

I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

Tropical Depression "AMBO" has maintained its strength as it continues to move northwestward.



Location of Center: (as of 4:00 a.m.)	260 km Northeast of Borongan, Eastern Samar
Coordinates:	13.4°N, 127.3°E
Strength:	Maximum winds of 55 kph near the center
Movement:	Northwest at 17 kph.
Forecast Positions/Outlook:	<p>Saturday morning: 330 km North Northeast of Virac, Catanduanes or 320 km East of Casiguran, Aurora</p> <p>Sunday morning: 390 km East Northeast of Aparri, Cagayan</p> <p>Monday morning: 530 km Northeast of Basco, Batanes</p>

PUBLIC STORM WARNING SIGNAL	
Signal No. 1 (45-60kph winds)	Catanduanes

- **Warning Signal over Samar Provinces is now lowered.**
- Residents in low lying and mountainous areas under Public Storm Warning Signal # 1 are alerted against possible flashfloods and landslides.
- Estimated rainfall amount is from 10 - 15 mm per hour (heavy) within the 200 km diameter of the Tropical Depression.
- Fishing boats and other small seacrafts are advised not to venture out into the Eastern seaboard of Luzon, Visayas and Northeastern Mindanao.

You are hereby directed to monitor the situation and undertake precautionary measures in your area of responsibility (AOR). Likewise, the public and the Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (DRRMCs) are advised to take appropriate actions.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let us untiringly aim for zero casualties.
