

### I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

The Low Pressure Area (LPA) West of Ambulong, Batangas has developed into a Tropical Depression was named "JOLINA".





ocation of Center: (as of 4:00 pm)	240 km West Southwest of Subic, Zambales
Coordinates:	14.1°N, 117.8°E
Strength:	Maximum winds of 55 kph near the center
Movement:	West Northwest at 11kph
Forecast Positions/Outlook:	Wednesday afternoon: 470 km West of Subic, Zambales
	Thursday afternoon: 700 km West of Dagupan City or outside PAR

NO PUBLIC STORM WARNING SIGNAL RAISED

- Estimated rainfall amount is from 5-15 mm per hour (moderate-heavy) within the 300 km diameter of the Tropical Depression
- TD "JOLINA" will enhance the Southwest Monsoon will bring moderate to occasionally heavy rains and thunderstorms over MIMAROPA and Western Visayas.
- The public and the disaster coordinating councils concerned are advised to take appropriate actions and watch for the next bulletin to be issued at 11PM today

#### II. ACTION/S TAKEN

- NDRRMC Operations Center disseminated Weather Bulletin No. 1 on Tropical Depression "JOLINA" to all OCD Regional Centers through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local disaster risk reduction and management councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their area of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying and mountainous areas if situation warrants
