### **A. Fire Incident in Taguig City**

#### **Situation Overview**

- On or about 0615H, 4 April 2012, a fire incident involving a residential area occurred in Dinggin Bayan, Ibayo Tipas, Taguig City. The owner of the area, cause of fire, and damages are still under investigation. There were no reported casualties.

#### **Actions Taken:**

- BFP Taguig and other fire volunteers responded to the incident
- OCD-NCR is continuously monitoring the situation

### **B. Fire Incident in Mandaluyong City**

#### **Situation Overview**

- On or about 2204H, 02 April 2012, a fire occurred at B38 Martinez St., Brgy. Addition Hills, Mandaluyong City involving a residential area. The fire reached the 5<sup>th</sup> alarm at 2220H and was declared out at 2312H. An estimated of 10 houses with 15 families were affected. Cause of fire is still under investigation. There was one dead (Daniela Sales-Lascoña, 1 y/o) and 2 injured persons (Ben Erick Diaz, 1 y/o; Arnel Nuñez, 30y/o). Estimated damages was P 500,000.00.

#### **Actions Taken:**

- BFP Mandaluyong, Mandaluyong LDRRMO, nearby city fire fighters, and other fire volunteers immediately responded to the area
- OCD-NCR coordinated with Mandaluyong LDRRMO for the status of the fire victims
- OCD-NCR coordinated with Fire District 4 for the spot report
- Affected families were temporarily sheltered at the B38 covered court
- Food and medical assistance were given by the DSWD

### **C. Oil Spill in Misamis Oriental**

#### **Situation Overview**

- On or about 3:00 AM 3 April 2012, an oil spill occurred in the Petron Depot, Brgy Casinglot, Tagoloan, Misamis Oriental.
- Petron personnel, while conducting product transfer operations, did not notice that the valve going to the canal was slightly opened, consequently spilling gasoline to the nearby mangrove area. The valve was immediately closed upon discovery.



- An equivalent of approximately five (5) drums of gasoline were spilled in the area
- MDRRMC Tagoloan through its DRRM Officer reported that an estimated of 20 families with 146 individuals residing within the vicinity were affected by a strong foul odor emitted by the gasoline along the creek line

**Actions Taken:**

- CGDNM proceeded to the area to clean up and recover the spilled gasoline at 8:15 AM 3 April 2012 and warned nearby residents not to use open flame for the time being. The team completed the cleanup at 2:45 PM 3 April 2012
- PETRON Emergency Response Team with the assistance of PNP Tagoloan, PHIVIDEC Fire Department and some residents living within the vicinity installed a wooden barrier and improvised dike at the creek junction suppressing the spill from further flowing to Alae River towards the sea
- OCD-X in coordination with MDRRMC Tagoloan conducted ocular inspection of the area
- EMB Dir Abubakar surveyed the area and took water samples from the creek, river, and sea to determine the extent of contamination and pollution brought by the oil spill
- MDRRMC Tagoloan with BDRRMC Casinglot extended assistance to the responding teams of PETRON, augmenting contingents from PNP Tagoloan with the Fire Dept. Of PHIVIDEC including manpower complement from the Barangay
- Petron Management with CGDNM informed and warned the residents within the vicinity of the affected area not to use open flame, not to smoke, and not to cook
- Petron Management in coordination with the Punong Barangay provided food packs to the affected residents

**Other Information:**

- An Inspection/Apprehension Report (IAR) was issued to Petron-Tagoloan for spilling gasoline and for failure to notify the CGDNM of the incident. The Depot Superintendent is ordered to appear before the IAR officer within ten (10) days from receipt of IAR

**D. Fire Incident in Brgy. San Andres, Cainta, Rizal**

**Situation Overview**

- On or about 1324H, 03 April 2012, a fire occurred at Chico, Macopa, and Atis Streets Buklod Maralita West Floodway, Brgy. San Andres, Cainta, Rizal. The fire reached the 2<sup>nd</sup> alarm, was under control at 1348H and declared out at 1355H.
- More or less fifty-four (54) families were affected by the incident; thirty-one (31) were evacuated to Anak Pawis II covered court, others stayed in their areas while some stayed with their relatives, thirty-two (32) houses were totally damaged with an estimated cost of PhP 200,000.00

**Actions Taken:**

- Cainta MSWD provided initial assistance of cooked food and non-food for the affected families
- OCD/RDRRMC IV-A is continuously coordinating with BFP Cainta, PDRRMO Rizal, and MDRRMO Cainta regarding the incident
- Six (6) fire trucks from Cainta Fire Station, twenty one (21) from Pasig, five (5) from Taytay, two (2) from Marikina, one (1) from BFP Angono, five (5) from other Barangays, and seven (7) from other volunteers responded to the said incident
