1. MISSING FISHERMEN FROM AGNO, PANGASINAN

SITUATION OVERVIEW

 On or about 6:00 AM, 11 October 2012, two (2) fishermen brothers went on fishing on board Mbca "FRANK" at the vicinity 15 NM West of Agno, Pangasinan, but failed to return home.

ACTIONS TAKEN:

- Coast Guard District Northwestern Luzon (CGDNWLZN) conducted SAR Operations and directed all stations to be on the look-out for the missing fishermen and render necessary assistance or report immediately to the nearest Coast Guard Station.
- CG-TOG with relatives of the missing fishermen conducted SAR
 Operations on 14 October 2012 at vicinity 5 NM West of Agno, Pangasinan but
 yielded negative result. SAR Operations were terminated on the same day due
 to big waves and strong winds.
- CGDNWLZN SAS Operations will resume when sea condition improves.
- OCD I continues to monitor the situation.

2. LANDSLIDE INCIDENT IN SAN LUIS, AGUSAN DEL SUR

SITUATION OVERVIEW

- A landslide incident occurred at the riverside of P-1 Doña Flavia, San Luis, Agusan del Sur last 13 October 2012.
- The landslide incident damaged eight (8) houses and affected eleven (11) families / fifty (50) persons.

ACTIONS TAKEN:

- · Affected families were temporarily sheltered at Brgy. Doña Flavia Gym.
- CARAGA DRRMC Operations Center continues to monitor the incident.

3. PROGRESS REPORT RE DISPLACEMENT DUE TO MULTIPLE LANDSLIDES IN SOUTH COTABATO

SITUATION OVERVIEW

- On 28 September 2012, multiple landslide incidents occurred in South Cotabato displacing 109 families from Sitio Bentung, Lemuti, and Tokobokong al of Brgy Lamlahak, Lake Sebu.
- The incident was caused by almost a week of continuous normal rains in several ridges of the barren mountain slopes moved down in mass resulting to landslides.
- Residents evacuated into a safer place within the locality.
- Five (5) houses were totally damaged. A total of 155 families with 620 dependents have already evacuated to Lamlahak Barangay Hall. An estimated 20 hectares was affected, and an estimated Php 800,000.00 worth of crops and properties were damaged. Only two (2) Sitios, namely Sitio Tokobukong and Bentung have evacuated.

ACTIONS TAKEN:

- OCD XII and PDRRMC South Cotabato, MDRRMC of Lake Sebu and BDRRMC Lamlahak conducted DANA.
- Local DRRMC extended relief assistance to the affected families.
- OCD XII and PDRRMC with DENR-MGB conducted meeting and conducted technical assessment on 15 October, 2012.
- A total of P55,560.00 relief assistance was extended to the affected families. Lake Sebu MDRRMC gave 10 sacks of rice (P16,850.00), while South Cotabato PDRRMC gave 15 sacks of rice (P25,275.00), 5 boxes of sardines (P8,750.00), 9 boxes of noodles (P3,915.00), and 1 box of powdered milk (P770.00).
