



#### I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

The Low Pressure Area (LPA) outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility has developed into a Tropical Depression and was named "LABUYO".





PAGASA Track as of 2 a.m., 09 August 2013

Location of Center: (as of 4:00 am)	1150 km East of Catarman, Northern Samar
Coordinates:	(12.2°N, 136.2°E)
Strength:	Maximum winds of 45 kph near the center
Movement:	West Northwest at 9 kph
Forecast Positions/Outlook:	Saturday morning: 950 km East of Catarman, Northern Samar Sunday morning: 790 km East of Legaspi City Monday morning: 610 km East of Daet, Camarines Sur

#### NO PUBLIC STORM WARNING SIGNAL RAISED

- Estimated rainfall amount is from 5 15 mm per hour (moderate heavy) within the 300 km diameter of the Tropical Depression.
- Tropical Depression "LABUYO" is too far to directly affect any part of the country. However, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) is now in the vicinity of Cuyo, Palawan (11.4°N, 121.4°E) embedded along the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) will bring rainshowers and thunderstorms over Southern Luzon, Visayas and Northern Mindanao.
- The public and the disaster coordinating councils concerned are advised to take appropriate actions.

### II. ACTION/S TAKEN

- NDRRMC Operations Center disseminated Weather Bulletin No. 1 on Tropical Depression "LABUYO" to all OCD Regional Centers through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local disaster risk reduction and management councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying and mountainous areas if situation warrants
