#### I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

#### A. BACKGROUND

The <u>northeast monsoon</u> (Amihan) that prevailed over Northern and Central Luzon and the <u>tail-end of a cold front</u> affecting Southern Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao which started last December 29, 2010, triggered the occurrence of moderate to heavy rains and subsequent floodings and series of landslide incidents affecting Regions, IV-A, IV-B, V, VI, VII, VIII, X, XI, XII, CARAGA and ARMM (*Listing of areas affected by landslides, flooding & storm surge is on Tab A*).

From January 15 to 19, 2011, another flooding, landslide and maritime incidents occurred in same regions like Regions IV-A, IV-B, X, XI and ARMM with additional provinces affected.

#### REGIONAL SITUATION UPDATE as of 19 January 2011

#### Region II

❖ On 181740H January 2011, MV Lucky V, (Hong Kong registered general cargo vessel loaded with iron ore) with 10 crew was listing 25 degrees to starboard and at the brink of capsizing while battered by strong winds and big waves at vicinity 1.5 NM off the coast of Aparri, Cagayan. Latest info received states that said vessel is already upright, trimmed and out of danger. The ten (10) crew members who abandoned the vessel were rescued by CG station Aparri, Cagayan.

#### Region IV-A

Fishing Boat MB JENER with seven (7) fishermen on board was reported missing on January 18, 2011. Said fishing boat left Burdeous, Quezon on January 15, 2011 bound for Polilio. Two (2) of the fishermen were rescued with 5 still missing

#### Region IV-B

- Palawan: A total of 13 barangays were affected by flooding in Narra, Aborllan, Roxas and Puerto Princesa City
- ❖ FB Finely (half-submerged) 13 NM NE off Diapila Island, Brgy. Tinaguiban, El Nido with 29 fishermen on board (survivors)
- Barge Big Move with 4 passengers on board was reported missing on 17 January 2011. Said vessel drifted towards Palawan area after her anchor broke

off when the barge was battered with big waves and strong winds while anchored in Semirara Island

#### Region V

❖ Due to prolonged adverse weather and sea conditions, many fishermen risks their lives by venturing out to sea, despite warnings and advisories issued by authorities. As a result, there is an increase in the number of missing fishermen particularly at the eastern seaboard of the Bicol Region

#### **Region VII**

- ❖ Siquijor: 21 diarrhea cases were reported in the municipality of San Enrique from January 13-18, 2011 due to contaminated water source caused by heavy rains
- ❖ Cebu: Flooding incident occurred in Brgy. Poblacion II and III, Carcar with 50 families affected. One (1) identified as Sherwin Tejada was reported missing in Brgy. in Poblacion II, believed to be drowned and 9 road sections in Mactan were flooded which either incurred washed-out surfacing materials and with massive debris along the roadway and potholes
- Boho I: Water was released from Ewon Hydro Dam in Brgy. Ewon and the Hanopol Hydro Dam in Brgy. Hanopol, all in Sevilla. Brgys Bugang and Cambangay, Brgys. Napo and Camba in Alicia and Brgys. Canawa and Cambani in Candijay were heavily flooded

#### **Region VIII**

- ❖ Southern Leyte: Landslide occurred in Brgys. Camang, Pinut-an, Esperanza, Bilatan, Looc and Kinachawa in San Ricardo which prevented motorized vehicles to pass through and thus said barangays were declared isolated. According to Mayor Yu of San Ricardo, the landslide area is already passable as of reporting time
- ❖ A wooden bridge in Brgy. Pinut-an was washed-out while Bila-tan Bridge was partially damaged
- Flood-prone municipalities in Eastern Samar have been experiencing brownout since 17 January
- ❖ Brgy. Hindag-an in St. Bernard, Southern Leyte incurred road slip on 17 January 2011. Clearing operations has been undertaken by DPWH
- Water level of Binahaan watershed in Leyte is on Alert Level 2 (1.0 meter) affecting the municipalities of Pastrana, Dagami, Tanauan and Palo

#### Region X

- Lanao del Norte: One protection dike in Looc, Catarman. Camiguin was damaged; Two (2) seawall dikes (cracked and scoured); gravel based road (washed-out) and earth road (eroded) in Poblacion Tubod due to flooding; Copra dryer, poultry cage and sari-sari store in Tubod were washed out
- Misamis Occidenta I: One footbridge in Ozamiz City was totally destroyed and 1 sea wall in Aloran was damaged
- Misamis Occidental fifteen (15) barangays in Jimenez: namely: Butuay, Corrales, Dicoloc, Gata, Guintomoyan, Matugas Bajo, Nacional, Naga, Palilan, Rizal, San Isidro, Sta Cruz, Sebaroc, Tabo-o and Taraka were affected by water outage caused by heavy rains due to damaged water system (pumping station)

#### Region XI

❖ Davao City: Flooding incident occurred on January 17, 2011 affecting barangays Maparangi and Lizada in Toril District; Brgys. Talomo River, Calinan and Crossing Likanan; and Brgy. Lasang, Bunawan District due to continuous rains that caused the overflowing of Lipada River. Highway along these areas was submerged with water.

- Approach of Calinga-Wangan and Alcantara Bridges were damaged connecting Brgy. Wangan to Alcantara and Sitio Balite Calinan District, Davao City were damaged. Access of people is done through the use of improvised bridges. As of this time, floodwater is gradually subsiding and the traffic is now under control
- ❖ Davao del Sur: Flash flood occurred early morning January 18, 2011 at Brgy. Darong, Sta. Cruz due to heavy downpour and high tide which triggered the overflowing of Sibulan River. Eighty (80) families are still housed at Darong Brgy. Hall, Chapel and Almendras Gymnasium. Said barangay is experiencing power blackout
- Davao Oriental: Landslide occurred in Boston on January 17, 2011 due to heavy rains
- ❖ Davao del Norte: Four barangays (4) in Panabo City were affected by flooding which occurred on January 16 and 17, 2011 due to heavy rains caused by the overflowing of Bunawan River; 300 trunks of Cavendish bananas and vegetable crops were damaged; Tagactac bridge and a foot bridge in Barangay San Nicolas were partially damaged

#### **ARMM**

Maguindanao: 10 barangays were affected in Sultan Kudarat due to flooding with 9,388 families affected

#### **CARAGA**

- In view of the prevailing rains, RDRRMC CARAGA raised Alert Level I (READY) for CARAGA Region; PDRRMCs of Surigao del Norte and Dinagat Islands raised Alert Level 2
- Department of Education issued memo on the suspension of classes in pre-school and elementary levels in Butuan City, Surigao City and Surigao del Norte

#### **B. SUMMARY OF EFFECTS**

- 1. AFFECTED POPULATION (Details on Tab B)
  - The total number of population affected is 345,786 families / 1,763,967 persons in 1,940 barangays of 173 municipalities and 17 cities of 25 provinces in Regions IV-B, V, VI, VII, VIII, X, XI, XII, CARAGA and ARMM
  - Among the ten (10) affected regions, CARAGA had the highest number of affected population with 112,176 families / 602,204 persons, followed by Region VIII with 107,360 families / 530,182 persons, while Region V ranked 3<sup>rd</sup> with 69,265 families / 350,533 persons
  - ❖ To date, a total of 147,543 families / 729,454 persons have been served both inside and outside evacuation centers from the combined sources of DSWD and LGUs:
    - Inside 74 Evacuation Centers = 12,523 families / 61,054 persons
    - Outside Evacuation Centers = 135,020 families / 668,400 persons

#### B. NDRRMC ACTIONS

#### 1. WARNING/INFORMATION DISSEMINATION

- ❖ PAGASA-DOST is continuously issuing daily 24-Hour Public Weather Forecasts, Weather Advisories, Gale Warnings and General Flood Advisories for Bicol Region; Eastern, Western and Central Visayas; Northern Mindanao; Davao Region and CARAGA to the NDRRMC Operations Center. These information are being disseminated to the public, media and concerned government agencies through the issuance of advisories and NDRRMC Updates for uploading at the NDRRMC website, SMS and facsimile for further dissemination to local DRRMCs
- NDRRMC conducted an emergency meeting on January 03, 2011, presided by USEC Benito Ramos, Executive Director of NDRRMC and Administrator, OCD and attended by NDRRMC member agencies such as: PAGASA, AFP, DOH, DBM, PIA, DSWD, DPWH, PNP, PCG, PMS, OCD Division Chiefs and OCD Regional Directors
- ❖ NDRRMC's Member Agencies like AFP, PNP, DSWD and DOH are still detailed at NDRRMC Operations Center for easy coordination and actions on the requirements in the field, extent of damages and assistance provided by the concerned agencies and OCD Regional Centers IV-B, V, VI, VII, VIII, X, XI, ARMM and CARAGA
- ❖ Philippine Information Agency Continuously posts daily situation reports at Weather Watch (a facebook account) on the effects of the continuous rains in Southern Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao which can be accessed through website: <a href="www.pia.gov.ph">www.pia.gov.ph</a> which has a link that takes the searcher directly to the account and also uses SMS to relay important information

#### 2. President's Visit to Regions V, VIII and CARAGA

❖ On January 14, 2011, His Excellency President Benigno C. Aquino III together with Voltaire Gazmin, National Defense Secretary/Chairperson, NDRRMC; Dinky Soliman, DSWD Secretary; Proceso Alcala, DA Secretary; Enrique Ona, DOH Secretary; Rogelio Singson, Secretary DPWH; Jesus Robredo, DILG Secretary; Edwin Lacierda, Presidential Spokesperson; and USEC Benito Ramos, Executive Director, NDRRMC and Administrator, OCD, visited three (3) regions that were heavily affected by landslides and floods namely: CARAGA, Region V and Region VIII to oversee the extent of damages and personally check the status of the on-going relief operations being conducted by local agencies in the ground. Upon arrival of the President, respective RDRRMCs in afore-said regions conducted conferences/briefings participated by respective member agencies, selected LGUs and media. #### 3. SEARCH, RESCUE, (SAR) RETRIEVAL, EVACUATION AND CLEARING OPERATIONS

<u>Status of On Going SAR Operations in Palawan , Quezon, Camarines Norte and Catanduanes</u>

#### **Region IV-A**

- ❖ RDRRMC IV-A requested PCG-STL and NAVFORSOL to conduct search and rescue operations re: Missing Fishermen in Burdeous, Quezon
- PDRRMC Quezon alerted MDRRMCs along the Eastern coastline of Quezon to be on the look-out for the missing fishermen
- The four fishermen who were reported missing in Mercedes, Camarines Norte were rescued in Perez, Quezon. Their identities are being determined as of reporting time

#### **Region IV-B**

#### **Palawan**

- ❖ FB Finely was half-submerged when rescued by sister ship FB Mark Ryan. The ship was towed towards Brgy. Liminangcong, Taytay with all 29 crew/fishermen rescued safe and in good physical condition
- ❖ According to CGDET Taytay, there are 31 survivors gathered in Brgy. Hall of Paly Island and are still looking for the possibility of locating the remaining 5 other missing fishermen with a total of 36 persons. Most of the survivors are suffering from colds and wounds. They intend to transfer the survivors from Paly Island to Taytay, Palawan as soon as weather permits. PCG SAR Team reported that their communication equipment is experiencing technical problem due to poor audio signal and low cp batteries
- ❖ At about 181500H Jan 2011 CGDET Taytay proceeded to Debangan Island to verify the reported sightings of survivors which turn out to be negative
- Philippine Red Cross Palawan activated a team to conduct stress management and medical assistance to survivors; CGS coordinated with NAVFOREST for the availability of two (2) drums of AVGAS to be transported to Roxas to be used in SAR operations and OCD IV-B is monitoring the status of the victims and coordinating with DSWD IV-B PCG WESCOM and PDRRMC Palawan
- CGDPAL and PS-74 PN are now conducting SAR operations re: Capsized FB Jonathan I in Cannaron Island, Linapacan, Palawan supported by SARV-002 from HPCG and PCG Islander from DOTC Manila. PCG Auxiliary was also alerted to support the SAR operations
- CG Detachment Semirara alerted available floating assets in the area for the conduct of SAR if weather permits and has issued Notification of Mariners (NOTAM) re: said incident, sister ship has joined the conduct of SAR Operations and PCG Aircraft was alerted for the conduct of air reconnaissance

#### Region V

- Local SAR is currently hampered by the strong winds associated by the TECF. Hence, air asset is required. Currently, PAF TOG 5 could not provide its Hueys to conduct SAR (1 Aircraft is non-operational for 1 week and still awaiting spare parts)
- PRO 5 will assist PCG 5 in validating information regarding missing fishermen. NAVFORSOL will deploy DRRU Team in Camarines Norte to assist in SAR and set-up Advance Command Post (ACP) in Daet Airport.

- PN Islander will be initially deployed from Cavite to assist in SAR and will use Daet Airport as base of operations. PCG SOG assets is pre-positioned in Camarines Norte to augment local SAR
- OCD RD 5 coordinated with PNP Bato and Pandan, Catanduanes, Vinzon, Camarines Norte, Pandan Municipal Station and the Mayor of Pandan for the reported missing fishermen
- RDRRMC Region 5 reported 5 banca with 14 fishermen returned back safe and 3 banca with 7 fishermen remained missing in Pandan, Catanduanes
- PDRRMC Albay Chairman and Governor requested for augmentation from the national government to support provincial government's evacuation efforts for projected vulnerable communities

#### **RDRRMC**

C, RDRRMC 5 requested AFP thru NDRRMC for the availability of one (1) PN Islander aircraft to conduct search and rescue operations for two (2) fishermen missing in the vicinity of Pandan, Catanduanes

#### Region XI

CDRRMC Panabo Rescue Team and Davao City Central 911 still conducting search and rescue operations for the missing person (Melanio Bintas, 46 y/o) along the river and seashores of Bunawan. RDCC is continuously monitoring the situation in the area. Damages were referred to City Engineer's Office and City Agriculture for appropriate action

#### **CARAGA**

- Quick Action Response Team (QART) conducted SAR operations and reported that the missing fisherman Mr. Rey Benitez of Purok 5 Brgy. Mabua, Surigao City was found alive along Mabua-Leyte Sea in the Province of Camiguin Island
- MDRRMC Alegria, Surigao del Norte conducted pre-emptive evacuation to 14 families but they returned home

#### 3. RELIEF OPERATIONS

#### Department of Social Welfare and Development/ LGUs/ NGOs/INGOs

#### **Food and Non-Food Items**

- The estimated cost of assistance provided in Regions IV-B, V, VI, VII, VIII, XI and CARAGA in the <u>form of food and non-food items</u> from the combined resources of DSWD, LGUs and NGOs/INGOs is <u>PhP 34,716,951.53</u>: **DSWD Ph10,401,366.15**; LGUs PhP23,825,862.18; and NGOS and Other GOs PhP489,723.20
- ❖ DSWD-CO mobilized/deployed its Regional QRTs and SWAD Teams to assist the affected LGUs in the disaster operations; allocated PhP4.0M as additional standby funds for the local government of the following FOs: CARAGA PhP1.5 M), V (PhP0.5 M), VIII (PhP1.5M) and XI (PhP0.5M) and pre-positioned PhP 26.09 Million worth of stand-by funds, family packs, other food and non-food items in all concerned DSWD-FOs ready available for augmentation support; and released a truckload of PhP1,643,541.58 worth of food and non-food items to DSWD FO V from the DSWD National Resource Operations Center (NROC) on Dec 31, 2010 and Jan 08 and 13, 2011 as additional augmentation support in Albay
- DSWD FO-V has sufficient family food packs 150 (PhP25,315.52) and stockpile of relief commodities composed of food (PhP822,168.60) and non-food

- (PhP16,535,202.73) ready for additional augmentation assistance and prepositioned 100 sacks of rice to Catanduanes, 50 to Camarines Sur, 25 to Sorsogon, 325 to Albay and 500 family food packs to Libon, Albay. As of January 14, 2011, the amount of resources augmented in Albay, Catanduanes, Sorsogon and Camarines Sur amounted to PhP1,785,531.15
- ❖ DSWD VIII delivered PhP 136,000.00 worth of assistance consisting of 500 family food packs and 500 packs clothing and delivers 10 boxes of mineral water to St. Bernard; provided 30 family packs and 30 packs clothing to the 30 families in Barangays East and West, Baueun, Leyte; allocated 400 family packs and 400 packs of clothing for the flood/landslide victims in the region. PSWD Eastern Samar allocated family food pack and used clothing to Maslog and Jipapad at 500 food packs and 500 packs used clothing in each municipality; SWAD team in Southern Leyte continuously coordinate with the MDRRMC St. Bernard on the status of relief distribution, master listing of evacuees, reporting and monitoring of donated goods received to ensure proper distribution
- ❖ DSWD CARAGA provided relief augmentation in San Francisco, Agusan del Sur in the form of 1,000 family packs worth PhP\_341,030
- ❖ PDRRMC Camarines Sur has standby 7,000 food packs and prepared additional 2,000 food packs as requested by Mayor Sandy Ondis of Siruma
- Rep. Alliah Dimaporo, 1<sup>st</sup> District, Lanao del Norte provided 2,616 family food packs to 665 families in Baroy and Tubod, Lanao del Norte. Food pack contains rice, sardines corned beef, beef loaf and noodles and Non Food Items (NFIs) basin, cooking pots, frying pan, slippers, pail, used clothing, mosquito nets, blankets, plastic mats, water containers
- ❖ AFP Philippine Navy conducted the following: relief operations at Cagraray Island, Bacacay, Albay (650 food packs); and Tabaco City (260 food packs) in support to the Food For Work program for the economically displaced fisherfolk in the area, and participated in the Medical and Dental Mission at the Brgys. Tinapian and Manumbalay, Manito, Albay spearheaded by DOH5 and LGU.
- ❖ NFSL PN transported 250 food packs from DSWD Legazpi City to Rapu-Rapu, Albay for distribution to flood affected residents in the island
- PDRRMC Lanao del Norte and MDRRMCs Baroy, Lala and Tubod and NGOs distributed food and non-food items to 2,584 families amounting to PhP747,260.00: 685 families in Baroy and Tubod received 2,616 food packs from Rep. Imelda Dimaporo of 1st District Lanao del Norte and 655 families received medicines from Rep. Aliah Dimaporo of 2<sup>nd</sup> District. LGUs Oroqueta City and Ozamiz City only provided assistance to those who are in need
- ❖ The LGU & local –populace of Paly Island provided foods and clothing to the survivors of FB Finely
- ❖ OCD IV-B is monitoring the status of the victims and coordinating with DSWD IV-B, WESCOM PDRRMC Palawan

#### **Department of Health (DOH)**

#### Health and WASH

- ❖ The extent of logistical health expenditures provided in various CHDs in Regions IV-B, V, VI, VII, VIII, X, XI and CARAGA amounted to PhP 3,491,891.78
- ❖ DOH-HEMS-OPCEN declared Health Emergency Code White Alert and fully activated to include all field response teams and PHTO-Based Response Teams in CHDs IV-B, V, VI, VII, VIII, X, XI and CARAGA; pre-positioned and augmented assorted medicines, medical supplies, water testing reagents, disinfectants, family kits first aid kits and WATSAN logistics in various CHDs; Respective

- CHDs intensified dissemination of health advisory on water sanitation, leptospirosis and household water disinfection in various evacuation centers through distribution of flyers; Various Provincial Health Teams (PHTs) conducted rapid health assessment and disease surveillance and prevention in all affected regions
- CHD Bicol assisted President Aquino in his visit to various affected areas and in the distribution of 200 Hygiene kits from UNFPA, 150 Family and 100 First Aid Kits from DOH-HEMS in the evacuation centers and the rest was turned over to Gov. Joey Salceda for other municipalities. Based on surveillance conducted by PHO Albay, there were 718 cases reported: 334 cases of upper respiratory tract infection; 58 headache, 53 athlete's foot, 16 fever, 38 asthma, 20 bronchitis, 12 arthritis, 14 UTI, 3 skin disease, 16 wounds, 12 vascular disease, 30 hypertension and 110 acute respiratory infection. Number of pregnant (30) and lactating mother (29). As of 15 January 2011, the top 3 leading cases of morbidity seen in all evacuation camps were cough and colds (52 cases), upper respiratory tract infections (33) and headaches (30)
- CHD VIII provided technical assistance in terms of health emergency management; assisted LGU on health situation assessment in the evacuation camps; and assisted in the daily surveillance activity inside and outside evacuation centers, assisted President Aquino in his visit to affected areas and in the distribution of assorted drugs and medicines worth PhP 35,000 in Samar and Leyte
- ❖ CHD CARAGA assisted President Aquino in His visit to affected areas and augmentation of 3 sets of drugs and medicines worth PhP78,000.00 in Agusan del Sur, Butuan City and Surigao del Sur at PhP26,692.53 per set. The PHTs in CARAGA distributed pre-positioned medicines and fluids to the affected provinces amounting to PhP 763,082.05 broken down as follows: Agusan del Norte (79,685.76); Butuan City (77,461.27); Agusan del Sur (155,614.25); Surigao del Norte (122,549.74); Surigao City (51,758.06); Surigao del Sur (155,525.71; and Dinagat Islands (37,475.50)
- ❖ Zuellig Pharma Corporation donated 19 boxes of medicines to Region V containing Vidaylin Gummies with Garden Vegetables 30's Bio-enhanced Calcium Plus Cap 30's f and UNFPA provided 1,000 Hygiene kits to CHD V worth Php\_840,000 including the transport cost, distributed in Albay for implementation of minimum initial service package for reproductive health of women in crisis in evacuation centers in Albay, with pregnant and lactating women as the target population
- ❖ DOH-CHD5 dispatched medical teams from BRTTH and AFP in Cawayan, Manito with medical supplies from CHD Bicol worth PhP 60,000.00
- ❖ PDRRMC Camarines Sur, through TOG 5 PAF and PA trucks, transported the following resources to Siruma, Camarines Sur in connection with diarrhea cases thereat consisting of 370 boxes summit mineral water; 100 boxes energy drinks; 1,000 food packs, assorted drugs/medicines, and 4 health teams. GMA Kapuso Foundation also provided 1,000 food packs. 30 pcs water jugs, 20 pcs water container, 60 bottles summit mineral water for use of medical team and PA; 1 container unleaded gasoline for generator, 2 units emergency lights, 2 medical tank (oxygen), and antibiotics
- ❖ RD OCD 5 together with DOH HEMS proceeded to Siruma to transport Emergency Medical Team and to set up/man satellite hospital to address the life-threatening condition of about 450 households who are affected by diarrhea in Siruma and received donations from PHAP Cares Foundation Inc.: 132 packs (11 cartons x 12 packs) of J & J Pure Essentials 60g soap pack with Modess (4 soaps + 8 pads)

#### 4. DAMAGES AND NEEDS ASSESSMENT

RDRRMC Team composed of OCD RD V, Task Force Sagip, Commander, RD DOH V, Philippine Navy, AFP and PDRRMC Camarines Sur Personnel proceeded to Camarines Sur via PAF Aircraft to conduct rapid assessment in Siruma and delivered 300 boxes of mineral water and 100 boxes of electrolytes to affected population in Brgy. Butawanan, Siruma.

Another PAF Aircraft is set to ferry DOH 5 Medical Team and emergency medical supplies to Brgy. Butawanan, Siruma, Camarines Sur on 16 January 2011 at 8:00 AM. The team will set-up and man the satellite hospital to address the life-threatening condition of about four hundred fifty (450) households who are affected by diarrhea.

#### **Department of Agriculture (DA)**

- ❖ DA Central Action Center (DACAC) submitted its assessment on agricultural productions. based on the report of its Regional Field Offices in Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao and the NFA distributed 3,824 bags of rice assistance to CARAGA PDRRMCs
- DA VIII prepared a rehabilitation program to provide immediate relief in the form of certified seeds to affected rice farmers
- ❖ DA CARAGA dispatched response team to validate and assess damage areas and provided agricultural assistance (rice seeds) to affected families
- ❖ DA X distributed assistance 296 bags of rice seeds in the following municipalities: Baroy (40), Lala (152), Kapatagan (49) and Tubod (15) all in Lanao del Norte and Bonifacio in Misamis Occidental

#### **Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH)**

- ❖ DPWH, through its Maintenance Engineering Crew in various affected regions, has undertaken the following activities: removal and clearing of debris and rock/slides; installation of barricades and warning signs along the national and secondary roads; de-clogging of culverts/ditches and removal of debris along bridge waterways; and emergency repairs of roads
- DPWH CARAGA conducted immediate repair, installed safety warning signs on damaged road sections for public safety and convenience

#### **Department of Education (DepEd)**

DepEd issued directives to suspend classes in the Elementary and High School in regions adversely affected by flood and landslides

#### **Department of Environmental and Natural Resources (DENR)**

❖ DENR issued a memorandum to all PENROs, CENROSs, EMB and MGB in all regions to monitor landslides and flood prone areas in respective AORs to advise the people to be vigilant

#### **Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG)**

❖ DILG CARAGA reiterated the implementation of Memorandum Circular No. 2010-79 dated August 24, 2010 re: Calamity Response Protocols and Associated Actions to ensure an active local government compliance of said issuance

#### RDRRMCs/PDRRMCs/CDRRMCs

❖ RDRRMCs and local DRRMCs' Chairpersons in Regions IV-B, V, VII, VIII, X, XI, XII, ARMM and CARAGA orchestrated the emergency management in the flood and landslide-stricken areas in terms of search and rescue, evacuation, relief

- operations, conduct of emergency meetings and disseminations of warnings to the public
- Disaster Operations Centers of affected regions maintain 24/7hours monitoring operations and dissemination of warning advisories to RDRRMC member agencies; local Chief Executives (LCEs), local DRRMC Action Officers; and local radio/television stations thru fax, voice, SMS and email

# Effects of Continuous Rains Due to Tail-end of a Cold Front in Regions IV-B, V, VI, VII, VIII, X, XI, XII, CARAGA and ARMM HIGHLIGHTS OF THE PRESIDENT'S VISIT IN THE FOLLOWING REGIONS

As of 19 January 2011, 6:00 PM

On January 14, 2011, His Excellency President Benigno C. Aquino III together with Voltaire Gazmin, National Defense Secretary/Chairperson, NDRRMC; Dinky Soliman, DSWD Secretary; Proceso Alcala, DA Secretary; Enrique Ona, DOH Secretary; Rogelio Singson, Secretary DPWH; Jesus Robredo, DILG Secretary; Edwin Lacierda, Presidential Spokesperson; and USEC Benito Ramos, Executive Director, NDRRMC and Administrator, OCD, visited three (3) regions that were heavily affected by landslides and floods namely: CARAGA, Region V and Region VIII to oversee the extent of damages and personally check the status of the on-going relief operations being conducted by local agencies in the ground.

Upon arrival of the President, respective RDRRMCs in afore-said regions conducted conferences/briefings participated by respective member agencies, selected LGUs and media.

#### **CARAGA**

- Chairperson, RDRRMC CARAGA briefed the President on the effects focused on background, impact, response action, post-disaster requirements and future plans
- ❖ The President commented that post disaster requirements should be prioritized and rehabilitation of damaged infrastructure has to be referred to the DPWH and further emphasized that the national government will do its part in supporting the LGUs but initiatives should be done first at the LGU level; turned over certified rice seeds, water pump engines and assorted medicines to the affected areas through the Chairpersons of the provincial and city DRRMCs
- After the turn-over of resources, media interview followed on the issue of illegal logging

#### Region V

- ❖ PAGASA V reported that La Niña peak is expected to affect the Bicol Region for the next 3 months
- ❖ PDRRMC Catanduanes / MDRRMC Pandan requested for augmentation in the search and rescue operations from PN, TOG5, PCG and PNP for the missing fishermen in Catanduanes who went fishing on 12 midnight 15 January 2011. SAR operation conducted by barangay residents were suspended due to strong waves and winds.
- ❖ The LGUs likewise appealed for support to their rehabilitation and immediate repair of damaged roads; alternative livelihood for economically displaced fishermen from coastal and inland municipalities; food for work programs; and wider coverage of national support for PHILHEALTH beneficiaries
- President Aquino re-assured that the DPWH has already been instructed to prioritize list of infrastructures for immediate repair/rehabilitation using the NCF and that the Administration is looking to provide the immediate needs of affected communities to include livelihood support like cash-for-work programs

#### **Region VIII**

- The President directed concerned agencies to assist /help Saint Bernard in the acquisition of lot for relocation sites
- RDRRMC/OCD Region VIII to ensure that LGUs must strictly observe the stockpiling procedure of basic necessities of the evacuees
- RDRRMC report must show and or project the total clear picture of the region based on the reported data

#### Region IV-B

- OCD IV-B is monitoring the activities of PDRRMC Palawan City, MDRRMCs concerned, Philippine Red Cross, WESCOM, Coast Guard Palawan and Nickel Mining Corporation in terms of distribution of relief goods/packs in the evacuation centers
- ❖ LGUs of Narra, Aborlan and Roxas , Palawan provided hot meals to affected families inside evacuation centers

#### Region V

- ❖ RDRRMC Region V conducted coordinating conference during the visit of His Excellency President Benigno C. Aquino III in Legaspi City on 14 January 2011
- ❖ RDRRMC V conducted Press Conference with C, Albay PDRRMC, PAF TOG5 Group Commander and Media in connection with Search and Rescue (SAR) operations in Catanduanes
- ❖ OCD-RD V provided daily media interview re preparations of the new weather disturbance; conducted consultation meeting with PAGASA and PDRRMCs Albay, Camarines Sur and Sorsogon; conducted relief operations in Brgys Tinapian and Cawayan, Manito, Albay in coordination with Governor Salceda of Albay, AFP Commander, 9ID, BGEN Marilou Salazar AFP; TF Sagip and 901IBde Commander, NAVFORSOL, PDRRMC Albay Staff National and Local Media; and proceeded to Catanduanes on January 11, 2011 to meet with C,PDRRMC Catanduanes to oversee SAR operations for the missing fishermen
- ❖ DepEd V ordered the suspension of classes in Elementary and High School levels in Legaspi City, Manito, Daraga, Camalig, Sto. Domingo, Malilipot and Bacacay both in public and private; coordinate with local school officials of DepEd in their area of responsibility; and advised Chairpersons, City/MDRRMC to properly implement Advisory No. 8 re suspension of classes
- ❖ PDRRMC Catanduanes is continuously monitoring SAR efforts in Panganiban, Catanduanes for the 5 missing fishermen assisted by NAVFORSOL and TOG 5 air assets and requested intervention for economically displaced households
- ❖ LGUs of Manito, Sto Domingo, Camalig and Malilipot, Albay effected a pre-emptive evacuation as part of its disaster preparedness and response activities in areas prone to floods, landslides and lahar flows. The families were provided with 5 kls of rice. Expanded assistance in terms of food for work packages to 41,121 economically displaced households, especially fisherfolks and coastal families and established clinic station per evacuation and free hospitalization for affected families. Mayor Volante of Malilipot, Albay distributed relief goods sponsored by Vice President Jejomar Binay to the 200 families in Brgy San Jose, Malilipot, Albay
- ❖ PDRRMC Camarines Sur issued Advisory on possible implementation of preemptive evacuation in the province in anticipation of possible flooding and landslides in 26 municipalities and prepared 2,000 food packs for distribution in Siruma and has stockpile of 2,000 sacks of rice
- PDRRMC Sorsogon initiated pre-emptive evacuation of population at risks, provided meals and other relief goods to affected families and declared Juban under a State of Calamity

- PDRRMC Chairmen Catanduanes and Camarines Norte requested RDRRMC for air support to augment local SAR efforts
- PGG 5 will assist PCG in validating information regarding missing fishermen, PCG SOG assets is prepositioned in Camarines Norte to augment local SAR
- ❖ NAVFORSOL will deploy DRRU team in Camrines Norte to assist in SAR and set-up ACP in Daet airport
- ❖ PRO V conducted continuous monitoring relative to the prevailing weather situation in AOR and placed on alert sixty (60) Regional Public Safety Battalion (5RPSB) personnel for possible deployment to landslide and flashflood areas in the provinces of Albay, Sorsogon and Camarines Sur.

#### **Region VI (Final Report)**

PDRRMC Negros Occidental and LGUs of Silay City, Talisay City, Victoria City, EB Magalona have provided assorted relief goods to the affected families: 755 bags of rice, 23 boxes noodles 75 boxes sardines and 774 family packs

- ❖ PDRRMCs Surigao del Norte, Surigao del Sur, Dinagat Islands and Agusan del Sur and CDRRMCs Surigao City and Butuan City convened and discussed updates on effects of flooding and landslides in preparation for the projected increase of rainfall in the next succeeding days and preventive measures undertaken
- ❖ LGUs CARAGA efficiently utilized their own resources to undertake pre-emptive evacuation, SAR, relief and medical assistance to affected population
