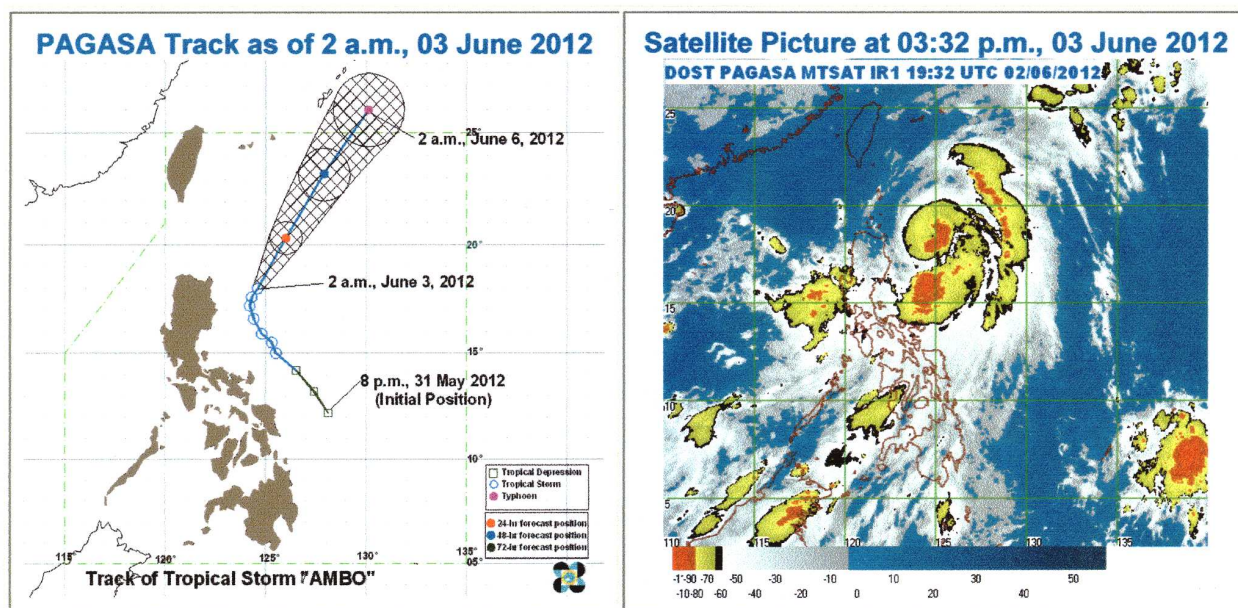

#### **I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:**

**Severe Weather Bulletin No. 10 re Tropical Storm "AMBO" (MAWAR) issued at 5:00 AM, 03 June 2012**



**Tropical Storm "AMBO" has maintained its strength as it moves north northeastward.**

<b>PUBLIC STORM WARNING SIGNAL</b>

- Residents in low lying and mountainous areas under Public Storm Warning Signal # 1 are alerted against possible flashfloods and landslides.
- Estimated rainfall amount is from **15 - 25** mm per hour (heavy) within the **400** km diameter of the Tropical Storm.
- TS "AMBO" is expected to enhance the Southwest Monsoon that will bring rains over Central and Southern Luzon and Visayas.
- Fishing boats and other small seacrafts are advised not to venture out into the seaboards of Southern Luzon and Visayas and the Eastern seaboards of Northern and Central Luzon due to the combined effect of TS "AMBO" and the southwest monsoon**

### IV. RESPONSE/ EMERGENCY OPERATIONS

#### A. Region IV-A

##### 1. COLLAPSED Foundation of a Bridge (under construction)

- San Mateo DRRMO conducted SAR Operations

##### 2. DROWNING Incident in Cainta, Rizal

- Cainta DRRMO conducted SAR Operations

##### 3. ERODED DWPH Rip-rap

- CDRRMO Antipolo visited the site to assess the damage and alerted DPWH for immediate repairs
- OCD-RDRRMC IV-A is continuously coordinating with DPWH Region IV-A and DEO, CDRRMO-Antipolo, PDRRMO-Rizal for updates and proper action

#### B. Region IV-B

##### 1. MONGPONG BRIDGE

- PDRRMO Occidental Mindoro installed early warning signs and devices on both approaches to caution commuters and diverted traffic flow to a detour

##### 2. MISSING MBNCA "BRANDO" with 1 passenger

- Coast Guard Romblon directed all other nearby detachments and advised all ships/ watercrafts and local populace transiting in the area to be on the look-out and provide assistance if missing motorbanca is sighted
- Coast Guard Southern Tagalog had been notified and alerted for possible SAR Operations

#### C. Region V

##### 1. 3 MISSING FISHERMEN

- a. Local WASAR alerted and will commence with SAR Operations when weather improves

**2. MISSING FB CRISMAR with 30 passengers**

- a. PDRPMC Catanduanes informed all coastal Barangays to be on the look-out and alert for possible sightings of the missing vessel and provide assistance
- b. PCG and PNP rescue teams deployed for search and rescue operations
- c. SAR team organized by the barangay officials from Viga and Gigmoto rescued the fishermen

**D. CAR**

**1. VEHICULAR ACCIDENT along Poblacion, Natonin Mt. Province**

- a. Natonin Municipal Police Station and Civilian volunteers responded to the accident and brought the victims to Natonin Municipal Hospital

**NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS**

**A. NDRRMC**

- Disseminated NDRRMC Advisories on Severe Weather Bulletins; and Flood Advisories to all regions affected through SMS and facsimile, uploaded the same at the NDRRMC Website, Facebook, and Twitter accounts for further dissemination to their respective local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their respective areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying and mountainous areas if situation warrants
- NDRRMC–OPCEN was activated effective 8:00 AM, 01 June 2012 under “Blue Alert” status in view of the entry of Tropical Depression “AMBO” in the Philippine Area of Responsibility.
- PAGASA advised the Binga FFWS Dam Office re Commencement of Preparatory Phase of Flood Warning Operation for the Agno River and Magat FFWS Dam Office for the Magat River dated 01 June 2012 at 9:00 AM and 11:30 AM respectively. NDRRMC OPCEN disseminated to OCD Regions I and II for precautionary measures.
- PAGASA likewise issued Notice of Dam Discharge Warning Operation of Binga Dam Warning No. 01 dated 01 June 2012, 11:35 AM which was disseminated to RDRRMC/OCD CAR for precautionary measures.

**B. MEMBER AGENCIES**

- **PAGASA** is continuously providing NDRRMC OPCEN with General Flood Bulletins; Severe Weather Bulletins on Tropical Storm “AMBO”.
- **PCG–CGD** directed DRG Team of CGDBCL Stations/Detachments on standby alert for possible deployment; implemented the HPCG Memo Cir 01-09 and compliance with HPCG Memo Cir 03-01; and observed the PCG SOP 002-09. (Guidelines on Movement of Vessels: during heavy weather; in the absence of weather bulletin in the locality; and PCG alert levels, respectively); Continue to provide NDRRMC with updates and status of strandeers
- **AFP 9ID, PA** directed on standby alert the following: DRUs of 901BDE in Albay and Catanduanes and 903BDE in Masbate and Sorsogon; three (3) DRTUs, six (6) M35 trucks and six (6) KM450 of 902BDE in Camarines Norte and Camarines Sur; two (2) DRRU Teams of NAVFORSOL and one (1) DRT Team of TOG5, PAF; **Issued a Memorandum to COMSOLCOM, COMNOLCOM and COMNCRCOM especially to areas expected to be greatly affected by the current weather disturbance (Cagayan, Catanduanes, CAMSUR, CAMNORTE, Polilio Island, Aurora and Isabela) to alert their respective DRTGs/ DRTUs**
- **DSWD Field Offices along typhoon path were alerted and advised to closely monitor the situation particularly the known flashflood/ landslide areas for reports on any eventualities and also the status of their standby funds and stockpile; SWAD Teams are also on alert status to monitor the effects**

**brought by TS AMBO; Prepositioned P1.49M standby funds and P9.16M worth of relief supplies in Field Offices (FOs) II, III, and V**

## **REGIONAL PREPAREDNESS**

### **A. NCR**

- OCD-NCR disseminated Severe Weather Bulletin No.1 and 2 to the MMDRRMCs and Regional Offices thru SMS and facsimile; advised members of MMDRRMC, LDRRMCs, Civil Defense Action Group (CDAG and Outdoor Advertising Association of the Philippines (OAAP) to undertake precautionary measures in their respective area of responsibility (AOR), preposition their assets in strategic areas, initiate pre-emptive evacuation of their constituents in the low-lying areas, submit their respective action plan for TD “AMBO”, and advised OAAP to roll down all their billboard/tarpaulins in areas that maybe affected by strong winds and gustiness; continues to monitor the situation in Metro Manila particularly the water levels of dams and status/ amount of rainfall; disseminates NDRRMC weather advisories to MDRRMCs and LDRRMCs thru SMS and facsimile for action and proper precautionary measures

### **B. REGION I**

- **RDRRMC/ OCDRC I activated their respective OPCENs at the regional and provincial levels for timely and continuous dissemination of NDRRMC advisories to all concerned local DRRMCs, RDRRMC member-agencies, and tri-media thru facsimile and SMS(also several fishermen organizations); alerted concerned response agencies (NFNL, PCG, PAF, DSWD, PNP, DPWH and DILG)**

### **C. REGION II**

- **RDRRMC/OCDRC II** continues to monitor the regional situation; disseminated NDRRMC advisories to RDRRMC member agencies, LDRRMCs, Media and other stakeholders thru facsimile and SMS; coordinated with PDRRMC Batanes, Cagayan, Isabela, Nueva Vizcaya and Quirino regarding their situation
- Member Agencies on alert status: DSWD-FO2 ( disseminated wweather advisories/ alerted Field Offices and SWAD DMRT; prepositioned 2,283 family food packs, 2,579 packs of relief clothing and PhP 814,946.00 standby fund readily available for augmentation); PRO2 disseminated weather advisories to Police Provincial Offices particularly in Batanes, Cagayan, Isabela, Nueva Vizcaya and Quirino

### **D. REGION III**

- RDRRMC/ OCDRC III activated its Emergency Operations Center (EOC) and was upgraded from “WHITE” to “BLUE” alert status effective 5:00 PM, 1 June 2012; disseminated NDRRMC advisories to all PDRRMCs through SMS, facsimilie and uploaded the same to facebook for further dissemination
- PDRRMC Aurora is closely monitoring the situation in its AOR; propositioned food packs and readied all evacuation centers for possible evacuation; Aurora Rescue on full alert and ready to conduct evacuation and other DRR operations if needed
- **PDRRMC Nueva Ecija activated its Emergency Operations Center on 2 June 2012, 11:00 AM**

### **E. REGION V**

- RDRRMC/ OCDRC V on heightened alert; conducted an emergency meeting on 1 June 2012. Coordinated with L/PDRRMCs, PNP and AFP (Army,



Airforce and Navy) to standby assets for monitoring and possible DRR Operations.

- Member Agencies on heightened/alert status: PAGASA (issuance and dissemination of advisories); DSWD (prepositioning of relief items); PNP (prepositioning of assets and possible rescue operations); AFP (91DBDE – Albay and Catanduanes, 902BDE – Camarines Norte/ Sur, 903BDE – Masbate and Sorsogon, NAVFORSOL, TOG5-PAF are on standby alert); CGDBCL (Coast Guard) on alert for possible deployment)
- PDRRMC Albay, Camarines Norte, Camarines Sur, Catanduanes, Masbate and Sorsogon on standby alert for possible SAR operations for the missing fishermen

#### **F. REGION VIII**

- RDRRMC/ OCDRC VIII coordinated with PCG Catbalogan regarding status of ferry operations at Allen, Northern Samar. Directed on standby for possible deployment the following response teams: PCG-DRT (Tacloban City); Catarman Rescue (Northern Samar); Catbalogan Rescue; Southern Leyte Provincial DRT; Guiuan Rescue; TOG8 DRT (Tacloban City); BFP-EMT (Tacloban City); Eastern Visayas Regional Medical Center-Emergency Medical Reponders (Tacloban City); 8<sup>th</sup> ID, PA (Tacloban City).

#### **G. CAR**

- OCD-CAR is on RED alert status; continues to disseminate weather advisories to all LDRRMCs; coordinated with NPC for dam status and DPWH for road conditions; coordinated LDRRMOs for weather situation in their respective AORs
