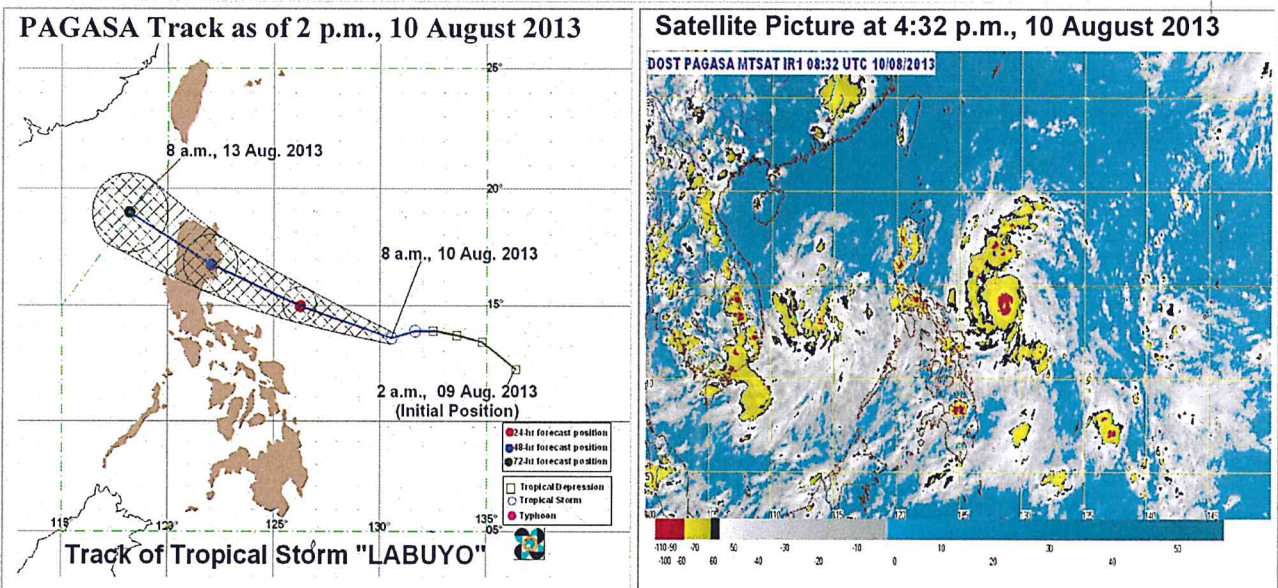

I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

Tropical Storm "LABUYO" has intensified further as it continues to threaten Northern and Central Luzon



Location of Center: (as of 4:00 pm)	450 km East of Virac, Catanduanes
Coordinates:	(14.0°N, 128.8°E)
Strength:	Maximum winds of 105 kph near the center and gustiness of 135 kph
Movement:	West Northwest at 19 kph
Forecast Positions/Outlook:	Sunday afternoon: 170 km Northeast of Virac, Catanduanes Monday afternoon: in the vicinity of Sabangan, Mountain Province Tuesday afternoon: 390 km Northwest of Sinait, Ilocos Norte or outside the PAR.

- **Estimated rainfall amount is from 5 - 16 mm per hour (moderate - intense) within the 600 km diameter of the Tropical Storm.**
- **Tropical Storm "Labuyo" will enhance the Southwest Monsoon which will bring light to moderate rains over Southern Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao.**
- **The public and the local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils concerned are advised to take appropriate actions.**

You are hereby directed to monitor the situation and undertake precautionary measures in your area of responsibility (AOR). Likewise, the public and the Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (DRRMCs) are advised to take appropriate actions.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let us untiringly aim for zero casualties.
