I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

Typhoon "HANNA" has maintained its intensity as it moves closer to Batanes area.

Location of Center: (as of 4:00 AM)	955 km East of Basco, Batanes
Coordinates:	20.3°N, 131.1°E
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of 175 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 210 kph
Movement:	Forecast to move West Northwest at 20 kph

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- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 650 km diameter of the typhoon.
- Fisherfolks are advised not to venture out over the Northern and Eastern seaboard of Luzon, the seaboard of Palawan, of Visayas and of Mindanao.
- The public and the disaster risk reduction and management council concerned are advised to take appropriate actions and watch for the next bulletin to be issued at 11 AM today.

II. ACTION/S TAKEN

- **NDRRMC Operations Center disseminated Severe Weather Bulletin No. 03 re Typhoon "HANNA" (SOUDELOR)** to all OCD Regional Centers through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local disaster risk reduction and management councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying and mountainous areas if situation warrants
