

WEATHER SITUATION:

<u>SYNOPSIS</u>: At 4:00 am today, the eye of Typhoon "NINA" was located at 760 km northeast of Itbayat, Batanes (22.3°N, 130.2°E) with maximum sustained winds of 120 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 150 kph. It is forecast to move west northwest at 5 kph.

<u>FORECAST</u>: The regions of CARAGA and Northern Mindanao will have light to moderate rains or thunderstorms. Metro Manila and the rest of the country will be partly cloudy with brief rainshowers or thunderstorms.



Moderate to strong winds

blowing from the north to northwest will prevail over Luzon and its coastal waters will be moderate to rough. Elsewhere, winds will be light to moderate coming from the northwest to west with slight to moderate seas.

GALE WARNING

- GALE WARNING No. 13 for STRONG TO GALE FORCE WINDS ENHANCED BY THE TYPHOON "NINA"
 - Strong to gale force wind is expected to affect Northern seaboard of Northern Luzon and the eastern seaboard of Northern and Central Luzon.
 - Regions affected are as follows: I, II, and III.

SEVERE WEATHER BULLETIN

- Severe Weather Bulletin No. 15 re Typhoon "NINA" (PRAPIROON)
 - Typhoon "NINA" has maintained its strength as it remains over the Philippine Sea.
 - Location of center (as of 10:00 AM 15 October 2012): 880 km Northeast of Itbayat, Batanes (22.6°N, 131.3°E)
