#### I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

The <u>northeast monsoon</u> (Amihan) that prevailed over Northern and Central Luzon and the <u>tail-end of a cold front</u> affecting Southern Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao which started last Dec 29, 2010, triggered the occurrence of moderate to heavy rains and subsequent floodings and series of landslide incidents affecting 25 provinces in Regions IV-B, V, VI, VII, VIII, X, XI, XII, CARAGA and ARMM. Listing of areas affected by landslides, flooding & storm surge is on Tab A.

As of 11:00 AM today, 13 January 2011, the combined effect of the Northeast Monsoon (Amihan) and the tail-end of a cold front will continue to affect Luzon and Visayas. These weather system will bring scattered rainshowers and isolated thunderstorms over Northern and Central Luzon, the eastern section of Southern Luzon and the whole of Visayas becoming widespread rains over the Provinces of Quezon, Camarines provinces, Catanduanes, Albay, Sorsogon, Samar and Leyte provinces. Residents in low lying areas are advised to take appropriate actions against possible flashfloods and landslides. Fishermen in Luzon and Visayas are advised not to venture out into the sea due to big waves generated by strong to gale force northeasterly winds.

#### A. EFFECTS

#### 1. Affected Population (Details on Tab B)

- Number of population affected increased from 259,048 families / 1,340,015 persons to 262,107 families / 1,355,229 persons in 1,450 barangays of 147 municipalities and 15 cities of 25 provinces in Regions IV-B, V, VI, VII, VIII, X, XI, XII, CARAGA and ARMM
- Among the ten (10) affected regions, CARAGA had the highest number of affected population with 112,096 families / 601,804 persons, followed by Region VIII with 66,341 families / 338,064 persons, while Region V ranks 3<sup>rd</sup> with 43,246 families / 220,778 persons

- ❖ A total of 76,376 families / 389,186 persons have been served both inside and outside evacuation centers from the combined sources of DSWD and LGUs:
  - Inside 101 Evacuation Centers = 4,299 families / 21,769 persons
  - Outside Evacuation Centers = 72,077 families / 367,417 persons

#### 2. Status of Lifelines

#### 4.1.1 Roads

#### **Region VIII**

Northern Samar – Catarman-Calbayog Road, Catarman Macagtas Section (Brgy. Washington) is not passable to all types of vehicles due to collapsed 75m-long roadway. Construction of Detour Road is on-going.

Samar – Wright-Taft-Borongan Road, Lokilokon-Caughayanan Section, Km 836+700 to 839+000 is not passable to all types of vehicles due to flooding of roadway to about 10 ft. high. District maintenance Engineers and crew are on site awaiting for flood water to subside.

Eastern Samar – Wright-Taft-Borongan Road, Camp 5 Borongan Section, Km 866+941; Flooded roadway at Brgy. Malinao, Km 887+878; Landslides at Km 883+500 and at Km 887+400, damaged slope protection at Borongan Bridge, Km 936+100 and Can-obing Bridge; Km. 940+365 is not passable to all types of vehicles due to overflow of flood water at Lumatod Bridge, Km. 866+941. Clearing activities by District Maintenance crew is on-going. Temporary installation of I-Beams to both approaches at Can-obing is completed

#### **Region XI**

<u>Davao del Sur</u> Roads along Brgys Pongpong and Buca, Sta. Maria, Davao del Sur are **not passable to all types of vehicles** 

#### **Region XII**

Bridge connecting Marfin Tan Road going to Leondo farm, water pipe line and footbridge in Brgy Linan, Tupi, South Cotabato were partially damaged.

#### **B. NDRRMC ACTIONS**

#### 1. WARNING/INFORMATION DISSEMINATION

- ❖ PAGASA-DOST is continuously issuing daily 24-Hour Public Weather Forecasts, Weather Advisories, Gale Warnings and General Flood Advisories for Bicol Region; Eastern, Western and Central Visayas; Northern Mindanao; Davao Region and CARAGA to the NDRRMC Operations Center. These information are being disseminated to the public, media and concerned government agencies through the issuance of advisories and NDRRMC Updates for uploading at the NDRRMC website. SMS and facsimile for further dissemination to local DRRMCs
- ❖ NDRRMC conducted an emergency meeting on Jan 03, 2011, presided by USEC Benito Ramos, Executive Director of NDRRMC and Administrator, OCD and attended by NDRRMC member agencies such as: PAGASA, AFP, DOH, DBM, PIA, DSWD, DPWH, PNP, PCG, PMS, OCD Division Chiefs and OCD Regional Directors
- ❖ NDRRMC's Member Agencies like AFP, PNP, DSWD and DOH are still detailed at NDRRMC Operations Center for easy coordination and actions on the requirements in the field, extent of damages and assistance provided by the concerned agencies and OCD Regional Centers IV-B, V, VII, VIII, X, XI, ARMM, and CARAGA
- Philippine Information Agency Continuously posts daily situation reports at Weather Watch (a facebook account) on the effects of the continuous rains in Southern Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao which can be accessed through website: <a href="https://www.pia.gov.ph">www.pia.gov.ph</a> which has a link that takes the searcher directly to the account and also uses SMS to relay important information

#### 2. SEARCH, RESCUE, RETRIEVAL, EVACUATION AND CLEARING OPERATIONS

#### **Armed Forces of the Philippines**

- ❖ The AFP Command Center facilitated the availability of three (2) PAF aircrafts (UH-1H): one (1) for OCD-5/PDRRMC Albay for the conduct of aerial survey and inspection in Cagraray Islands in Albay; one for the team composed of DSWD, DPWH, PNP, OCD, Local Media and Chairperson, RDRRMC 8 for the conduct of aerial survey and clearing operations in Libagon and Sogod , Southern Leyte landslide areas in Region VIII; and one for the conduct of SAR operations for the missing fishermen in Catanduanes
- ❖ PAF directed all stations and detachments to place respective DRGs on standby for possible SAR operations. DRU 207<sup>th</sup> / 505<sup>th</sup> SRG, 9ID, PA, 901<sup>st</sup> Bde, 902<sup>nd</sup> Bde and 903<sup>rd</sup> Bde established close coordinations with Chairpersons, RDRRMC Regions IV-A, IV-B; V, VIII, X, CARAGA; and assisted in the distribution of relief goods in various flood and landslide –stricken areas
- ❖ PN headed by Commander Joel Babas organized search and rescue operations using one (1) Islander fixed-wing aircraft for the 5 missing fishermen in Catanduanes; Provided three (3) PAF aircrafts (UH1H) to conduct SAR operations in Catanduanes, Albay, Southern Leyte, Eastern Samar and Western Samar Provinces. The CENTCOM OPCON units conducted disaster response operations and deployed 4 platoons: 14IB, PA in Jipapad, Eastern Samar; DCoy 52CBn, PA in Taft, Eastern Samar; TG Gabay 801Bde, PA in Hinabangan, Western Samar: and 14 IB PA in Taft Eastern Samar.
- ❖ PA Special Forces deployed Hoover Craft Air Boats donated by the Australian Government to Liguasan Marsh in Maguindanao Province for use in the on-going disaster operations; The 901<sup>st</sup> IBde PA committed 4 vehicles (2M35, 2 km 450)) and 11 on call vehicles (6 M35 trucks, 4 km 450, 1 Elf from 901, 2IB, 7SRC, 3 RCDG and 5FSSU) and 16 personnel; distributed potable water (sponsored by Manila Water) and assisted the relief operations at Brgy. Puro, Legaspi City; and joined aerial recon aboard one (1) UH Heli under TOG 5 at Brgy Baldoc, Pandan, Catanduanes
- ❖ The 9ID PA V continue the distribution of relief goods to the evacuees in Castilla, Juban, Pilar, Sorsogon, Sorsogon City; continue providing transportation and security assistance and monitoring of the situation in the flooded municipalities of Irosin, Juban and Casiguran, Sorsogon, Catanduanes and Masbate; and prepositioned 4 M35 trucks, 4 km 450, 15 Officers, 282 enlisted personnel and 1 mini cruiser jeep
- ❖ The 75<sup>th</sup> IB of the 401<sup>st</sup> BDE, 26<sup>th</sup> IB of the 402<sup>nd</sup> BDE, and 52<sup>nd</sup> Engineering Brigade augmented vehicles and military personnel in evacuation, SAR and relief operations in CARAGA

#### **Philippine National Police**

- ❖ PNP activated its Police Regional Disaster Operations Center (PRDOC) in close coordination with the RDRRMC Operation Centers; assisted in disseminating warning advisories to the local Chief Executives, local DRRMC Action Officers, RDRRMC Member agencies and local radio and television stations thru fax, and text; alerted its regional offices and placed SAR teams and equipment on standby; provided direction and control in the conduct of operations in various regions; and initiated the conduct of SAR, retrieval, evacuation and relief operations in the provinces of Albay, Sorsogon, Camarines Sur, Catanduanes; ST Bernard, Southern Leyte Agusan del Sur and Butuan City through its regional units:
- PNP-PRO V placed on alert standby sixty (60) personnel from Regional Public Safety Bn 5 (PPO and CPO), SKW Cargo Truck and H-Lux Patrol Car; deployed SAR equipment (rubber boat, life vest and ropes) to landside and flood-stricken areas in Albay, Sorsogon and Camarines Sur; dispatched 30 RPSB5 personnel to PDRRMC

- Albay to assist in repacking of relief goods; assisted in evacuating the 8,259 families / 37,631 persons in Albay and Sorsogon; PPO Albay with two (2) rescue units assisted motorist in Sto. Domingo; and the Municipal Police Station (MPS) of Manito, Albay conducted SAR on the reported missing;
- ❖ PNP-PRO VIII -Elements of Southern Leyte Police Office participated in the evacuation of 392 families/1,504 persons in the flooded areas in the province and PNP St. Bernard is still conducting safety and monitoring operations on the affected barangays and evacuation centers.
- ❖ PNP-PRO CARAGA deployed 1,296 personnel, 73 patrol cars, 6 units 6x6 trucks, 1 ambulance and 3 rubber boats to assist in evacuation, SAR and relief operations in various provinces; conducted traffic, direction and control in the conduct of SAR and relief operations; Elements of PPO in Agusan del Sur assisted in the evacuation of affected families in the low-lying barangays and participated in the SAR operations to locate reported missing persons; RPSB CARAGA led by P/SUPT Francisco Dungo Jr., BATCOM conducted SAR operations in Brgy Lemon and Brgy Mahay in Butuan City

#### **Philippine Coast Guard**

- ❖ The following PCG Districts: CGD Palawan, CGD BICOL, CGD Central Eastern Visayas and CGD Northern Mindanao dispatched their respective SAR assets such as: Rescue Team of SOG Divers, SOG personnel and Teams of Deployable Response Group (DRG) in respective areas of responsibility to assists in the conduct of search and rescue retrieval and evacuation operations and relief distribution. PCG Headquarters rescue assets were placed on standby/ready for dispatch (1 PCG Islander aircraft, 1 PCG HELI and 4 teams of DRG)
- ❖ Commander, CGD BICOL (CGDBCL) requested to higher headquarters the deployment of PCG vessel or craft, additional diving equipment and paraphernalia and to permanently detail a medical team as part of rescue capability and response to any SAR related emergencies and various CG stations dispatched teams of DRGs SOG personnel; medical teams, SAR equipment and M-35 trucks to assist/augment emergency responders in Albay, Sorsogon, Catanduanes, Camarines Sur, Camarines Norte and Masbate. Rescued two (2) motorized bancas (MBCA GANI and MBCA CAMIL) with 8 fishermen from Balatan, Camarines Sur at the vicinity of Animisola Island, Masbate
- ❖ PCG District Palawan (CGDPAL) dispatched 1 Rescue Team of SOG Divers to Brgys El Vita and Paracan, Narra, Palawan to conduct SAR operations
- CGD Central Eastern Visayas (CGDCEV) deployed 1 Team of Deployable Response Group (DRG) from Maasin Coast Guard Station to Brgy Pulot Pulot, Saint Bernard (SARV-001 on standby). Four (4) SOG personnel from HQ, SOG departed on 06 January 2011 to augment the rescue responders in CGS Maasin to support and assist SAR operations thereat
- ❖ CGD Northern Mindanao (CGDNM) dispatched 1 Team of SOG Divers to Brgy Buhangin, Butuan City (SARV-3501 on standby). Four SOG personnel from HQ, SOG departed on 06 January 2011 to augment the on-going SAR operations in CGDNM Butuan City

#### Status of On-going SAR Operations in Catanduanes and Camarines Sur

- Coast Guard Detachment Virac recovered two (2) unidentified dead bodies at vicinity Sitio Ikantoho, Brgy. Canlubi and Brgy. Oga and the cadavers were brought to Payo, Catanduanes for identification
- Deployable Response Group (DRG) of CGS Legaspi; DRG Team with 2 sets of diving gears aboard CGS Masbate and CGs Sorsogon are on standby ready for deployment

Personnel of CG Detachment Pasacao and a team from the Office of the Mayor of Balatan, Camarines Sur jointly conducted SAR operation at the vicinity waters off Animisola Island, Masbate for the two (2) motorized Bancas namely MBca Gani and MBca Camil which were reported missing since 10 January 2011. The team successfully rescued the eight (8) fishermen namely: Oscar Recarte, Giovani Recarte, Loloy Coralde, Rachel Riflora, Danilo Tejares, Danny Tejares, Boyet Barraquel and Ricardo Riflora, all of legal age and resident of Brgy. Duran, Balatan, Camarines Sur

#### **LGUs**

❖ PDRRMCs conducted a pre-emptive evacuation in the critical barangays of Sto. Domingo, Manito, Guinobatan, Bacacay and Malilipot in Albay, Juban, Sorsogon with an estimated population of 1,576 families / 8,200 persons

#### 3. RELIEF OPERATIONS

#### Department of Social Welfare and Development/ LGUs/ NGOs/INGOs

#### **Food and Non Food Items**

- ❖ The estimated cost of assistance provided in Regions IV-B, V, VII, VIII, XI and CARAGA in the <u>form of food and non-food items</u> from the combined resources of DSWD, LGUs and NGOs/INGOs is <u>PhP34,875,013.93</u>: DSWD PhP8,260,662.15; LGUs PhP24,559,710.18; and NGOS and Other GOs PhP2,054,641.00
- ❖ DSWD-CO mobilized/deployed its Regional QRTs and SWAD Teams to assist the affected LGUs in the disaster operations; pre-positioned PhP37.34 Million worth of stand-by funds (4,077,100.07), family packs (3,042,955.28) and food (2,350,579.28) and non-food items (27,871,782.61) in all concerned DSWD FOs; released a truckload of Php\_1,084,067.23 worth of food and non-food items to DSWD FO V from the DSWD National Resource Operations Center (NROC) on Dec 31, 2010 and Jan 08, 2011 as additional augmentation support in Albay; and released an additional PhP1 Million for DSWD-FO VIII for the purchase of emergency relief supplies
- ❖ DSWD VIII delivered PhP136,000 worth of assistance to St. Bernard consisting of 500 family food packs and 500 packs clothing and delivers 10 boxes of mineral water on January 6, 2011; Other municipalities are also receiving various sources of donations (food and water); SWAD team in Southern Leyte continuously coordinate with the MDRRMC St. Bernard on the status of relief distribution, master listing of evacuees, reporting and monitoring of donated goods received to ensure proper distribution; and PSWD Eastern Samar allocated family food pack and used clothing to Maslog and Jipapad at 500 food packs and 500 packs used clothing in each municipality
- ❖ DSWD CARAGA provided relief augmentation in San Francisco, Agusan del Sur in the form of 1,000 family packs worth PhP\_341,030
- ❖ **DSWD V** pre-positioned 100 sacks of rice to Catanduanes, 50 to Camarines Sur, 25 to Sorsogon, 325 to Albay, and 500 family food packs to Libon, Albay

## Effects of Continuous Rains Due to Tail-end of a Cold Front in Regions IV-B, V, VI, VII, VIII, X, XI, XII, CARAGA and ARMM As of 13 January 2011, 6:00 PM

#### **REGIONAL INITIATIVES**

#### Region V

- ❖ RDRRMC V conducted Press Conference with C, Albay PDRRMC, PAF TOG5 Group Commander and Media in connection with Search and Rescue (SAR) operations in Catanduanes:
- PDRRMC Catanduanes is continuously monitoring SAR efforts in Panganiban for the 5 missing fishermen. As of Jan 9, 2011, one of the missing persons identified as Joselito Soledad of Brgy Cagdarao, Panganiban was rescued by Mr. Juan Camacho, a fisherman from Brgy Baldoc, Pandan. SAR operations conducted by LGU Panganiban for the missing fishermen was temporarily suspended on June 09, 2011 due to strong winds and big waves
- ❖ OCD-RD V provided daily media interview re preparations of the new weather disturbance; conducted consultation meeting with PAGASA, and PDRRMCs Albay, Camarines Sur and Sorsogon; conducted relief operations in Brgys Tinapian and Cawayan, Manito, Albay in coordination with Governor Salceda of Albay, AFP Commander, 9ID, BGEN Marilou Salazar AFP, TF Sagip; 901IBde Commander; NAVFORSOL, PDRRMC Albay Staff National and Local Media. ; and proceeded to Catanduanes on January 11, 2011 to meet with C,PDRRMC Catanduanes to oversee SAR operations for the missing fishermen
- ❖ DepEd V ordered the suspension of classes in Elementary and High School levels in Legaspi City, Manito, Daraga, Camalig, Sto. Domingo, Malilipot and Bacacay both in public and private; coordinate with local school officials of DepEd in their area of responsibility; and advised Chairpersons, City/MDRRMC to properly implement Advisory No. 8 re suspension of classes
- ❖ LGUs of Manito, Sto Domingo, Camalig and Malilipot, Albay effected a preemptive evacuation as part of its disaster preparedness and response activities in areas prone to floods, landslides and lahar flows. The families were provided with 5 kls of rice
- ❖ PDRRMC Camarines Sur issued Advisory on possible implementation of preemptive evacuation in the province in anticipation of possible flooding and landslides in 26 municipalities and prepared 2,000 food packs for distribution in Siruma and has stockpile of 2,000 sacks of rice.
- ❖ Mayor Volante of Malilipot, Albay distributed relief goods sponsored by Vice President Jejomar Binay to the 200 families in Brgy San Jose, Malilipot, Albay

#### **Region VIII**

- MDRRMC St Bernard constituted a Public Information Committee to report regularly on the status of donations received and status of relief operations; provided coffins and embalming fees to the bereaved families; and distributed relief goods to the evacuees

PDRRMC Lanao del Norte extended 1,970 food packs in the municipality of Tubod. Food pack contains rice, sardines corned beef, beef loaf and noodles and Non Food Items (NFIs) such as: basin, cooking pots, frying pan, slippers, pail used clothing, mosquito nets, blankets, plastic mats, water containers and still assessing the needs for permanent shelter, agricultural, livelihood and other assistance; MDRRMC Lala provided 424 family packs consisting of 4.5 kgs rice, 3 pcs noodles and 2 tins of sardines; CDRRMC Ozamiz carried out pre emptive evacuation prior to the occurrence of flooding; and CDRRMC Oroquieta prohibited the evacuees to go home thus families are still at evacuation centers

#### **CARAGA (Final Report)**

- ❖ PDRRMCs Surigao del Norte, Surigao del Sur, Dinagat Islands and Agusan del Sur and CDRRMCs Surigao City and Butuan City convened and discussed updates on effects of flooding and landslides in preparation for the projected increase of rainfall in the next succeeding days and preventive measures undertaken
- ❖ LGUs CARAGA efficiently utilized their own resources to undertake pre-emptive evacuation, SAR, relief and medical assistance to affected population
