1. Progress Report re Flooding Incident in Region XII**Situation Overview:**

- Continuous heavy rainfall was experienced in **four (4) provinces in Region XII** namely: South Cotabato, Sarangani, Sultan Kudarat, and **North Cotabato** from 23 June 2015, 9:00 PM, until morning of 24 June 2015 which resulted to flooding in low-lying areas

Effects:

- A total of **1,225 families / 6,018 persons** were affected in **two (2) cities, nine (9) municipalities, 57 barangays** in the Provinces of South Cotabato, Sarangani, Sultan Kudarat, and **North Cotabato**, of which, **805 families / 3,883 individuals were evacuated**

- Damaged roads were reported by the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) in the Province of Sarangani; however, all roads are passable to all types of vehicles
- Damaged dikes and bridges were reported in Koronadal City and Municipalities of Banga, Norala, and Tupi in the Province of Cotabato

- Rice/corn fields, farm lands, fishponds, and agricultural animals were affected in Banga and Koronadal City in South Cotabato and rice fields in Tacurong City, Sultan Kudarat were likewise affected
- Approximately Php9,562,000.00 cost of damage was reported in the Municipalities of Banga and Tupi in the Province of South Cotabato
- Class suspension was lifted in Koronadal City and in the Municipalities of T'boli and Tupi in the Province of South Cotabato. Resumption of classes was also announced in Lulayan, Sultan Kudarat except for Lacamento Elementary School
- Barangay Rajah Muda of Tacurong City was declared under the state of calamity on 24 June 2015 under Resolution Number 11 series of 2015

Actions Taken:

- MDRRMCs provided relief assistance to affected families and response/rescue groups conducted rescue, evacuation in their Areas of Responsibility (AOR)
- MDRRMOs activated their response group and conducting damage assessment in their respective AOR
- OCD XII is continuously monitoring the situation and coordinating with the MDRRMOs and PDRRMOs

2. Progress Report re Fire Incident in Boracay Island, Malay, Aklan

Situation Overview:

- On or about 2:50 PM, 17 June 2015, a fire broke out in Sitio Manggayad, Barangay Manoc-Manoc, Boracay Island, Malay, Aklan affecting residential houses and business establishments
- The fire was situated approximately 150 feet above the main road and the affected area was too congested with no fire hydrants and no access roads for fire fighters which contributed to the difficulty in suppressing the fire
- The fire was declared out at 7:10 AM, 18 June 2015
- The cause of fire is still being determined

Effects:

- A total of **274 families / 1,197 individuals** were affected
- A certain Malou Namacpacan, 48 y/o, suffered first degree burn on both arms
- The cost of damage was estimated at Php20,000,000.00

Actions Taken:

- The following groups assisted in the fire fighting activities:
 - Dolphin 1 mini fire truck
 - Dolphin 2 Anos fire truck with Boracay Island Special Fire Protection Unit (BISFPU) crew
 - PNP - Boracay Tourist Assistance Center (BTAC)
 - Boracay Fire Rescue Ambulance Volunteer (BFRAV)
 - Shangri-la Fire Brigade
 - Boracay Island Water Company (BIWC) water tankers
 - Philippine Red Cross
 - Composite Fire Fighters of the Province of Aklan
 - Convened MDRRMC Emergency Meeting on 18 June 2015 regarding effects and assistance needed by the victims
 - Succeeding meeting was convened on 19 June 2015 was convened regarding relocation site and needed requirements for the fire victims
 - MDRRMC Malay, through MSWDO, and resort owners provided relief assistance to the fire victims while the Municipal Health Office provided medicines
 - BDRRMC Manoc-Manoc facilitated the transfer of victims to the relocation site in **Sitio Sugod**
 - OCD VI provided technical assistance to LGU Malay during the conduct of Emergency Meeting
 - OCD VI coordinated with BFP, BISFPU, and MDRRMC Malay regarding the incident and continuously monitors the situation for updates
