I. EFFECTS

Typhoon “Pedring” entered PAR on September 24, 2011 and moved out of the country on 28 September 2011 and left in its wake the following effects:

A. POPULATION AFFECTED, EVACUATED AND SERVED (Tab A)

Total number of population affected in **3,252 barangays / 300 municipalities / 41 cities** in the **34 provinces of Regions I, II, III, IV-A, IV-B, V, VI, CAR and NCR** is: **582,626 families / 2,725,023 persons**. Around **80,889 families / 362,552 persons** are currently served both inside and outside evacuation centers:

C. DAMAGES TO PROPERTIES (Tab C)

Initial cost of damages to properties amounted to **PhP8,803,560,093.43**, broken down as follows:

Infrastructures (school buildings/road/bridges/others) - PhP1,249,264,897.81
Agriculture (crops, livestock, HVCC and Fisheries) - PhP7,554,295,195.62

- **NCR** – Quirino Memorial Medical Center (collapsed wall in parking lot), San Lorenzo Ruiz Women’s Hospital (flooded first floor), Ospital ng Maynila ground floor, flooded) and National Center for Mental Health (roof damaged)
- **Region II** – Southern Isabela General Hospital roofs of Billing sections and Office removed

- **Region III** - RHU I of Paombong (roof damaged), Calumpit District Hospital (flooded) and Hagonoy District Hospital (flooded and **non functional**)

Collapsed Dikes and Creeks in Pampanqa - Brgy. Mandili Dike, Brgy. Barangca Dike in Candaba, Matubig Creek, San Jose Dayat Creek, San Juan Gandara, San Agustin Sapang Maragol in Guagua earthdike - (breached) and Brgy. Gatud and Dampe earthdike in Floridablanca - collapsed; slope protection in Brgy. San Pedro Purok 1 (100 m); slope protection in Brgy. Benedicto Purok 1 (300 m); Slope protection in Brgy. Valdez along Gumain River (200 M); and Brgy. Solib Purok 6, Porac River and River dike in Sto. Cristo, Sta. Rosa, Sta. Rita and Sta. Catalina, Lubao, Pampanga

D. DAMAGED HOUSES (Tab D)

A total of **43,032 houses** were damaged in Regions I, II, III, IV-A, IV-B, V, and CAR (**6,125 totally and 36,907 partially**)

E. STATUS OF LIFELINES:

1. ROADS AND BRIDGES CONDITION (Tab E)

A total of **68 bridges/road sections** were reported impassable in Regions I (4), II (31), Region III (18) and CAR (15)

F. STATUS OF DAMS (As of 4:00 PM, 02 October 2011)

The following dams opened their respective gates as the water levels have reached their spilling levels - Ambuklao (4 Gates / 2 m); Binga (2 Gates / 2 m); Magat (5 Gates / 5 m); and San Roque (2 Gates / 1 m).

G. EMERGENCY INCIDENTS MONITORED (Tab F)

A total of **108** emergency incidents occurred in various regions affected by the typhoon.

II. EMERGENCY RESPONSE MANAGEMENT

The government, through the NDRRMC Member-Agencies, continues its relief and recovery efforts complemented with their respective counterparts in the affected regions.

COORDINATION MEETINGS

The NDRRMC convened at around 10:00 AM of 27 September 2011 that was presided over by the SND and Chairperson, NDRRMC attended by all Member-agencies. The Executive Secretary instructed the NDRRMC member agencies to expedite relief and recovery efforts as well as the rehabilitation of the damages to properties incurred from Typhoon "Pedring"

Another NDRRMC Meeting was held at 4:00 PM (27 September 2011) to further discuss the effects of Typhoon "Pedring" and the appropriate actions to be undertaken by each member agencies.

NDRRMC issued Memo for Chairpersons, RDRRMCs I, II, IV-A, IV-B, V, VI, CAR and NCR on the Needs Assessment Guidance on Typhoons "Pedring" and "Quiel" in order to complement and sustain disaster response in terms of humanitarian assistance and recovery efforts

NDRRMC convened with His Excellency President Benigno Simeon C. Aquino III yesterday, 02 October 2011 at the NDRRMC Conference Room, Camp General Aguinaldo presided by Secretary, DND and Chairperson, NDRRMC Voltaire Gazmin and attended by NDRRMC Member Agencies.

RESPONSE ACCOMPLISHMENTS PER CLUSTER

FOOD AND NON-FOOD ITEMS (Tab G)

To date, the government had so far provided **PhP64,875,781.54** worth of relief assistance in terms of food and non-food items to the affected population in various affected regions out of the combined resources from the DSWD, LGUs, DOH and NGOs. Breakdown is as follows:

San Miguel Corporation donated 1,700 cases of bottled water (Pure Water 355 ML. PET Pineapple 355 ML and PET Lemon 355 ML) on September 29, 2011. The said products were subsequently distributed to the affected areas of Regions III, IV-A and NCR.

HEALTH AND WASH

To date, PhP3,681,420.13 worth of logistics (drugs and medicines) have been provided by DOH-HEMS as augmentation support to the CHDs in Regions I, II, III, IV-A, IV-B, V, CAR, and NCR and were distributed to their respective provinces; sub-allotted PhP500,000.00 each to CHD II and III; organized Technical Assistance to conduct Rapid Assessment; and organized Medical Teams from different Metro Manila Hospitals to render medical Mission in Region III. **DOH-HEMS** Team offered technical assistance and medical services to the PDRRMC Bulacan by providing 5 medical teams at the identified evacuation centers; and organized advanced medical post at Bulacan Medical Center. **Five (5) medical teams of CHD III provided medical consultations in five (5) evacuation centers, namely: Bulacan Capitol Gym, Bulacan Sports Complex, San Marcos NHS, San Marcos Elementary School, and San Pedro Elementary School.** **MMDA in collaboration with Maynilad and Manila Water provided mobile water treatment plant with tanker and 2 water purifier at Calumpit, Bulacan.** Said water treatment plant is situated along McArthur Highway between United Pulp and Junction leading to NLEX Pulilan, Bulacan. **Manila Water team proceeded to the Provincial Capitol with 3,000 “baso water”**

SEARCH AND RESCUE, RETRIEVAL AND EVACUATION OPERATIONS

Details of SAR Assets Deployed by AFP, PCG, PNP, BFP, PRC, MMDA, Volunteer Groups (Tab H)

SAR operations in various affected regions were effected through the concerted efforts of AFP, BFP, PNP, PCG, MMDA, and Volunteer Groups through deployment of resources (SAR assets) to the flooded areas in Regions I, II, III, IV-A, IV-B, CAR and NCR.

SUMMARY OF DEPLOYMENT

AFP DRO Assets deployed in NOLCOM AOR - 1,504 personnel (73 Officer and 1,431 EPs) with 153 assorted units of equipment.

PNP assets mobilized for SAR in Bulacan and Tarlac - 1,517 personnel, 26 rubber boats and 281 vehicles

Camp Crame PNP deployed the Maritime, SAF and other various teams to intensify SAR operations in the flooded areas; **PCG-CGDNCR-CL 1** assisted approximately 200 persons in Caniogan and Sakol in Calumpit, Bulacan and rescued/assisted approximately 40 persons in Brgys Gatboca, Francis Putol, and Francis Proper, also in Bulacan; **CGDNCR-CL 4** picked up 5,000 cans of sardines from Brgy Sta Cruz Floodway Control and distributed them to San Isidro utilizing two (2) rubber boats in San Luis, Pampanga; and **CGDNCR-CL 7** rescued 15 persons in Brgy. Paombong, Hagonoy, Bulacan. **RD-PRO 3 with 77 SAR elements of 57 RPSB3 and 20 augmentation from RPSB4-A with 8 rescue trucks proceeded to Calumpit, Bulacan to conduct SAR operations.** ABS-CBN rescue and Marikina rescue teams proceeded to Malolos City to augment and assist in the rescue and evacuation operations in the province of Bulacan. Rotary District 3800, Makati City and Pasig City rescue teams proceeded to Bulacan to assist in the rescue operations. QC-DPOS will proceed to Bulacan to assist in the rescue operations. The 1st, 2nd, and 3rd CDAG rescue teams proceeded to Hagonoy, Bulacan; Apalit, Pampanga; and Calumpit, Bulacan, respectively.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) Central Office directed all its District Engineering maintenance crew to conduct immediate clearing operations at the landslide-stricken areas and the immediate repair of damaged roads and bridges in all affected areas; **DPWH CAR** facilitated massive clearing operations and assured that all major roads will be opened soon; **DPWH III** installed warning signs to the eroded shoulder and collapsed retaining wall along Brgy Piut, Carrangalan, Nueva Ecija; and **DPWH V** deployed one (1) truck with three (3) personnel to Malinao, Albay. **DPWH III Maintenance Engineer based in Carranglan, Nueva Ecija conducted clearing operations along the landslide portion at Brgy. Putlan, Carranglan, Nueva Ecija.**

EDUCATION

Department of Education (DepEd) reported that **76** schools (13 in NCR, 3 in CAR, 5 in Region I, 8 in Region II, 5 in Region III, 5 in Region IV-A, and 37 in Region V) in 17 Divisions are being utilized as evacuation centers with 3,484 families / 8,354 individuals. **DepEd DRRMO Operation Center reported that 295 school buildings were damaged with estimated cost pegged at PhP136.8 Million.**

POWER RESTORATION

NGCP and Meralco service crews continue to work round-the-clock until power to the last circuit affected by Typhoon "Pedring" will be restored; further assures that they are doing their best to be able to restore power the soonest possible time and advised affected customers to get in touch with Company's Call Center at Tel. No. 16211 for queries regarding the status of restoration work in their respective areas. **Santiago-Cordon segment was restored on 01 October 2011 at 4:16 PM. Two (2) line gangs have been assigned to inspect and assess the Cordon-Aglipay segment which remains de-energized.**

INFORMATION DISSEMINATION

Philippine Information Agency (PIA) continuously disseminates all news reports from NDRRMC to all PIA Regional/Provincial Offices nationwide and media organizations for further dissemination to the general public.

INITIATIVES OF OTHER AGENCIES

DILG intensified coordination with RDRRMCs concerned and its member agencies for data validation on the reported casualties and other incidents related to TY “Pedring”; LGUs in 5 provinces in Region II and affected cities and municipalities in NCR are still conducting damage and needs assessment, deploying manpower with SAR equipment for the conduct of SAR operations and clearing operations at the landslide areas/flood stricken-areas, evacuating families to safe areas, and providing relief services.

Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) Region I conducted inventory of supply of basic commodities in to ensure stable prices of basic commodities.

Civil Defense Action Group (CDAG) proceeded to Bulacan with 1 ambulance, 1 mini rescue van, 1 rubber boat and 1 ambulance to support the ongoing SAR efforts.

Philippine Red Cross (PRC) deployed 11 Water Search and Rescue team to Bulacan to intensify ongoing SAR and relief operations; amphibian to Ospital ng Maynila to evacuate patients; deployed rescue van to rescue families trapped in collapsed structures; transported 100 units of blood from Ospital ng Maynila to PRC National Blood Center for safekeeping; will serve 25,000 families with food items from funds extended by the International Red Cross; and served 7,500 families with food and non-food items (2 blankets, 2 mosquito nets, 2 mats, and 1 (20L) jerry can.

Local DRRAACs Response Efforts on SAR, Evacuation and Relief Operations

RDRRMC / OCD I

Dagupan City

Implemented pre-emptive evacuation in 3 barangays (Bonuan-Guesset, Pantal and Herrero-Perez) threatened by storm surge; conducted medical check-ups for evacuees in partnership with CHO.

RDRRMC/OCD II

Conducted rescue operations of 283 persons in Brgys Bassit, San Guillermo, Allinguigan 2nd, Capitol Hills, Alibagu, of Ilagan and Moldero Tumauini, all in Isabela, in coordination with LDRRMCs Ilagan and Cauayan I/PPSC, TOG2, WASAR-PRC.

RDRRMC/OCD III

RD, RDRRMC/OCD-3 conducted inspection at the flooded areas in Calumpit, Bulacan; delivered 50 boxes of bottled water, 80 boxes of corned beef, 70 boxes of luncheon meat, and 50 boxes of Ulam King; facilitated the request of different LGUs for relief assistance thru DSWD, SAR Teams and rubber boats to the flooded areas in the region; conducted an aerial reconnaissance over the flooded areas in the municipalities of Jaen, Cabiao and San Antonio, Nueva Ecija, in Arayat, Candaba, San Simon and San Fernando City, Pampanga and Calumpit, Bulacan; facilitated the request for heavy equipment needed for clearing operations in Nueva Ecija; coordinated with Chief NDRRMC OpCen for the request of choppers to be used in rescue operations and teamed up with Palayan Rescue Team; distributed 200 boxes of bottled water from NDRRMC to Bulacan.

COMNOLCOM, RD PRO3 and PDRRMC Tarlac provides augmentation support to the ongoing rescue operations in Bulacan.

Olongapo City

CDRRMC Olongapo led in the conduct of rescue, relief and clearing operations; currently conducts SAR operation for the victims of the trashslide at the New Cabalan landfill in Olongapo in coordination with Olongapo Rescue Team, 24th IB, PA, PNP Barangay Rescue and ESMO; conducted SAR operation in Bulacan thru SBMA Rescue Team with 9 personnel and 2 rubber boats.

RDRRMC/OCD IV-A

RDRRMC OCD IV-A Chairperson with DSWD-IV-A QRT conducted ocular survey in San Mateo and Rodriguez, Rizal; coordinated with PRO-IV-A on the provision of additional rescue teams with rubber boats and equipment to augment the DRO in said areas.

Antipolo City

CDRRMC Antipolo City deployed their Search and Rescue Team composed of 15 personnel and 1 rubber boat to Calumpit, Bulacan

RDRRMC/OCD-V

On 27 and 28 of September 2011, RDRRMC V convened for an emergency meeting at the OCD V conference room, attended by C, PDRRMC Albay, DSWD, DPWH, DOH, PCGDB, AFP, DILG and PAGASA.

RDRRMC/OCD VI

The local DRRMC of Negros Occidental provided PhP1,500.00 to the owners of partially damaged houses and PhP3,000.00 to owners of totally damaged houses; provided 66 family food packs to the affected families; PDRRMC Negros Occidental extended 5 sacks of rice while the MDRRMC Anini-y and BDRRMC Mabuyong in Antique provided relief assistance to the evacuees

MMDRRMC/OCD-NCR

MMDA and LGUs concerned are conducting clearing and SAR in their respective AOR.

Makati City and Pasig City deployed their Search and Rescue Teams to areas affected in Bulacan to support the ongoing evacuation, relief, search, rescue, and retrieval operations.

Metro Manila Development Authority (MMDA) deployed 2 teams, equipped with 1 dumptruck, 3RB, 2 OBM, 1 Gen Set, and life vests to Calumpit, Bulacan.

RDRRMC/OCD-CAR

LDRRMCs evacuated 167 families / 735 persons in Ifugao, Mt. Province and Benguet and conducted damage and needs assessment.

Mt. Province

Local DRRMC conducted damage and needs assessment particularly on infrastructure and agriculture sectors where most damages have been incurred; simultaneous clearing operations of DPWH-PEO and MEOs of affected areas are ongoing.
