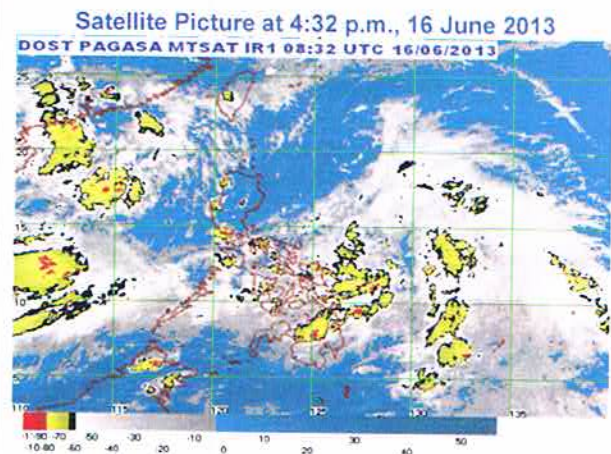
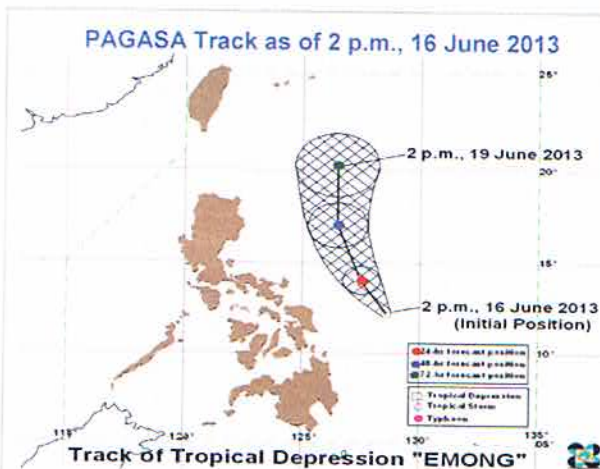

#### **I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:**

**THE LOW PRESSURE AREA (LPA) ESTIMATED EAST OF SURIGAO CITY HAS DEVELOPED INTO A TROPICAL DEPRESSION AND WAS NAMED "EMONG"**



<b>Location of Center: (as of 4:00 PM)</b>	<b>370 km East of Catarman, Northern Samar</b>
<b>Coordinates:</b>	<b>12.4°N, 128.3°E</b>
<b>Strength:</b>	<b>Maximum winds of 45 kph near the center</b>
<b>Movement:</b>	<b>North Northwest at 09 kph</b>
<b>Forecast Positions/Outlook:</b>	<b>Monday afternoon:</b> 320 km Northeast of Catarman, Northern Samar <b>Tuesday afternoon:</b> 500 km Northeast of Catarman, Northern Samar <b>Wednesday afternoon:</b> 490 km Northeast of Tuguegarao, Cagayan

- Estimated rainfall amount is from 5-15 mm per hour (moderate - heavy) within the 300 km diameter of the Tropical Depression.
- Tropical Depression "EMONG" is still far to directly affect any part of the country. However, it will bring moderate to occasionally heavy rains and thunderstorms over Southern Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao.
- "EMONG" is likely to intensify within the next 24 to 48 hours.

## II. ACTION/S TAKEN

- NDRRMC Operations Center disseminated Weather Bulletin No. 01 on Tropical Depression "EMONG" to all OCD Regional Centers through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local disaster risk reduction and management councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels.
  - Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their area of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying and mountainous areas if situation warrants.
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
