



I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

TROPICAL DEPRESSION "EMONG" HAS MAINTAINED ITS STRENGTH WHILE IT MOVES IN A NORTH NORTHWEST DIRECTION.





Location of Center: (as of 10:00 PM)	340 km East of Daet, Camarines Norte	
Coordinates:	14.7°N, 126.4°E	
Strength:	Maximum winds of 55 kph near the center	
Movement:	North Northwest at 9 kph	
Forecast Positions/Outlook:	Tuesday evening: 320 km East of Casiguran, Aurora Wednesday evening: 250 km Southeast of Basco, Batanes Thursday evening: 360 km Northeast of Basco, Batanes	

 Estimated rainfall within the 300 km diameter of the Tropical Depression is from 5-15 mm per hour (moderate - heavy).

- Tropical Depression "EMONG" is still far to directly affect any part of the country.
 However, it will enhance the Southwest Monsoon which will bring moderate to
 occasionally heavy rains and thunderstorms over Southern Luzon, Visayas and
 Mindanao.
- TD "EMONG" is likely to intensify within the next 24 to 48 hours.

II. ACTION/S TAKEN

- NDRRMC Operations Center disseminated Weather Bulletin No. 04 on Tropical Depression "EMONG" to all OCD Regional Centers through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local disaster risk reduction and management councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels.
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their area of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying and mountainous areas if situation warrants.
