1. Vehicular Accident in San Narciso, Quezon (Region IV-A)

A. Situation Overview

- At about 4:00 AM, 27 July 2015, a vehicular accident transpired at Sitio Batud, Brgy. Abuyon, San Narciso, Quezon involving a passenger bus with twenty six (26) persons onboard, including the driver and bus conductor
- Initial investigation disclosed that the bus was travelling from Manila to San Narciso, Quezon when its brake malfunctioned and eventually fell into a ravine.

B. Actions Taken:

 As a result, a total of 26 persons were injured. Of this number, two (2) sustained severe injuries, while the remaining 24 persons sustained minor injuries:

C. Actions Taken:

- MDRRMO San Narciso Emergency Response Team responded to the incident
- OCD IV-A coordinated with PDRRMO Quezon and MDRRMO San Narciso regarding the said accident

2. Update Report re Fire Incident in Barangay Tandang Sora, Butuan City (CARAGA Region)

A. Situation Overview:

- At 9:54 PM, 16 July 2015, a fire occurred at P2, Villanueva Extension, Barangay Tandang Sora, Butuan City which originated at the residence of Ms Jiji Aringca and also affected Barangay Limaha, Butuan City
- The incident was declared fire out at 11:54 PM on the same day

B. Effects:

- A total of <u>285 families/ 1,425 persons</u> were affected by the fire. Of this number, <u>175 families/1,050 persons</u> were evacuated and are taking shelter in two (2) evacuation centers: (Source:DSWD DROMIC Report No. 3)
 - a. T. Calo Multi-purpose Building –
 b. Zacor Covered Court –
 55 families/330 persons
 120 families/720 persons
- No casualties were reported.
- A total of 285 houses were totally damaged.
- Cost of damage is estimated at ₱10,000,000.00.

C. Actions Taken:

- A total of ₱1,919,653.00 worth of assistance from DSWD (₱720,974.00), LGU (₱940,000.00), and NGOs (258,679.00).
- BFP Butuan City, Agusan Fil-Chinese Volunteer Fire Brigade Foundation, Inc., Gaisano Volunteer Fire Brigade, Water Tanker of Butuan City Government and other fire trucks from the neighbouring City/Municipality Fire Stations responded in the incident.
- RDRRMC CARAGA continuously monitors the situation and coordinates with the City DRRMC of Butuan, BFP Butuan Station and DSWD for updates.
- City DRRMC of Butuan distributed family packs

3. Civil Disturbance along Commonwealth Avenue, Quezon City during President Aquino's SONA (NCR)

A. Situation Overview:

 Around 2:00 PM, 27 July 2015, a commotion between the protesters and Philippine National Police ensued along Commonwealth Avenue, Quezon City when the former attempted to go near the Batasan Pambansa.

B. Effects:

A total of seven individuals sustained injuries:

C. Actions Taken:

- As a preparation for SONA, OCD-NCR established Incident Command Post along St. Peter Parish, Commonwealth Ave., Quezon City
- MMDA and PRC provided first aid treatment to injured individuals

4. Grenade Explosion in Barangay Pasonanca, Zamboanga City (Region IX)

A. Situation Overview:

 A grenade exploded around 7:15 PM, 27 July 2015 at Andico Drive, Kilometer 4, Barangay Pasonanca, Zamboanga City. Prior to the incident, Zamboanga City Police Office (ZCPO) received a report/complaint that Mr. Ruth Andico Mendoza, 44 y.o/Male, was behaving violently in the said barangay. ZCPO SWAT Team responded to the incident. Mr. Mendoza indiscriminately fired his firearm and lobbed a hand grenade at the responding SWAT members.

B. Effects:

• The incident resulted to the death of Mr. Andico, while three (3) policemen were injured, namely: PO3 Bonifacio, PO3 Sappal and PO3 Borja. The injured policemen were brought to the nearest hospital for treatment.

C. Actions Taken:

- ZCPO SWAT Team, ZCPO Explosive and Ordnance Disposal Team, Task Force Zamboanga, Regional Public Safety Batallion, Philippine Red Cross, and Zamboanga City Medical Center-Health Emergency Management Staff responded to the incident.
- OCD-RC IX continuously monitored the incident.
