I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

08 January 2013

- **5:00 PM** : OCD Deputy Administrator, OCD Operations Division and Information and Communication Technology Unit (ICTU) personnel arrived at the Advance Command Post (ACP) located at the Naval Reserve Command (NAVRESCOM).
- **5:30 PM** : NDRRMC Emergency telecommunications equipment were set up at the NDRRMC-ACP
- **6:00 PM** : CDDA presided a briefing about the Black Nazarene Translacion 2013 (BNT2013) and discussed the tasks and assignments of each unit of the ACP NDRRMC.
- **8:00 PM** : Usec. Benito Ramos arrived at the NAVRESCOM to check the ACP NDRRMC and conferred with CDDA and NAVRESCOM Base Commander
- **9:30 PM** : NAVRESCOM provided a PLDT landline.
- **10:00 PM** : ACP NDRRMC established communication lines with ACP Quiapo, OCD-NCR, and NDRRMC OpCen via radio, cellular phone, and landline.
- **11:30 PM** : OCD-NCR reported a **crowd estimate** of **120,000** devotees around Quiapo area.
: One (1) unit of satellite phone was brought to ACP MDRRMC

09 January 2013

- **12:35 AM** : OCD-NCR reported **two (2) missing children** who were last seen at the Quirino Grandstand. The children are: Carlo James Tordensilla, 11 y/o, and Sherlyn Joy Tordensilla, 12 y/o.
- **12:40 AM** : Civil Defense Action Group (CDAG) found a lost child (Crystal Anne Ragundin, 6 y/o, from Area A 1123 Tondo, Manila) at the Quirino Grandstand.
- **4:00 AM** : CDAG reported that a strict inspection of all vehicles in Quirino Grandstand was enforced
- **5:00 AM** : OCD-NCR reported a **crowd estimate** of **500,000** at the Quirino Grandstand
- **6:00 AM** : CDAG reported to ACP NDRRMC that Quezon Boulevard is no longer passable to any types of vehicle.
: Mass started at the Quirino Grandstand with an estimated crowd of 300,000.
- **6:24 AM** : ACP NDRRMC received a report that MPD Police Station 5 that the **devotees** in Quirino Grandstand reached **600,000**.

- **7:18 AM** : the BNT2013 procession started.
- **7:20 AM** : the crowd in Quirino Grandstand was able to penetrate the steel barriers.
- **7:30 AM** : Dir. Susana Cruz called Gen. Juanito Dalmas to have the National Service Reserve Corp (NSRC) serve as crowd control in front of the Quirino Grandstand as requested by Dir. Olivia Luces.
: CDAG reported that T.M. Kalaw, Taft Avenue and P. Burgos are closed to traffic
- **8:45 AM** : Black Nazarene Andas was in-front of the Manila Hotel
- **9:00 AM** : CDAG reported **crowd estimates** in the following area:
 - Luneta - **500,000 devotees**
 - Quiapo Church vicinity - **25,000 devotees**
 : The total number of **injured persons** is **164**.
: Black Nazarene Andas was at the corner of Katigbak and Roxas Boulevard.
- **10:50 AM** : Medics were needed at the vicinity of the National Museum to treat the injured devotees.
- **11:10 AM** : Black Nazarene Andas was in between the National Museum and Manila City Hall.
- **11:25 AM** : Black Nazarene Andas approached Taft Ave near the Manila City Hall
: As reported by LRTA, there are no free rides in LRT
- **11:35 AM** : Black Nazarene Andas was at Taft Avenue adjacent to Manila City Hall
: 1200 NSRC Volunteers and around 300 Reservists are mobilized by Gen. Juanito Dalmas, OCD, to augment the security and crowd control requirements at the following areas: PUP, along the procession route, and at Plaza Miranda. They also provided medical assistance at Quirino Grandstand.
- **11:59 AM** : Metropolitan Manila Development Authority (MMDA) Chairman Francis Tolentino is at the foot of McArthur Bridge monitoring the situation. 400 PNP personnel is deployed to cordon the area. 200 MMDA personnel are also at McArthur Bridge. Phil Coast Guard and Bureau of Fire Protection personnel are at the Pasig River.
: Black Nazarene Andas was in front of Manila City Hall
: MMDA sweepers already cleaned the Quirino Grandstand and Roxas Blvd areas and are following the procession to ensure the immediate clean-up of the procession route.
- **12:20 PM** : Black Nazarene Andas was in front of Bonifacio Shrine
- **12:43 PM** : approximately **500,000 devotees** are following the Black Nazarene Andas.
- **1:03 PM** : Black Nazarene Andas approached the Mc Arthur Bridge.
- **1:07 PM** : Black Nazarene Andas was in R. Basa St. (near Lawton)
- **1:30 PM** : **Black Nazarene Andas was at the South end of Mc Arthur Bridge.**
- **2:00 PM** : **According to the report of MPD Station 5, 260 persons were injured and an estimated 500,000 devotees joined the procession**
- **2:15 PM** : **Black Nazarene Andas was at FEATI University**
- **2:30 PM** : **Black Nazarene Andas was at Palanca St.**
- **3:20 PM** : **Black Nazarene Andas was at Palanca St. corner Gomez St.**
: **Mc Arthur bridge was already passable to all types of vehicles**
- **3:35 PM** : **Black Nazarene Andas was at Villalobos St.**
- **4:05 PM** : **Black Nazarene Andas was at the Quinta Market**
- **4:12 PM** : **Black Nazarene Andas was at Quezon Boulevard**
- **4:47 PM** : **Black Nazarene Andas was at Gunao St.**
- **4:58 PM** : **Black Nazarene Andas was near Arlegui St.**

- 7:00 PM : Black Nazarene Andas was located at Castillejos St. corner Fraternal St.
- 7:20 PM : Black Nazarene Andas was at Castillejos St. corner Vergara St.
- 7:50 PM : Black Nazarene Andas was located at Arlegui St. corner Nepomuceno St.
- 8:13 PM : Black Nazarene Andas was at Aguila St. corner Hidalgo St.
- 11:00 PM : Black Nazarene Andas was located at Guzman St.
- 11:45 PM : Black Nazarene Andas was at Hidalgo St.

10 January 2013

- 12:35 AM : Black Nazarene Andas was located at Carlos Palanca corner Villalobos St.
- 12:57 AM : Black Nazarene Andas was at the Plaza Miranda

II. INCIDENTS MONITORED

As reported by OCD-NCR:

- Twenty four (24) devotees were reported injured or fainted, of which:
 - Three (3) fainted devotees were reported. Two of the fainted devotees were inside Quiapo Church were unidentified while the other was identified as Maylyn Arinton, 14 y/o female.
 - Three (3) unidentified devotees were pushed and pinned down by the crowd. The victims, two female and one boy, was brought to Ospital ng Maynila for treatment.
 - One (1) unidentified male was slightly injured due to sharp debris
 - Two (2) unidentified devotees suffered ankle sprain and were treated by the MMDA medical station personnel.
 - Two (2) security guards of the National Museum were stoned by some devotees.
 - Renzy Matias, a 16 y/o female, suffered a neck injury and was brought to MMDA Medical station for treatment.
 - Rosendo Martin, a 21 y/o male, was considered of having rib fracture.
 - Lauren Reyes, a 20 y/o male, suffered a contusion and a left pelvic hematoma.
 - Raffle Christian, 11 y/o, suffered a lacerated right eye
 - Laurento Catabay, 17 y/o, was considered of having a right hand and wrist fracture.
 - Sonny Vicente, a 58 y/o male, suffered anemia
 - John Carlo, a 20 y/o male, suffered skeletal strain on the torso and multiple abrasions.
 - June Menssa, 35 y/o male suffered a blunt chest trauma and nose contusion
 - Corazon Ejercito, a 66 y.o female, suffered a chronic and stable angina pectoris
 - Four (4) devotees were rushed to Jose Reyes Memorial Medical Center namely:
 - ♦ Arnold Honrades - 40 y/o male, treated for asthma
 - ♦ Nico Almodiel - 21 y/o male, treated for right shoulder dislocation
 - ♦ Rea Encarnacion - 15 y/o female, treated for right shoulder swelling
 - ♦ Mary Rose Gan - 40 y/o female, brought in due to loss of consciousness
- According to the unofficial report of the Philippine Red Cross (PRC) as of 7:00 PM, 860 minor injuries, 36 major injuries and 577 BP consults were monitored.
- According to MMDA Chairman Francisco, as of 5:30 PM, around 9 million devotees attended the feast of Black
- As of 5:30 PM, MMDA monitored 174 cases. Names of the victims are not yet available.

As reported by DOH-HEMS:

- A total of 174 reported cases were monitored by DOH-HEMS from 8:00 AM to 12:00 NN.

- The cases were monitored from thirteen (13) hospitals / medical centers namely: Dr. Jose Fabella Memorial, East Ave Medical, Jose Reyes Memorial, Las Piñas General, National Center for Mental Health, National Children's Hospital, Philippine Orthopedic Center, Quirino Memorial, Rizal Medical Center, San Lazaro Hospital, Tondo Medical, Valenzuela Medical and CHD-NCR.
- Majority of the cases monitored were minor injuries (79), next to which were wound cases (29), dizziness (15), headache (14) and hypertension (11). A small number of cases of abrasion (6), furuncle (5), BP monitoring (4), arthritis (3), foreign body obstruction (2), muscle strain (2), wound dressing (2), pneumonia (1) and swollen tissue (1) were also monitored.
