#### I. Situation Overview

- A. Landslide Incidents in Valencia City, Bukidnon
  - Four (4) landslide incidents occurred at Sitio Hangaron, Lumbayao, Valencia City, Bukidnon Province due to continuous heavy rains
    - Ist 9:00 PM, 3 July 2011 rendered the roads going to San Fernando and Valencia City impassable to traffic
    - 2<sup>nd</sup> 8:45 AM 4 July 2011 major incident
    - 3rd 3:40 PM 4 July 2011 minor incident, rescue teams retrieved 3 dead
    - 4th 3:40 PM 4 July 2011 intermittent landslide was going on due to gushing water from the upper portion of the area
  - July 4, 2011 at 8:00 AM, another landslide occurred in Purok 11, Villa San Vicente, Brgy Tongan Tongan, Valencia City, Bukidnon

#### Casualties

- Dead: 5 Three (3) died in Brgy Lumbayao, Valencia City namely: Sheryl Arnusa Sadsad of Little Baguio, San Fernando, Segundina S. Lagunay and Marites S. Lagunay of Medina, Misamis Oriental.
  - Two (2) children, identified as Joy Colamar, 7 yrs old and Roque Santillan, 6 yrs old all of Purok 11, Brgy Tongan -Tongan, Valencia City
- Injured: 3 Reynante Sadsad (confined at San Fernando, Provincial) Hospital; Manolito Castro; and Bienvenido Castro Jr all of Brgy Little Baguio, San Fernando, Bukidnon
- Missing: 8 still unidentified

#### **Actions Taken**

PDRRMC Bukidnon and CDRRMC Valencia City Emergency Responders and Rescue Teams have immediately responded to the incidents.

- The DANA team conducted damage and needs assessment to determine the extent of damages.
- OCD RD Carmelito A. Lupo with Bukidnon Provincial Coordinator Visminda Y. Cordero conducted ocular inspection together PAGASA and MGB representatives, CDRRMC Chairman and LDRRMO Officers.
- ❖ Mayor Leonardo Jose Catarata of Valencia City and the rescue teams decided to call off the search and rescue operations on July 4 at 6:25 PM due to heavy rains. Search and retrieval operations resumes today
- ❖ The 8<sup>th</sup> IB , AFP and PNP elements have responded and assisted in the conduct of rescue operations
- City Disaster Management Office in Valencia City requested for additional Payloader from Del Monte Philippines Inc to augment in the clearing operations

#### Needs

Additional heavy equipments such as bulldozer, grader, and payloader are needed for clearing operations

#### B. Flashflood in Gen. Santos City

- On or about 5:30PM, 03 July 2011, a flashflood occured in Gen. Santos City due to heavy rains
- ❖ Four (4) Barangays were affected namely: Brgy Dadiangas North; Johnny Ang Paradise, Brgy City Heights; Brgy Labangal; and Fatima, Kasilac, Brgy. Dadiangas West with 165 families / 866 persons affected
- Out of the total affected, 115 families / 599 persons were evacuated to Gen. Santos City Covered Court and Labangal Gymnasium

#### Casualties

Two (2) persons, identified as Rex Balandan, 23 yrs old and Lito Paybar, 28 yrs old, were carried away by strong current of water but were rescued and brought to Gen. Santos Hospital for medical treatment

#### **Actions Taken**

- CDRRMC Gen. Santos City conducted damage and needs assessment in the affected areas; provided food and shelter assistance and medical check up to the evacuees; and provided relief assistance to the two (2) survivors who were carried away by flood water
- City Engineer's Office of Gen. Santos spearheaded the re-chanelling of the flow of water at Silway River and Makar River Puting Bato, Brgy. Calumpang
