PRESENT WEATHER SITUATION

24-HOUR PUBLIC WEATHER FORECAST issued 5:00 AM, 27 June 2012


SYNOPSIS: AT 4:00 AM TODAY, THE CENTER OF TROPICAL STORM "DINDO" WAS ESTIMATED BASED ON SATELLITE AND SURFACE DATA AT 480 KM EAST NORTHEAST OF VIRAC, CATANDUANES (15.1°N, 129.0°E) WITH MAXIMUM SUSTAINED WINDS OF 65 KPH NEAR THE CENTER AND GUSTINESS OF UP TO 80KPH. IT IS FORECAST TO MOVE WEST NORTHWEST AT 19 KPH.SOUTHWEST MONSOON AFFECTING VISAYAS AND MINDANAO.

FORECAST: SOUTHERN LUZON, VISAYAS AND MINDANAO WILL EXPERIENCE OCCASIONAL RAINS BECOMING FREQUENT OVER THE WESTERN SECTIONS WHICH MAY TRIGGER FLASHFLOODS AND LANDSLIDES. THE REST OF THE COUNTRY WILL HAVE MOSTLY CLOUDY SKIES WITH SCATTERED RAINSHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS. MODERATE TO STRONG WINDS BLOWING FROM THE SOUTHWEST TO SOUTH WILL PREVAIL OVER NORTHERN AND CENTRAL LUZON, SOUTHWEST TO WEST OVER SOUTHERN LUZON AND COMING FROM THE SOUTHWEST OVER THE REST OF THE COUNTRY. THE COASTAL WATERS THROUGHOUT THE ARCHIPELAGO WILL BE MODERATE TO ROUGH.

Within the next 36 hours)				

- Estimated rainfall amount is from 15-25 mm per hour (heavy) within the 400 km diameter of the Tropical Storm.
- Tropical Storm "DINDO" is expected to enhance the Southwest Monsoon that will bring rains over Southern Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao especially the western section.
- Fishing boats and other small seacrafts are advised not to venture out into the Eastern Seaboards of Central and Southern Luzon and Visayas due to the combined effect of Tropical Storm "DINDO" and Southwest Monsoon.
- Residents living in low lying and mountainous areas under public storm warning signal # 1 are alerted against possible flashfloods and landslides.

II. ACTIONS AND PREPAREDNESS MEASURES UNDERTAKEN

- NDRRMC Operations Center remains under RED ALERT STATUS to continuously monitor and disseminate 24 hour Public Weather Forecasts and Weather Advisories to all concerned OCD Regions through SMS, facsimile and website for further dissemination to their respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels.
