1. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

a) Flooding in CARAGA

- Lake Mainit in Surigao del Sur overflowed on 22 February 2011 due to continuous rains. As a result, flooding occurred at the national highway across Agusan-Surigao area particularly Tubay, Santiago, Jabonga and Kitcharao areas
- ❖ Some barangays in Agusan del Norte and Agusan del Sur are now underwater and rice fields in Carmen, Agusan del Norte are also underwater
- ❖ Flights of Cebu Pacific and Philippine Airlines were cancelled on 22 February due to inclement weather

b) Strong Winds/Big Waves in Sultan Kudarat Region XII

- ❖ A total of 115 families were affected in Kalamansig, Sultan Kudarat due to strong winds and big waves which occurred on or about 1:30 AM, 22 February 2011
- ❖ Thirty seven (37) houses were damaged: 19 totally and 18 partially.
- c) Flashflood in Misamis Oriental Region X on Feb 22, 2011 (Final Report)
 - ❖ A flashflood which occurred on February 22, 2011 affected 64 families /304 persons in Brgy Cabug, Medina and Brgy Dampi, Lagonglong with 14 families /54 persons evacuated to the Bgry Hall
 - ❖ Five (5) houses were totally damaged in Brgy Cabug amounting to PhP100,000.00
 - ❖ A bridge along Sitio Mahayahay in Brgy Cabug was also damaged amounting to PhP20,000,000.00
- d) Fire Incident in Novaliches, Quezon City
 - ❖ A fire incident of still undetermined cause and involving a residential houses, occurred 23 Feb 2011 at 12:11H at 109 Trinidad Street, Brgy Gulod, Novaliches, Quezon City

- ❖ More or less 25 houses were burned with 30 families affected and the estimated cost of damages to infrastructure is still undetermined
- ❖ One (1) fire volunteer identified as Glenn Mondragon and one (1) civilian identified as Jenelyn Mabatog were reported injured

2. ACTIONS TAKEN

CARAGA

❖ RDRRMC issued and disseminated warning to LGUs, RDRRMC member agencies and broadcast media; alerted residents living in low-lying and landslide prone areas for any possible flooding and landslides; advised motorists to exercise caution on the road; and avoid crossing flooded causeways and roadways

NCR

- ❖ The Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP) in Quezon City and other BFP firefighters have responded to the fire scene
- ❖ BFP Quezon City is still conducting investigation to determine the extent of damages on infrastructure

Region X

- ❖ Evacuees have returned home after the floodwater subsided on Feb 22, 2011
- ❖ Response units and standby vehicles of MDRRMCs Lagonglong and Medina are still on alert status due to bad weather in the area
- ❖ Upon request of the Administrator of Lagonglong, OCD RC X warned the residents in Brgys Manaol, Lumbao, Cambulawan, Dampil and Poblacion thru radio stations to initiate pre emptive evacuation in case heavy rains persist for safety purposes

Region XII

MDRRMC Kalamansig facilitated the evacuation of affected families to the Municipal Public Market in said municipality as temporary shelter and provided relief assistance to the 115 families /evacuees
