircraft, 1 PCG HELI and 4 teams of DRG)
- ❖ **Commander, CGD BICOL (CGDBCL) requested to higher headquarters the deployment of PCG vessel or craft, additional diving equipment and paraphernalia and to permanently detail a medical team as part of rescue capability and response to any SAR related emergencies and various CG stations** dispatched teams of DRGs SOG personnel; medical teams, SAR equipment and M-35 trucks to assist/augment emergency responders in Albay, Sorsogon, Catanduanes, Camarines Sur, Camarines Norte and Masbate. **Rescued two (2) motorized bancas (MBCA GANI and MBCA CAMIL) with 8 fishermen from Balatan, Camarines Sur at the vicinity of Animisola Island, Masbate**
- ❖ **PCG District Palawan (CGDPAL)** dispatched 1 Rescue Team of SOG Divers to Brgys El Vita and Paracan, Narra, Palawan to conduct SAR operations
- ❖ **CGD Central Eastern Visayas (CGDCEV)** deployed 1 Team of Deployable Response Group (DRG) from Maasin Coast Guard Station to Brgy Pulot Pulot, Saint Bernard (SARV-001 on standby). Four (4) SOG personnel from HQ, SOG departed on 06 January 2011 to augment the rescue responders in CGS Maasin to support and assist SAR operations thereat
- ❖ **CGD Northern Mindanao (CGDNM)** dispatched 1 Team of SOG Divers to Brgy Buhangin, Butuan City (SARV-3501 on standby). Four SOG personnel from HQ, SOG departed on 06 January 2011 to augment the on-going SAR operations in CGDNM Butuan City

LGUs

- ❖ **PDRRMCs** conducted a pre-emptive evacuation in the critical barangays of Sto. Domingo, Manito, Guinobatan, Bacacay and Malilipot in Albay, Juban, Sorsogon with an estimated population of 1,576 families / 8,200 persons

3. RELIEF OPERATIONS

Department of Social Welfare and Development/ LGUs/ NGOs/INGOs

Food and Non Food Items

- ❖ **The estimated cost of assistance provided in Regions IV-B, V, VII, VIII, XI and CARAGA in the form of food and non-food items from the combined resources of DSWD, LGUs and NGOs/INGOs is PhP33,262,407.03: DSWD PhP7,335,905.65; LGUs PhP23,948,110.18; and NGOS and Other GOs PhP1,978,391.00**
- ❖ **DSWD-CO** mobilized/deployed its Regional QRTs and SWAD Teams to assist the affected LGUs in the disaster operations; pre-positioned **PhP37.34 Million** worth of stand-by funds (**4,077,100.07**), family packs (**3,042,955.28**) and food (**2,350,579.28**) and non-food items (**27,871,782.61**) in all concerned DSWD FOs; released a truckload of **PhP 1,084,067.23** worth of food and non-food items to DSWD FO V from the DSWD National Resource Operations Center (NROC) on December 31, 2010 and January 08, 2011 as additional augmentation support for the flood-affected municipalities in the province of Albay; and released an additional PhP1 Million for DSWD-FO VIII for the purchase of emergency relief supplies
- ❖ **DSWD VIII** delivered PhP 136,000 worth of assistance to St. Bernard consisting of 500 family food packs and 500 packs clothing and delivers 10 boxes of mineral water on January 6, 2011; Other municipalities are also receiving various sources of donations (food and water); SWAD team in Southern Leyte continuously coordinate with the MDRRMC St. Bernard on the status of relief distribution, master listing of evacuees, reporting and monitoring of donated goods received to ensure proper distribution ; and PSWD Eastern Samar allocated family food pack and used clothing to Maslog and Jipapad at 500 food packs and 500 packs used clothing in each municipality
- ❖ **DSWD CARAGA** provided relief augmentation in San Francisco, Agusan del Sur in the form of 1,000 family packs worth PhP 341,030
- ❖ **DSWD V** pre-positioned 100 sacks of rice to Catanduanes, 50 to Camarines Sur, 25 to Sorsogon, 325 to Albay, and 500 family food packs to Libon, Albay
- ❖ **PDRRMC Camarines Sur has standby 7,000 food packs and prepared additional 2,000 food packs as requested by Mayor Sandy Ondis of Siruma**

Department of Health

Health and WASH

- ❖ **The extent of logistical health expenditures provided in various CHDs in Regions IV-B, V, VII, VIII, X, XI and CARAGA amounted to PhP2,477,480.84**
- ❖ DOH-HEMS-OPCEN declared Health Emergency Code White Alert and fully activated to include all field response teams and PHTO-Based Response Teams in **CHDs IV-B, V, VII, VIII, X, XI and CARAGA**; pre-positioned and augmented assorted medicines, medical supplies, water testing reagents, disinfectants, family kits first aid kits and WATSAN logistics in various CHDs; Respective CHDs intensified dissemination of health advisory on water sanitation, leptospirosis and household water disinfection in various evacuation centers through distribution of flyers; Various Provincial Health Teams (PHTs) conducted rapid health assessment and disease surveillance and prevention in all affected regions. **Based on surveillance conducted by PHO Albay, there were 718 cases reported: 334 cases of upper respiratory tract infection; 58 headache, 53 athlete's foot, 16 fever, 38 asthma, 20 bronchitis, 12 arthritis, 14 UTI, 3 skin disease, 16 wounds, 12 vascular disease,**

30 hypertension and 110 acute respiratory infection. Number of pregnant (30) and lactating mother (29)

- ❖ **Zuellig Pharma Corporation** donated 19 boxes of medicines to Region V containing Vidaylin Gummies with Garden Vegetables 30's Bio-enhanced Calcium Plus Cap 30's f and **UNFPA** provided 1,000 Hygiene kits to CHD V worth Php 840,000 including the transport cost, distributed in Albay for implementation of minimum initial service package for reproductive health of women in crisis in evacuation centers in Albay, with pregnant and lactating women as the target population.

4. DAMAGES AND NEEDS ASSESSMENT

Department of Agriculture

- ❖ **DA Central Action Center (DACAC)** submitted its assessment on agricultural productions. based on the report of its Regional Field Offices in Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao and the NFA distributed 3,824 bags of rice assistance to CARAGA PDRRMCs

Department of Public Works and Highways

- ❖ **DPWH**, through its Maintenance Engineering Crew in various affected regions, has undertaken the following activities: removal and clearing of debris and rock/slides; installation of barricades and warning signs along the national and secondary roads; declogging of culverts/ditches and removal of debris along bridge waterways; and emergency repairs of roads

- ❖ **RDRRMC V** conducted Press Conference with C, Albay PDRRMC, PAF TOG5 Group Commander and Media in connection with Search and Rescue (SAR) operations in Catanduanes;
- ❖ **PDRRMC Catanduanes** is continuously monitoring SAR efforts in Panganiban for the 5 missing fishermen. As of Jan 9, 2011, one of the missing persons identified as Joselito Soledad of Brgy Cagdarao, Panganiban was rescued by Mr. Juan Camacho, a fisherman from Brgy Baldoc, Pandan. SAR operations conducted by LGU Panganiban for the missing fishermen was temporarily suspended on June 09, 2011 due to strong winds and big waves
- ❖ **OCD-RD V** provided daily media interview re preparations of the new weather disturbance; conducted consultation meeting with PAGASA, and PDRRMCs Albay, Camarines Sur and Sorsogon; conducted relief operations in Brgys Tinapian and Cawayan, Manito, Albay in coordination with Governor Salceda of Albay, AFP Commander, 9ID, BGEN Marilou Salazar AFP, TF Sagip; 901IBde Commander; NAVFORSOL, PDRRMC Albay Staff National and Local Media. ; and proceeded to Catanduanes on January 11, 2011 to meet with C, PDRRMC Catanduanes to oversee SAR operations for the missing fishermen
- ❖ **DepEd V** ordered the suspension of classes in Elementary and High School levels in Legaspi City, Manito, Daraga, Camalig, Sto. Domingo, Malilipot and Bacacay both in public and private; coordinate with local school officials of DepEd in their area of responsibility; and advised Chairpersons, City/MDRRMC to properly implement Advisory No. 8 re suspension of classes
- ❖ **LGUs of Manito, Sto Domingo, Camalig and Malilipot, Albay** effected a pre-emptive evacuation as part of its disaster preparedness and response activities in areas prone to floods, landslides and lahar flows. The families were provided with 5 kls of rice
